Remembering Mrs. Jean Last BHS English Teacher

Marta Montano-May '73 wrote: "I read in the Panther Postscripts that Mrs. Jean Last had passed away. She was a great lady and I wish others to know it. Mrs. Jean Last was so much more than an "English Teacher." She was an inspiration. She taught many of us not only the language, but how to live happy lives by integrating into a culture so different from our own. I arrived in the United States from Cuba at the age of 13. I started Burlingame High School as a freshman in 1969 and graduated in 1973. At the time there was an "experimental program" called "English as a Second Language" and by a miracle Mrs. Last was chosen to implement it. Almost every country in the world was represented in our classroom. Many young adults were brought by bus from other schools to participate. There was Kosro Farsay from Iran, Hiroshi Kohara from Japan, the Tien brothers from China, Veronique from France, Horacio Altan from Guatemala, the Carranza sisters also from Cuba, just to mention a few. Mrs. Last was a miracle worker. She taught all of us English in 6 months...but you see it was more than English we received from her; it was a complete education about the culture, taught through love and kindness. People would stop in the hallway on a certain day of the week, to listen to the songs we sang. Mrs. Last took me to my first opera; she took an entire busload of us to see Tosca at the San Francisco Opera House. I kept up with Mrs. Last through the years. She had to know about all my accomplishments as they happened. I wrote a book and she is a big part of it... because she rescued me at a time when I was lost in a wilderness of culture shock and gave me the tools to succeed. She was my mentor, my friend, and the reason for all my successes. Mrs. Last was simply ahead of her time in her ability to delegate love and kindness without prejudice. I will miss her, but I am sure she is in a good place teaching others to sing...."The bear went over the mountain, the bear went over the mountain, the bear went over the mountain...to see what he could see...."

Dr. Roderick "Rod" Malcolm Neale, '28

Roderick Neale was a member of the class of 1928, the first class graduate from BHS. While at BHS. Rod participated in Glee Club. belonged Honor the

Society, was on the Rally Committee, the track team, and was Class President. He was also involved in dramatics and played William Smith in the senior class production of the whimsical comedy, "Quality Street." He was an Eagle Scout and became his troop's "first aid guy." He liked it so much that it made him think about going to medical school. He attended Stanford University where he was a member of Phi Beta Kappa honor society. He also played bassoon in the school's marching band. He went on to study at Stanford's medical school. Roderick taught anatomy for a year and then returned to his medical studies. To help pay for school he worked as an office boy in San Francisco's financial district. Times were hard in the early 1930s but everywhere he worked, he was encouraged to stay in school. He continued his studies and graduated in 1936. Roderick completed his residency at Highland Hospital in Oakland and in 1941 was accepted as a Fellow to the Mayo Clinic in Minnesota. When the U.S. entered WWII, he became a trauma surgeon in the 182nd General Hospital in Sudbury, England. After the war, he returned to Santa Monica, CA. During his years there, he was a surgeon at

Santa Monica VA Hospital, the UCLA Medical Center and St. John's Hospital where he was chief of staff. He retired in 1984 and moved to St. Helena. His curiosity about the world took him to the North and South poles and numerous points between. He is a fan of crossword puzzles and National Public Radio, loves a good mystery, and has undertaken an in-depth study of World War II. He also enjoys excursions to San Francisco. For years he was the bell ringer for the First Presbyterian Church of St. Helena and served on the St. Helena Ecumenical Council. He is still a greeter at the church and continues to maintain a busy social schedule. He dines with neighbors and church friends and attends meetings of the French Club. Last October, Roderick was the guest of honor at several birthday celebrations, including parties hosted by his family, by neighbors, by the church, by the French Club and by a current events group. Honorary plaques were sent from President Obama, Burlingame High School, Stanford University and the Centenarian Society. When asked what he'd like to do on his 100th birthday, he quickly replied, "Dance."


The Club has expanded the scholarships for need-based students to encompass three programs.

- 1. Our traditional scholarship is offered to students attending a 4-year college. The awards range from \$1,000 to \$10,000.
- 2. The second scholarship program is for students planning to attend a community college. The awards range from \$500 to \$1,500.
- 3. The third scholarship program selects 8 10 high-potential Burlingame Intermediate School 8th grade students. Club members mentor these students through high school.

To date the dollar value of these scholarship programs has exceeded \$500,000. The Club also presents a "Teacher of the Year" award and supports the BHS College and Career Center.

Approximately one third of the Club's total funding comes from non-Rotarians who attend our annual *Burlingame Goes Hollywood* fund raiser, our annual golf tournament and/or make a contribution.
