A big fourth-quarter effort by Mentor keyed by a forced a fumble and sophomore QB Scotty Fox leading two scoring drives to put the Cardinals over visiting Solon, 33-27, on Homecoming at the JTO.

Fox connected on a pass to Jordan Stapleton for a 23-yard score before a missed two-point conversion left the score at 21-19 heading to the break.

On the Cardinals final drive of the game, a big catch by Mitchell Waite set up Fox to Stapleton again for the game-winning TD.

#### GAME PREVIEW

Mentor travels to Solon for a GCC matchup on Sept. 22 a week after another heartbreaking last-second loss in overtime to Cleveland Heights.

The Comets enter the game at 1-4 with the lone win coming last week against Mayfield. Solon has a trio of third-year starters in Harley Barmen (243 yards, five touchdowns, 24 receptions; 400 yards passing, three TDs), safety Max Thompson and receiver Brian McQuaide (726 yards, nine TDs, 41 receptions).

Junior tackle Gavin Baisden leads the offensive line after earning a starting job last season as a sophomore, while Shae Springer led the team in tackles last year (75).

Mentor played Week 5 without star QB Scotty Fox who is out with an injury suffered against Medina. Ben Pierce has stepped in and done a nice job replacing Fox and has developed good chemistry with receiver Justen Hodge.

The defense has been very steady all year and held Mr. Football candidate Marquise Davis to 111 yards rushing last week.

#### SOLON COMETS TO COMPETE - FOOTBALL ONLY - IN GCC FOR 2023

Solon High School 's departure from the Greater Cleveland Conference is complete, except for the football team. The Comets are now a member of the Suburban League, starting this academic year (2023-24 school year), but the football team will remain in the GCC until 2024.



In February, the two conferences reached an agreement allowing Solon join the SL earlier than contracted. The GCC released the Comets from the required notice of league movement clause in all sports except in football. Solon will be part of the 8-team GCC for football only this season and will join the Suburban League - National Conference begining in 2024.

The 2023 season has been a roller coaster of emotions to say the least for Mentor and the ride took another late-game heartbreaking dip in the track for the Cardinals.

Playing without injured starting quarterback Scotty Fox and presented with the unenviable task of finding a way to slow down the Cleveland Heights rushing attack featuring Mr. Ohio candidate Marquise Davis, Mentor took the game to overtime, scored first in the extra session only to fall on a 2-point conversion in OT, 14-13.

The Cardinals are 2-3 on the season with the three losses coming by a combined 6 points and each game decided in the closing seconds.

In overtime, Mentor scored on a pass from Ben Pierce to Justen Hodge that gave them their first lead of the game. Heights responded with a touchdown of its own and went for two and converted for the win.

After John Gordon punched his way into the end zone, Ammaar Lakes swung the ball to Emere Atkins and the junior darted over the goal line for the 2-point conversion and the victory.

Cleveland Heights (4-1) got on the scoreboard late in the first quarter when Lakes took an option and ran it in from 34 vards out.

The Mentor defense was steady all night, holding Davis to 111 yards on 27 carries.

Special teams also played a critical role in the game for the Cardinals as they blocked the Cleveland Heights extra-point attempt and Dylan Tackett hit a pair of field goals, from 44 and 26 yards, the latter of which tied the game at 6 forcing overtime.



# GCC History

In November 2013, seven programs announced they were planning to exit the Northeast Ohio Conference and revive a former, bigschool athletic conference

Mentor, along with Brunswick. Elyria, Medina, Solon, Shaker Heights, and Strongsville officially joined the new Greater Cleveland Conference, with league contests to begin in August, 2015.

Five months later, in April, 2014, Euclid High School was named as the eighth team to participate in the GCC, leaving the Lake Erie League to round-out the new conference and create a balanced schedule in all sports.

'I think athletically, (the GCC) is a who's who of Greater Cleveland athletics,' Mentor Director of Athletics, Jeff Cassella told the News-Herald as the league was forming in 2015.

'When you look at it - football, boys basketball, baseball, track - I don't think there's a weak link in the conference.

The GCC has experienced a small period contraction, as membership slipped to six teams as of the start of the 2021 academic year.

