



Tribute to Rocky Hanson

Former HUSKIE is Edmonton's TOP COP! And He's Not in the Canine Unit!

A tribute for your best pal usually comes in the form of a verbal pat on the back: "Nice drive, buddy!" or "Congrats on your kid's graduation" or as a playful ribbing "You used to be able to backpedal without falling over!". This tribute though, for former Huskies defensive back/safety star Rocky Hanson ('84 – '88), carries a bit more weight — it recognizes his dedication to mentorship, volunteerism, and community.



Many of us know him simply as "Rock" — a feisty

Huskie teammate, unwavering friend and committed community builder. He has spent the past twenty years working with young Edmontonians as a football, hockey, soccer, and boxing coach. While president of the Burnwood Community League, Rock has helped raise funds to build two playgrounds and a multipurpose rink. He has also helped to establish two community programs: one that gets kids involved in sport and recreation and another that provides nutritional needs to students. These are just some of the examples why Rock (or rather, Detective Rocky Hanson) was named the Kiwanis Club of Edmonton's TOP COP in 2020.

For most of us who know and love Rock, our response upon hearing of this accolade was "It's about time!" Anyone who has come to know the 13-year veteran of the Edmonton Police Service knows his unwavering dedication and tireless efforts in stepping up for others and NEVER turning his back on tough situations or those in one—both among his friends, at work with victims of crime, and even those who initiate it...

Being named TOP COP and his rise up the ranks within the Edmonton Police Service is a testament to two things I've observed in my 40-year friendship with Rock – courage and caring. At Scona, where he once played and has coached football in two stints over the past decade, players love and respect Coach for his motivation and



the one-on-one belief in each and every individual. He connects with youth more than anyone I know: whether it be a hug for a kid who missed a game-winning pick or not thinking twice about giving away his coach's gift card to a player he knew was hoarding team meals because he had no food at home. Players seek him out for personal guidance because they trust him. They know he has the life experience – both good and bad – to be a listening ear and a voice of support. When one kid got in trouble with the law, it was Rock who was there for him advising him to take accountability, make amends, and learn and grow from the youthful misstep. You

feel that no matter what you did or where you're at in your life, you can talk it out with Rocky and if you want advice, his words will be genuine and real.

His commitment was born from his own journey. He made some bad decisions as a teen, he had attitude, he was the kid you didn't mess with and, even Rock admits, needed a wake-up call before he went down a road he now polices. As a gifted and intense athlete, football became the catalyst in turning his anger into steel-eyed focus on the field and a "team first" attitude that gave him purpose and a sense of belonging – two major gifts this game brings many young athletes. Football and his time with the

Huskies became the springboard to grow athletically, personally, and to make a difference.

After his time with the club, Rocky went on to play free safety in the U.S. with Dickinson State, where he earned All-America honors ('88 - '91) before being drafted by the Toronto Argonauts in 1991. In 2015, he and his brother (Dan – another standout Huskie alumni) were inducted together into the DSU Hall of Fame – an honor they both take great pride in.



After hanging up his pads, he would go on to play for almost three decades in the Edmonton area touch and flag football leagues, winning many championship trophies and earning legendary status for his contributions and successes. His son Brady, a "chip off the old ROCK!" also played safety at Scona and he and his Pops were able to play together in the local touch football league before Rocky gave up the game competitively and focused on his golf exploits.

In addition to the Kiwanis Club recognition, Rock has earned not one, but TWO National Awards of Heroism: one for carrying seniors over his shoulder out of a burning

building and another for talking someone down off a bridge. Interestingly, both these incidents happened BEFORE he was even a member of the Edmonton Police Service.

We say as Huskies alumni that we are not just nurturing fine athletes, but the goal is to also produce fine young men who will give back. Rocky Hanson is a shining example of that mantra and he continues to pay it forward to ensure the next generation of youth also know hope and help are the best gifts you can share with someone in need.




The TOP COP award is given out annually by the Kiwanis Club and has been presented to 45 EPS officers since 1976 to recognize their community involvement. As part of the award, \$1,000 was donated to the Jambo Boxing and Fitness Centre, where Rocky volunteers to help kids get involved in sport.


Speaking before presenting Hanson with his award, EPS Chief Dale McFee said this detective represented the best values of the police service.

"I just want to take a second to reflect what this actually means, as a police chief, to have people like Rocky in your organization. It's not only humbling. It's a great sense of pride, it's a great sense of accomplishment and a great sense of what we're actually trying to accomplish as a police service," said Mcfee. "I think you've set the example and set the bar very high for many others."




