

VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENT | DIBS

Luke Jacobsen

 All families MUST provide a check before your child gets on the ice.

- The check should have included the names of your children participating in RAHA in the memo to ensure proper allocation:
 - \$500 for 1 player
 - \$750 for 2+ players
 - Post-date to April 1, 2024



DIBS | REQUIRED HOURS

- Required volunteer hours (per RAHA family)
 - Hours required per skater
 - 15-hour family maximum



DIBS | HOW TO

- You MUST login using the Sports Engine account used to register your skater for volunteer hours to be appropriately allocated.
- Only the parent who registered for the season can see and claim shifts.
- Hours are tracked by the board and managed on the DIBs website. It is the parent's responsibility to complete their hours.


- New DIBs are released monthly

CONDUCT & RULES



CODE OF CONDUCT | PARENT

Mike Staloch

- Most coaches are unpaid volunteers; treat them the way you expect to be treated
- Opportunity to provide feedback during mid-and-end of season surveys
- D8 cracking down on poor sportsmanship spectators
- Parents agreed to Code of Conduct during registration
- Any parent exhibiting improper conduct at any game or practice will be asked to leave the arena and will not be allowed to attend the following game. Repeat occurrences may result in a multiple game suspension or lose the privilege of attending all future RAHA events.

CODE OF CONDUCT | PLAYER

- During the first week of the season, your coaching staff will review RAHA's Player Code of Conduct
- Players will sign a copy acknowledging they understand the code, behavior expectations and consequences
- Player Code of Conduct can be found on RAHA's website



CODE OF CONDUCT | COACH

- Coaches must also follow a Code of Conduct specific to coaches
- Upon committing to coach, each coach agrees to all expectations in the code
- Coach Code of Conduct can be found on RAHA's website

- The board cannot intervene without knowing

IP OVERVIEW



INITIATION PROGRAM (IP)

Britt Foster

PROGRAM GOALS

- Introduce skaters to hockey and progressively challenge them for the next 4-6 years
- Based on the fundamental of USA Hockey's American Development Model (ADM)
- Not a youth traveling program



IP | TERMITES

1 TEAM | 18 players to date

- All 4-year-old boys and girls (must be 4 by June 1, 2023)
- ADM based model
- ~20 ice sessions over 17 weeks
- Practices on Saturday or Sunday
- Practices mostly held at The Pond
- Team manager will be needed (7.5 hours of DIBs)
- First skate is weekend of October 28/29
- Pictures are in December
- No volunteer hour requirements!



IP | 6U GIRLS

1 TEAM | 23 players to date

- Kindergarten & 1st graders (5 years old by June 1, 2023)
- ADM based model
- ~34 sessions of indoor ice
- Practices on Saturday and Sunday
- Practices held at The Pond, RCC and IGH
- Team managers are needed (7.5 hours DIBs)
- First skate is weekend of October 28/29
- Pictures are in December

IP | MINI-MITES

3-4 TEAMS | 53 players to date

- Kindergarten & 1st graders (5 years old by June 1, 2023)
- ADM based model
- ~34 sessions of indoor ice
- Practices on Saturday and Sunday
- Practices held at The Pond, RCC and IGH
- Team managers are needed (7.5 hours DIBs)
- First skate is weekend of October 28/29
- Pictures are in December



IP | MINI-MITES

Team Formation

- Equal-sized teams (dependent on number of registered skaters)
- Players will be placed on teams based on years of experience and age for the initial weekend
- Skaters will then be assessed by the coaches to finalize teams
- Outliers will be moved by the IP coordinators
- The goal is to create teams where all skaters can be challenged and develop their skills

IP | MITES

8 TEAMS | 90 players to date

- 2nd & 3rd graders
- ADM based model
- ~39 sessions of indoor ice
- Maximum of 15 scrimmages
- Practices on Saturday and Sunday
- Practices held at The Pond, RCC and IGH
- 1 manager per team is needed (7.5 hours DIBs)
- First skate is weekend of October 28/29
- Pictures are in December

IP | 8U GIRLS

2 TEAMS | 24 players to date

- ADM based model
- 39 sessions of indoor ice
- Maximum of 15 scrimmages
- Practices on Saturday and Sunday
- Practices held at The Pond, RCC and IGH
- 1 manager per team is needed (7.5 hours DIBs)
- First skate is weekend of October 28/29
- Pictures are in December

MITE & 8U EVALUATIONS




MITE/8U | EVALUATION PROCESS

Britt Foster

- Saturday 10/28 and Sunday 10/29 @ RCC
- Player attends one session <u>each day</u>
- Players will be evaluated using the MN Hockey HEP (Hockey Education Program) skill drills
- Players will be put through 5 skill drills and timed by coaches
- Players have two attempts at the drills both days; only the best time is recorded for each drill each day
- All 5 of the best times will be added up and the totals will be used to place players on teams

