Here's my quick score sheet tutorial for the new sheet.

- Fill in the Home and Visitor side how you wish. I'm just used to the Home team always being on the left, so that's how I would fill it out, but this could easily be done the other way, as McFarland is always on the right benches and the visitors are always on the left.
- All seasoned reps in Dane county are used to only providing 3 stickers for game sheets, so I would still only use 3 stickers. The only time this may be an issue is with a Game Misconduct penalty, where the ref gets the top copy to use to write their report. But there would still be stickers on 2 more sheets, one for you and one for the opposing team.
- Team rep should fill in date, start time, and arena. Don't worry about game number, division, curfew (???) or surface (ice, naturally).
- Stickers will have all the coach info, so you don't need to fill in team officials area.
- I would not check any of the top boxes, as I don't know what we would fall into.

- The scorer will fill out the scoring boxes, penalty boxes, goal keeping area, and sign at the end of the game.
  - Under Goalkeeping, there is shots and saves
  - Shots are all the saves, plus any goals that go in
  - The only time that I ever use the min played area is if there is more than 1 goalie that plays in that game.
- Penalties:
  - The ref will tell the scorer just about everything they need to know to fill this out.
  - They should look at the clock to note the period and time (which will go in the off spot).
  - Ref says number and penalty. Some say minor or major. If they do not say it's a major, than you can put it as a major.
  - Min is the amount of time of the penalty. Minor Penalties are SQ=1:30, PW=2, BT=2. Major Penalties are SQ=3, PW=5, BT=5.
  - Start is the time that the penalty starts. It normally is the same time as the off, except for certain situations. One situation is a 2 and 10 penalty. If a skater gets a 2 and 10, that player has to sit out for up to or over 12 minutes of game time. The 2 min penalty is served by another player, but the player that serves the penalty does not get recorded, and it is not a penalty on them. Once the 2 min penalty is done (either by time expiring or by the other team scoring) the 10 minute penalty starts. So that start time is up to 2 minutes after the off time. The player serving the 10 does NOT get out early. They wait the full 10 minutes, and then have to wait for a stoppage of play to get out of the box.
  - On is the time that the player gets back on the ice after serving a penalty.
- Scoring by periods is just a break down of the number of goals in each period.
- I recommend having scrap paper by the score keeper, just in case they need to write down notes, times, questions, etc. I always needed it at the SQ level, as 90 second penalties were hard to figure out time back on, if I was distracted and forgot to look at the clock when the skater got on the ice.