Rocky lives in Edmonton with his wife Cathy and has three grown children: Brady and daughters Shelby and Sydney.











































































































































































































































HUSKIES 1964: from the trenches or as I remember it

A STRANGE INTERVIEW

There was a real gang at my interview for a coaching job: Head Coach Joe Hutton, Bob Bateman, Don Hamilton and I think someone from the executive. The biggest concern was to make sure I understood that this team would not repeat; that is, they had lost 15 starters and it was not likely they would win another Canadian Championship.

BEGINNING OF THE SEASON

The first day of practice I was introduced to Dustin (Paul) Brady who was to be the line coach. This was a bit disconcerting because I thought that was my position. Since Dustin was a Huskie grad, he knew all their drills and mode of operation —— so I went with the flow.

The group was a mixed bag of some veterans and a lot of rookies. Although everyone was friendly, I judged that some of the veterans were carrying attitude —— no need to get excited and work too hard. Besides, they had been champions and knew the ropes. It appeared these guys were committed to completing their final year but it would be more of a last hurrah rather than a championship year.

Alice (Ron Forwick) could have been playing for the Eskimos. I was surprised to see him in camp. I had coached him and Big Al (Al Gordichuk) during their last year at Vic high school.

The first few games were not pretty. We had our moments but were struggling. At our second game of the season, we were in Calgary playing the Cougars. Joe was not with us (some injury or illness kept him in Edmonton). Bruce Bryson was handling the bench and Dustin and I were upstairs. The wind was unbelievable and neither team could do very much. Near the end of the game (with no score) Dustin and I decided the best strategy would be a surprise quick kick. The problem was the bench phones were suddenly dead and it was too far down to be able to run down and get the message to Bruce. Because our bench was directly below our observation booth, we decided to lean out of the booth and yell down to Bruce. After our first few attempts which the wind kept from reaching our bench, the Calgary fans below us decided to help. Soon we had the entire west side yelling down to our bench. A chant filled the west side stands, "Bruce, quick kick... Bruce, quick kick". Our surprise vanished but we did win 1-0 — a penalty gave us a chance for Jon Sterling to boot it out of the park.

Dustin Brady soon left us to join the Golden Bears. Now there were only three of us coaching; we must have had the smallest coaching staff in the conference. No one was dreaming of third Canadian Championship.

MID-SEASON

Sometimes we won but many of our games were close —— 8 to 7 or 14 to 9. Sometimes we lost. The good news was we discovered we had a strong back up for quarterback Tony Rankel —— Bob Wanzel played a great game against the Wildcats.

Alice was not having a great season — the damn fullback (Bob Baron) from the Wildcats kept cutting him down and his pass rush was suffering. I put in an old Blue Bomber drill to assist in keeping blockers from getting at your lower half and rolling into your feet. I was surprised how well received it was — even the linebackers were eager. I think they wanted to prove they could handle the blockers.

Trainer Monty Ford got arrested at a game. Some of the Wildcat fans had been heckling him all season. They made a game of it and always got seats right behind our bench. This time he blew and before Joe or I knew what had happened he was up in the stands at someone's throat. It was not an easy climb to get up in the stands. I was surprised he was that agile. Head Coach Joe Hutton flew over the barriers and hauled him back, but it was too late.

HUSKIES 1964: from the trenches or as I remember it

Some of the rookies were starting to come around. They had a lot of enthusiasm and it was rubbing off on the veterans. Although we were not consistent, our practices were better and the bags were getting a good work out. Larry Bird was a horse and no one could move him, even with a double team. Our guards were crisp. Warren Hansen was the veteran but our rookie Don Yohimas was keeping up with him. The Gilbert brothers (Dave and Peter) were a real treat —— tough and eager. Len Luders was getting better with each game. Ralph Rasmuson was an emotional player and strong for such a thin guy. 'Cherry' (George Spanach) was getting his focus where it should be. Ron Shymka was solid and Vic Justik was playing like a wounded badger.

We beat the Wildcats in the opening play-off —— two games in a row and won the Alberta Provincial Championship. Both games were close and at times it was hard to believe we had won.

THE PLAYOFFS: Vancouver

Joe Hutton and I went to Saskatoon to scout the Saskatchewan final. Regina, the underdog, knocked off Saskatoon who had been the top of their league all year. It was an evening game and we stayed overnight with a promise of a ride back with a friend of Bruce's, in time for our next day's play-off game. Unfortunately, we were late getting away and our driver believed in driving the speed limit. Once Bruce and I got a chance to drive we make up some time, but it was very late when we arrived in Edmonton. We got dropped off at Clarke Stadium and Joe was frantic. He had to handle the warmups by himself and wondered what the hell was going on (no cell phones in that era).