Shaker Heights announced a departure from the Greater Cleveland Conference beginning in the fall of 2020 to join the Lake Erie League, the conference the Red Raiders had been a part of for nearly 90 years.

The following year, Elyria was accepted into a more regional conference, the Southwest Conference in the fall of 2021

The GCC played 2021 and 2022 with six members -Mentor, Brunswick, Euclid, Medina, Solon and Strongsville,

Starting this season, 2023, the GCC has added two members and again brought membership back to eight teams with the addition of two teams from the Lake Erie League - the return of Shaker Heights, which left the GCC two years ago to join the LEL, and Cleveland Height, which moves to a new conference for the first time in nearly 100 years.

The Tigers spent 94 seasons in the Lake Erie League. Starting in 2024 for football (and 2023 for all other sports), the GCC will again dip to just seven members.

In September last year, it was announced that GCC charter member, Solon, had accepted an invitation to join the Suburban League.

But because Solon made the announcement with less than year prior to the switch in conferences, the GCC needed to find a compromise for the Solon departure.

At a December 2022 meeting, the GCC approved Solon's departure for all sports except for football, citing difficulties scheduling with seven teams.

Under the agreement, Solon football will play the 2023 season in the GCC while all other sports will begin play in the Suburban League.

Solon Football will join the Suburban League in 2024 and the GCC will have an odd number of teams for the 2024 campaign.

# **Cardinals Head Coach Matt Gray**

On Jan. 2, 2020 Gray was named the 18th all-time head coach at Mentor

After several successful years as an assistant coach, most recently as offensive coordinator. Matt Gray took over as head coach of the Mentor Cardinals prior to the start of the 2020 season and enjoyed immediate success, advancing to the Division I state semifinals in his first season.

Gray enters his fourth season as head coach for the 2023 season and will add Offensive Coordinator to his duties

Gray replaced legendary coach Steve Trivisonno, who stepped down following the 2019 season. Trivisonno was the head coach from 1997-2019.

Gray is a native of Elyria and played football at Avon (2005 graduate), going on to the University of Dayton. (where heplayed and coached for the Flyers from 2006-2009). Gray graduated from Dayton in 2009.

Gray started coaching in the area in 2010 at Willoughby South High School and has been at Mentor since 2012

The Cardinals have consistently been among the state's top offenses during Gray's tenure as offensive coordinator and he had been groomed for several years as Trivisonno's successor.

Gray is married to his wife, Sarah, and the couple have a new daughter, Payton.

70 years ago this season, a 25-year old military veteran, Lee Tressel become the head coach of the Cardinals. In six season on the sidelines for Mentor, Tressel had a winning percentage of .843, totaling 43 wins between the 1950 and the 1955 seasons.

In 1958, Tressel was named head coach at Baldwin-Wallace College. In 23 seasons with the Yellow Jackets, Tressel won 155 games and a Division III National Championship in 1978.

#### **Dick Crum**

After serving as an assistant for several Ohio high schools for five years, Dick Crum was named head coach at Mentor prior to the 1963 season. It was Crum's first head caoching job and he made the most

In six seasons with the Cardinals, Crum had a overall record of 50-9-1. Later Crum would be the head coach at Miami (Oh), North Carolina, and Kent State. He was 113-77-4 as a college coach.

#### Steve Trivisonno

1981 Mentor alum, Steve Trivisonno, was named the 17th head coach of the Cardinals in 1997. Over the next 23 seasons. Coach Triv won more than 200 games and took the Cardinals to four state championship games and won Region 1 six different times.

#### FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAMES WILL BE IN CANTON IN 2023; FUTURE IS TO BE DETERMINED

The seven Ohio state football championship games will take place at Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium in Canton, including the Division I game on Dec. 1 in the shadows of the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

The three-day showcase of Ohio's best will feature one game on Thursday night and triple-headers on Friday and Saturday.

The OHSAA has acknowledged that the three-year agreement with the Hall of Fame ends at the conclusion of this year's championship weekend. The future location(s) for the championship games and festivities has not been decided



The championship games were played in Massillon and Canton from 1990-2013, moved to Ohio Stadium in Columbus for three years and then returned to Canton's Tom Benson Stadium from 2017-2019. They were scheduled to be played there again in 2020, but the games were moved to Fortress Obitz in Columbus because of the pandemic.

