- This is of course very disappointing news. Our executive and RTP committee have put a lot of time and effort into getting these players and teams back on the baseball field. The host for the final 4 tournament has also put a ton of work into preparing the venue and facilities to provide a safe and compliant location to hold the final in. Unfortunately, we might only be looking at two teams playing off.

#### BCMBA – 15U AA & College Prep Final Four post mortem notes

15U AA (just an attendee that watched games Saturday and one Sunday)

- Host association did a great job given the short timeline to run tourney (observed constant RTP safety protocols)
- Teams overall did very well in social distancing (spectators too)
- Game play RTP management for all teams I observed did really well with safety protocols
- There were concerns from teams regarding an overage player playing down from 18U and playing in a High Performance division
  - o I do not know the particulars of how/why, but noted he was a middle of the order bat and CF was one of the better players
  - Should be looked at internally in rules given the concerns of the other teams in attendance
- Competitively very close
- Very capable umpiring given the COVID-19 adaptations

College Prep (attended Sunday only as BCMBA rep)

- I only attended on Sunday's play-in final game and final
- Host association did a great job hosting/running the tourney
- Did not see any off-field safety protocols in use
- Game play RTP management for all teams did really well
- Social distancing and spectator numbers were a concern
  - Little adherence to 2m social distancing and bleacher use
  - Final game could have started a half hour earlier (12:30pm), but North Fraser was concerned about fans getting to the final game scheduled for 1pm...so that of course was a concern in itself knowing the 50 person attendance guidelines
- Both games I observed were very competitive
- Not enough baseballs for tourney. Had to borrow one dozen from another association for Sunday games as there was no new ones
- Umpiring was strong with no issues and kept games under control throughout with some minor in-game issues
- On a side note Grant asked me to attend Sunday as no one else was there. We needed BCMBA a presence there
  all weekend as the UIC and Convener had players on the host team and could have been an issue if there was a
  protest as the committee usually is those two plus a BCMBA representative. They both recused themselves for
  the final game.

Anyways, it was a pleasant surprise to watch some very competitive baseball this weekend. Not knowing if we were able to get any form of a season done ended for both of these on a high notes for BCMBA, associations, players, volunteers and parents.

## **15UAA REPORT**

## The Season

The "modified" 15UAA Single-Season started with 18 teams who have expressed interest in playing back. Unfortunately, with a lack of players' commitment and field closure due to COVID-19, 7 teams pulled out.

With the mandate from viaSport and Baseball BC, we managed to form 4 bubbles of 2 and 3 teams on each bubble, one of which is on the Island. Each team has ten games. First game started on August 8, 2020, and the last game will end on Wednesday, September 2, 2020.

I attended games and witnessed how each team played following their safety protocols. Some noticeable 1st-year players excelled in gameplay. I also witnessed home runs, and grand slam plays. (which is very rare) There were no ejections or complaints put forward to my attention. Unfortunately, there were 2 forfeit games.

## Final 4

The Final 4 is determined by the top winning percentage of each bubble. There was a head to head tie occurred between North Shore and Ladner; hence Rule 29.01 of the rulebook applied, resulting in Ladner advancing to the Final 4.

The Final 4 is on September 5 and 6, 2020, at Cloverdale Ball Park. Round robin format with 3 games guarantee and no semi-final game. The teams advancing are Cloverdale, Newton/Surrey, Ladner, and Campbell River. Placement will be by drawing team names out of a hat. (3)