The Manager of the Vancouver Blue Bombers stopped us and requested our scouting report. Obviously, he was very confident. This was supposed to be their year, with a seasoned team and an all-star halfback who the BC Lions were interested in. They had accumulated 216 offense points vs 82 against.

We had an extra week of practice waiting for the BC winner to be declared. The lay-off hadn't helped us. We couldn't seem to fire off the line. Every time they got the ball, they marched down the field. We sagged and let them march close to the red zone and then we tightened up —— thank God they didn't have a good field goal kicker. In the second half we found our legs and the boys were really popping off the line. A number of guys had a great second half. We had 11 rookies in the starting line-up — what the hell, we won 13-0.

Back at the clubhouse the coaches discussed the game and debated about our strategy for the next week of practice which would be a short week because we had to go to Regina. None of the coaches liked the first half we played against Vancouver. We couldn't afford another half like that one.

Joe asked, "Should we go to full contact?" We decided to run hard practices, but no full contact.

WESTERN FINAL: Regina

The practices that week were intense. The bags were popping again. I am sure a number of linemen went to sleep hearing, "Hit, hit, roll." Guys were jumping to every whistle and command. Alice and Warren were leading the way. There was no doubt we were now a team with a purpose —— I know it had been building for some time, but how it all happened, I don't know. We looked damn good.

When we hit Regina, their organization invited our team to a big celebration party. We declined, which meant it was up to the coaches, who had to go and drink all the booze —— just kidding about the drinking part.

Tony Rankel was worried about Alice. So, I watched him closely on his first defensive series. He smashed his opponent so hard it appeared the guy had been hit by a truck ——Forwick lifted him of his feet a few inches and drove him back about 3 feet. I knew we were in business.

The Regina Rams had a huge defensive line. Their weakness was that they had been working all year on developing a pass rush to stop the Hilltops. They were not used to defending a running game. We ran traps on them all day long. On the second or third offensive play we ran a tackle trap and Len Luders hit their charging lineman so hard they had to bring out a stretcher.

The final score was 43-8. The reason they got 8 points was because near the end of the game, we were giving everyone a chance to play different positions. At one time we had all three quarterbacks on the field playing defense.

THE DOMINION FINAL: NOTRE-DAME-de-GRACE MAPLE LEAFS

We had a great week of practice. Everyone was ready, crisp and explosive. In Calgary at the breakfast meeting, I got handed a difficult job. Joe and Bruce had the players they wanted and now I had to select who else was to dress. One of the hardest decisions I made all year —— I decided not to dress Colin Cross. He had started many games for us, but his late season injury allowed other players a chance to shine. I selected Ralph Rasmuson instead and then I had to explain my reasons to Colin.

We flew out of the gate —— everything worked. It was early in the game and Joe called for a third down gamble —— he wanted place kicker Jon Sterling to pass. There was some tension on the sidelines, but Jon was the coolest guy on the field and his receiver, Keith Mercer, as always was a rock —— no problem, a first down.

In the second half the Montreal offense got rolling. They did what they had been doing all year — mounting a big comeback with their spread formation. This was how they had been defeating teams throughout the season with massive second half comebacks. Their passer was deadly accurate, and our defense struggled to stop them. Our offense was able to match their point total — we each scored 27 points in the last half.

A 'Hollywood Moment' did occur during the game. We couldn't seem to get enough pressure on the quarterback. About midway through the fourth quarter, I decided to make a change. Ralph was fresh but before I put him in, I gave a short pep talk —— "For Christ's sake we need the ball. See if you can knock something loose." Of course, I never expected Ralph would literally knock the ball out of someone's hands and recover it, but that was exactly what he did. We had possession deep in Montreal territory. Final score 48-27.

After the game there appeared to be two different celebration sets — those with their wives or girlfriends and those on the loose. I was with the second group and hooked up with some guys carrying this long-necked vase. The idea was to fill the vase with whatever booze was available and then go to the various rooms to give occupants a drink — and then remix with whatever we could find. The best moment was when we bust into a room where Monty and Hal Pawson (sports editor for the Journal) were sipping some scotch. Cherry wanted them to sip from the vase. Monty refused but Hal put down his scotch and took the vase. Most people have one sip, can barely hold it down and get rid of the vase immediately. Hal chug-a-lugged the entire vase — whole damn thing. Hal said, "Thanks boys" and went back to his scotch and we were dismissed. We knew we had encountered someone in a different league.


