RUNNERS OUT IN FRONT

LEAD SERIES TWO GAMES TO ONE ASHKENAZI HURLS THREE HIT SHUTOUT IN FIRST; TAWIL SHINES IN NIGHTCAP

On a day which could have ended in a Dynasty victory party, the Front Runners knew what they had to do - and did it. Facing a confident opponent led by Eli Gindi, the Front Runners jumped out of the starting gate early and never looked back. After collecting only five hits the week before, the Runners' bats exploded for twenty two last Sunday. The chief beneficiary of the barrage, Sammy Ashkenazi, blanked Dynasty for twelve straight innings, giving up only three hits in the first seven.

The first game started with each team stranding a runner in scoring position in the beginning frame. All of the games runs were scored in the top of the third. Robert Chabbot started the outburst off by slapping a base hit. Captain Eddie, two for three for the game, followed with a walk. Up steps Nathan Tawil. Dynasty gives up the rightfield line on Tawil, who adjusts by ripping the ball that way. A mix-up on the cutoff in from rightfield allows the ball to roll out of play, scoring Robert and Eddie and putting Nate on third. Raymond Beyda, who singlehandedly has won more than a few for this team, hits a sweet single into centerfield for an RBI

and 3-0 Runner lead. After a long fly ball, the Runner who had tagged up and advanced was subsequently called out on a Dynasty appeal. With two-out and none on, Sammy Cohen reaches on an infield hit despite a good effort by Mitchell Haddad on a slow chopper. Bucky Doueck then bloops one into left. "Diamond" Richie Braha speeds toward the ball and with his patented slide comes up with it. But the umpire rules Richie trapped it against the ground, allowing the final run of the inning and game to score.

Front, meanwhile continues to foil Dynasty batters, no-hitting his nemesis through the first four. With whispers of anticipation travelling through the crowd, Richie Braha breaks it all up with a ground ball base hit. However, after a Matalon single with two outs, Dynasty fails to respond. With Ashkenazi regaining control, Eddie Beda's troop takes the opener 4-0.

The Runners wasted no time in the tail end of the doubleheader, scoring four times in the bottom of the first. Eddie Beda, a hot hitter in the playoffs, leads with a single to center. Nathan Tawil gets the first of his three hits in the game when he hits a single. Raymond Beyda, now batting third in the order, follows with another single. Marvin Saka then grounds to short. Mitchell Haddad, with another beautiful play, gets the force at third as the run scores. Mitch has made the extraordinary the routine at shortstop. Front follows with a Texas leaguer to reload the bases. Sammy Cohen sends another two in with a base hit to right, leaving runners on the corners. Eddie Dweck gets in another run with a ground ball to make it 4-0. Alan Bailey figuring correctly that four may not be enough against this Dynasty team, slams a liner to third, a sure double if not for an acrobatic Joel Nasar who leaps to catch the ball and end the inning.

In the top of the second, Mitchell Haddad starts it with a single to center and challenges Nathan Tawil's arm with his great speed, trying to stretch it into a double. Nathan wins that challenge as he uncorks a great throw to nip Mitchell.

As we move to the bottom of the third, the Front Runners pick up what proves to be the winning run. Marvin Saka hits a single to left. Storefront, who himself got three hits on the day, singles up the middle. However, Front gets caught in a rundown off of first and the play ends with him going to second and Marvin to the bench as Dynasty finds Marvin trying to go to third. Wasting no time, the Runners send in AJ Gindi to pinch run for Front at second. Sammy Cohen gets another base hit and AJ turns it home. Gary Erani justifiably one of the premier centerfielders in the league this year, guns him down. But Bucky Doueck gets the gamer, singling to left pushing Sammy Cohen home as the throw in from left goes wild. Wild throws continue to pose a problem for both teams in this series.

In the fourth and fifth Dynasty leaves a man on and it looks as if Front may never give up another run. But with Jackie Matalon bearing down, Dynasty is still within striking distance. In the sixth, Dynasty breaks through. Ricky Franco and Richie Braha single consecutively. Jeffrey Gindi, getting another big hit, puts Dynasty on the board, drives in two with help from an errant throw. Gindi ends up at third and scores on a Gary Erani sacrifice fly. Mitchell starts it again with a single. Eli Gindi follows with a single, a hit which may snap him out of an un-Eli-like slump in post-season. Jackie Matalon gets in the fourth run on a fielder's choice. But the inning ends when Joel Nasar's wicked liner to second is caught by Robert Chabbot. Front then shuts the door on Dynasty in the last inning.

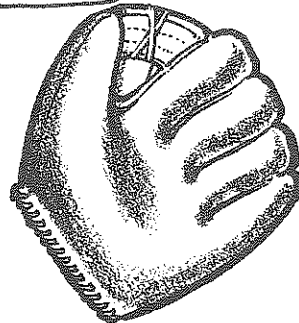
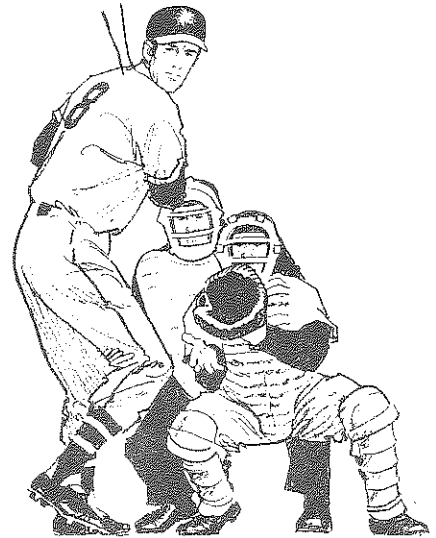
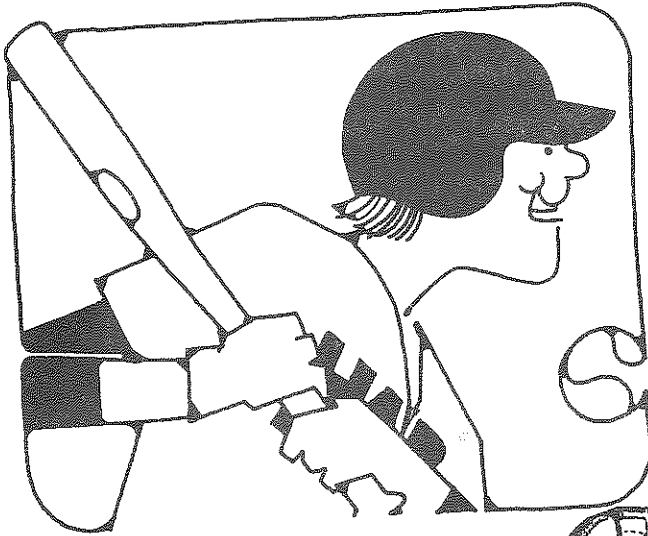
Eli Gindi - "We may have been flat last week, but I will return to lead my team to a sweep and a championship this Sunday. There can be no doubts."
