

### **Redwood Area Community Center Return to Rink Guidelines**

As Minnesotans, returning skating and hockey enthusiasts back to the ice is very important. As we navigate through the COVID-19 pandemic, keeping the players, parents, coaches, and staff safe will be our #1 priority.

Below will be our expectations for both the hockey and open skate season. Adjustments will be made if conditions and requirements deem necessary. Social distancing will be our top priority with mask coverings being a requirement.

#### Arriving at the Rink:

1. Complete a self-assessment (players have your parents do so). If you have a fever at or above 100.4, have a headache or sore throat, shortness of breath, been sick in the last 3 days, or been in close contact or cared for someone that has COVID-19, please do not enter the RACC.
2. Players should arrive at the rink no more than 10 minutes before the start of on-ice activities.
3. When dropping off your player, we ask that only 1 parent/guardian enter the RACC to help with the equipment needs. There may be circumstances in which a parent/guardian must bring in other siblings. This will be allowed, but should be limited as much as possible.
4. Players should arrive to the arena as fully dressed as possible to limit the amount of time needed in a team room.
5. Team rooms will be limited to 10 players per room plus a coach.
6. Players should be bringing their own rehydration liquids in clearly marked or labeled containers. Only bottle fill stations are available at the RACC.

#### RACC Ice Arena:

1. The dryland area will be limited to groups of 3 or less. Reminder that a coach or supervisor needs to be present to use the dryland area.
2. Ice rink will be limited to 2 pods of 25 people (includes coaches) or less at a time.
3. A maximum of two (parents/guardians) and immediate family members (living in same household as player) will be allowed in for games. Spectators should be physically distanced at all times. Mask coverings will be required.
4. When entering & exiting the arena, we are asking that players and spectators use the designated doors.
5. Game volunteers will be asked to socially distance and will be asked to mask up when working in close quarters. Max of 2 people in the announcer booth unless they are all from the same household.

#### Open Skate:

1. Participants will not be allowed to congregate while skating. Participants must keep the flow moving on the ice.
2. Will be limited to 100 attendees at any given time.