# Cardinals News, Notes, & Headlines

Following the the OHSAA Board of Directors approval, the organization announced in May 2023 the new divisional breakdowns for the football divisional and playoff regional assignments.

The OHSAA uses enrollment data provided by the Ohio Department of Education to determine each school's base enrollment numbers for the 2022-23 and 2023-24 school years. Divisional breakdowns for the sports that utilize competitive balance data, including football, are reconfigured EVERY year. The Completive Balance number adds an additional modifying factor to enrollment counts based on each sport-specific roster, and is dependent upon where the student's parent(s) reside for public school students and/or the educational system history for private school students.

With 9:24 to play in the third quarter, the Tigers struck first with a 3-yard TD run from Brian Gamble. On the ensuing possession, Mentor drove 79 yards on 15 plays, taking off over five minutes of clock time before Bart Tanski hit Brandon James on a 7-yard touchdown strike with 3:54 left. The PAT was no good, and the Tigers still lead 7-6.

Bill Deitman would give Mentor the lead for good, bull-rushing his way in from two yards out with 1:40 left in the quarter. The PAT pass was no good, keeping the Cardinal lead at 12-7.

The final nail would be driven into the Tiger coffin with 1:58 remaining in the game as Tanski capped a short four-play, 19yard scoring drive with a 3-yard run. Kevin Harper's PAT provided the final margin.

#### TRUBISKY STAYS IN STEEL CITY

It's always wise to have a reliable backup quarterback on the roster. The Pittsburgh Steelers ensured it has one for at least the next three seasons.



The Steelers agreed to a two-year extension with Mentor alum, Mitchell Trubisky, in May. The deal places Trubisky under team control through the 2025 season while lowering his 2023 cap number.

Trubisky could earn nearly \$33 million by the end of the deal, meeting all incentives in the contract.

Trubisky joined the Steelers in March 2022 after a stint backing up Josh Allen in Buffalo.

He started five games for the Steelers last season, passed for 1,252 yards with four touchdowns and five interceptions while appearing in seven games for Pittsburgh last season.

Trubisky, the second overall pick by the Bears in the 2017 draft, has thrown for almost 12,000 yards and 68 touchdowns in his career

#### **DIVISION I, REGION 1 TEAMS FOR 2022**

On May 3, the Ohio High School Athletic Association announced the Division and Regional breakdowns for the 2023 football season.

Overall, Division I has been assigned 70 teams for the 2023 season, divided into 4 regions. Regions 1, 2, and 3 each have been assigned 17 teams, while Region 4 has been assigned 19 teams.

The top 16 teams in each region (64 of the 70 teams assigned to Division I) qualify for the post-season.

Division I represents the top 10% of schools playing football in the state of Ohio, as determined by school enrollment figures and the competitive balance factor.

#### OVERTIME HAS BEEN A BAD TIME

The Cardinals lost to Cleveland Hts in overtime on Sept. 15. It was the 10th time Mentor had played 'extra' football since 1993.

The Cardinals are 0-5 in the regular season and 3-2 in the playoffs, when playing an extra session.

#### **KEY RULE CHANGES FOR 2023**

A change in how a holding penalty is enforced is the biggest notable change in high school football rules in 2023 by the National Federation of State High School Associations and adopted by the Ohio High School Athletic Association.

The rule change was made to maintain balance between offense and defense.

The rule revision says that the spot for enforcement of fouls behind the line of scrimmage — such as a holding penalty — will be enforced from the previous spot, rather than the spot of the foul.

Under the new rule language, a team on offense at its own 40-yard line that is called for holding 10 yards behind the line of scrimmage at its own 30-yard line, would face first and 20 from its 30-yard line instead of first and 30 from its own 20-yard line, a task the NFHS called "almost insurmountable."

Exceptions to the new rule, do still exist. Current penalties for illegal kicking, batting and participation fouls, as well as offensive fouls occurring in the end zone that may result in a safety are not covered by the new line of scrimmage standard.