MITE/8U | EVALUATION PROCESS



MITE/8U | TEAM PLACEMENT

- Team breakdown
 - Mites 4 levels (Levels 1-4, two teams at each level)
 - 8U 2 levels (Levels 1 & 2)
- As of tonight, we are planning on eight mite teams and two 8U teams; may change if more kids register
- Each team will have a set of goalie equipment and all players will be allowed to try it at least once

EVALS | MITE/8U

- Purpose: evaluate players to create teams with similar experience and abilities
 - Day 1: Saturday, Oct 28th at RCC
 - 1:30-2:30 8U girls
 - 2:45-3:45 Mites last name A-G
 - 4:00-5:00 Mites last name H-O
 - 5:15-6:15 Mites with last name P-Z
 - Day 2: Sunday, Oct 29th at RCC
 - 8:30-9:30 8U girls
 - 9:45-10:45 Mites last name A-G
 - 11:00-12:00 Mites last name H-O
 - 12:15-1:15 Mites with last name P-Z



KNOCK THE RUST OFF | MITE/8U

- Purpose: get Mite and 8U kids on ice prior to evals and run through eval skills
- Free event hosted by RAHA
- Brooke White led sessions
- 4 sessions available on weekend of Oct 14 and 15 at RCC
- Register online for 1 of the 4 sessions
 - Re-opened so every player has the opportunity



IP OTHER



SEASON START | TEAMS

Britt Foster

- Each team will need one parent volunteer for team manager (earns 7.5 DIBs)
 - We will host an IP Manager meeting November 2nd
- Head coach will schedule a brief parent meeting at the start of season to discuss expectations
- Additional team bills: Mite & 8U teams can ask for \$100-\$150 per player to cover additional expenses
 - This should be discussed at the team's parent meeting; decision to be made by team
 - Training/development opportunities
 - Potential additional ice and/or jamborees
 - Team party/meals/gifts

POTENTIAL IP EVENTS

- Mites: Scrimmage between periods at Boys High School games
- 8U: Scrimmage between periods at Girls High School games
- Mini-Mites/6U: Warm-ups at High School games

If/When these events are finalized, emails will be sent out to notify parents

IP OUTDOOR ICE



- A fun, extra time to be on the ice with your team
- Starts mid-December, runs until the city rinks are no longer maintained
- Coaches determine if weather and rinks are skateable
- Managers email team the day of scheduled outdoor ice to announce if the practice is still on

IP EXTRA | Mini/6U/Mite/8U

- 50 min 4x4 scrimmages at The Pond
- Starts in the beginning of December, runs 10 weeks, Friday nights
- 13 kids per team (4 teams = 52 total players)
- 1 6U/8U girls team, 1 Mini-Mite team, 2 Mite teams
- Referee (older kids in RAHA)
- \$200/skater
- Parent helpers on the bench (let the coaches watch!)
- Team manager needed for each team (7.5 hours of DIBs)





- Interested in coaching?
 - Contact Ben Hanson after the meeting ben@rosemounthockey.org
 - Background check required before 1st day on ice
 - Safe Sport Certification
 - Proof of certification
 - Apply online under the coaches tab



COACHING | REQUIREMENTS

- Every head AND assistant coach complete the RAHA Coach Registration Form on the Coaches Page this is how coaches are added to the RAHA roster and how we collect USA Hockey numbers to import into the portal.
- If you coached any level in 2022-2023, you can check your background screening expiration date on the coaches tab of our website do not email registrar to ask.
- SafeSport is required every year BEFORE getting on the ice. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- Age Level Modules check what you need here https://cepsearch.usahockey.com/
- CEP always expires on Dec 31; register for a class now, they are hard to find in December. ALL 8 & Under coaches are required to be Level 1 certified – expired CEP is okay until you move up to Squirts/10's

COACHING

• Coaches will NOT receive DIBS if their Age Level Module or CEP credentials are incomplete on 12/31.



MANAGERS



MANAGERS

Troy Pilger

- Every IP team needs a parent manager
- Team manager receive 7.5 hours towards DIBs
 - Only 7.5 hours are allocated for managers for each team
 - If there is more than 1 team manager, those individuals split the 7.5 DIBs hours
- Manager requirements:
 - All managers must register for USA Hockey, take the Safe Sport certification course and complete a background screening

MANAGERS

- Manager duties (high level list):
 - Weekly team communications
 - Updating team page on RAHA website
 - Scheduling events: jamborees, scrimmages
 - Managing team budgets (Mite/8u)
 - Additional ice purchases or ice swaps
 - Assist at team picture day
 - Help plan team gatherings