Another rule change to assist with "risk mitigation" was additional criteria to identify a player defined as 'defenseless'.

The additional classification says a defenseless player includes a receiver, as previously defined in the rule, but now included the defender attempting to intercept a pass.

#### TOUCHDOWN STREAK RESTARTED

The Mentor Cardinals had scored at least one touchdown in 174 consecutive games dating back to the first week of the 2009 season (Aug 28, 2009 a 28-15 win against the St Edward Eagles).

The streak ended on November 11, 2022 in the Division I, Region 1 championship game at Euclid Community Stadium, as the Cardinals were held scoreless in a loss to the St. Edward Eagles.

The Cardinals began a new streak on August 18, 2023 and the current streak stands at 5 games.

## 8-Man Football

#### POTENTIAL DIVISION 8 COMING TO OHIO

Eight-man football in Ohio received another shot of momentum in June, when the state football coaches association agreed to host a state championship for the fledging division this year.

The Ohio High School Football Coaches Association (OHSFCA) is putting its weight behind the idea of an 8-man playoff, although right now only the Northern 8 Conference would be involved.

The six-team Northern 8 — which includes St. Mary Central Catholic, Holgate, Stryker, Toledo Christian, and Danbury — is the only organized 8-man conference in the state.

"Our six schools are the only ones playing but there are a number on the cusp," Northern 8 commissioner Joel Miller said. "It could be just us six, we don't know."

Miller attended a breakout session at the OHSFCA conference in February. The topic was 8-man football and OHSAA commissioner Doug Ute and football administrator Beau Rugg were among the interested parties in the room.

OHSFCA president Gerald Cooke from Watkins Memorial (in Pataskala, Ohio) also was involved in the discussion.

"(The OHSAA) would like to see this happen. They want to see more numbers and we fully understand that," Miller said. "It's almost chicken-and-egg at this point.

"They recognize it as a possibility for schools. They're not directly sanctioning it, but this is something that could be happening."

The OHSAA has laid out rules for member schools that want to play 8-man. Schools with an enrollment of 160 boys or fewer can participate. Toledo Christian coach Andrew Skeels "carried the water" on the 8-man concept at the state level, Miller said.

St. Mary Central Catholic coach Toby Hammond supports the plan for an 8-man postseason.

"It's a good thing," Hammond said. "Some of these schools that are thinking about it, maybe they'll pull the trigger and go to 8-man. You have a chance to be competitive and that's what all coaches and players want."

SMCC had 26 football players at its camp day Tuesday, but most were underclassmen.

That predicament is one faced by many small schools, and a big reason to give 8-man a try, SMCC's coach said: "You're always concerned about safety. You have young kids out there playing against seniors and they shouldn't be out there."

The Northern 8 will begin its third year of competition later this (fall). Sebring McKinley, which is located east of Akron, will join the league while Fort Wayne King's no longer is an N8 member.

#### CARDS NEAR TOP IN TITLE GAME APPS

In 1999, the OHSAA expanded the playoffs to 32 teams per division (8 per region), an increase from 16 teams. The expansion continued in 2022, with 16 teams per region making the playoffs.

Through the 2022 season, there have been 24 Division I state title games played under the expanded playoff formats.

The four trips to the title game for the Cardinals are good for a third place tie; behind the St. Edward Eagles, St. Ignatius Wildcats and Cincinnati St. Xavier for most finals appearances in Division I. It is the most of ANY PUBLIC school.

#### HIGH-FLYING CARDS, SCARLET BRICK WALL

A high-powered offense and a stingy defense can certainly be a receipe for success, and the Mentor Cardinals are no exception.

Since the start of the 1993 season, the Cardinals are an eye-popping 111-1 (0.991) when the team scores 40 or more points in a game. (The only loss came in the 2013 state championship game, a 55-52 loss to Cincinnati Archbishop Moeller.

Even when the 20 point mark is reached by Mentor, the Cardinals are 234-38 (0.862) over the last 30 seasons.

On the other side of the ball, the Cardinals defense is just as impressive. When the Cardinals hold an opponent to single digits, Mentor is 104-1 since 1993 (0.990). When holding opponents under 20 points, the Cards are 181-15 (0.923) since 1993
