As of the date this is being written, March 20, no Pancake Breakfast is being planned at Roosevelt this spring. There are just too many unsettled details.

One might be held later, so keep watching the website, RHS Facebook postings, and the school sign. There might be an event of some kind later in the year, but otherwise, we'll be thrilled to see you all next spring at the '23 Pancake Breakfast!

Thank you for funding these grants this school year

Thanks to you, Teddy donors, the Foundation was able to award \$74,676 in staff grants this school year, the largest grant amount awarded since the Foundation's beginning.

The largest category funded was equipment used in eight courses. The costliest item in this category is for construction classes, a trailer and construction materials. Students will build a solar studio shed, now very popular, to sell. The trailer will be used each year, and materials for the class the following years will not cost anything, as the profit made when the solar studio is sold will pay for the materials the following year, making it self-sustaining.

Other equipment includes headphones for student testing, a plasma table used for cutting metals and other materials, an ice maker, a vacuum necessary for the art department pug mill, equipment and furniture for two rooms, and three new induction stoves for Culinary Arts. The former very old stoves had become unsafe.

The next largest amount, about 20 percent, was for athletics. This included Nordic skiing equipment, tennis equipment, a pitching machine for girls softball, and 10 newer and better football helmets to reduce the possibility of concussions; currently there are not enough helmets for the entire team or to fit the students properly.

Another 20 percent was awarded for materials used in classes. This included materials for psych labs, science consumables (used for experiments in chemistry and biology), guest artists, books used in teaching annotation skills in *Macbeth* and *Romeo and Juliet*, materials for the new media arts class, and library books.

Because of your generosity the French students will take a trip to Concordia Language Village. The French and Arab

Clubs were awarded small grants for their meetings for the year.

Some things just don't fall into a category. The Culinary Arts teacher requested funds to enroll some students in classes to earn state food handling certificates needed to obtain well-paying jobs in the food industry. The National Honor Society students have volunteered for a service activity, cleaning up the two RHS courtyards, and they need lawn bags and other lawn and garden tools. The CCC adviser asked for funds to pay course fees for some students unable to pay.

Grants may be applied for by any staff member, coach, or adviser, with the requirement that the grant will improve the education of Roosevelt students.

Funds for all grants come from donations designated for specific departments or activities by donors and a percentage of funds available annually from the endowment account.

The main character's father is a rigid Dance Master in the studio where she dances. In a studio a floor above her father's, Prince—yes, *the Minnesota Prince*—rehearses and practices. Like many students, she longs for things which she does not have in her life, meets a person unacceptable to her family, and experiences many other difficulties of teenage years.



Two Teddies participate in Welding Society competition vs. professionals



On March 2, two Roosevelt welding students had an opportunity rarely available to high school students.

Liam Holm and Saola Sanchez Resendiz were the only two high school students participating in the Northwest Sections "Behind the Mask" welding competition sponsored by the American Welding Society.

The event usually involves only professionals and college students, but Liam and Saola were able to compete against many far older and experienced than they were. The event included SMAW, OFC, GTAW, and GMAW welding.

And now about those flags on the front page...and more!

Why are they in the Roosevelt halls? Assistant Principal Alexis Gonzalez had an idea for a service project: Flags representing the heritage of Roosevelt students could be hung around the building to illustrate the diversity in our school. But the school had no flags, and obviously no money to purchase them.

The 2021 AVID students and teachers took him up on his challenge as a class service project and tried to get the flags donated by various countries. They first learned what flags should be sought, and then wrote letters to each of the over 60 embassies or consulates of the countries represented, requesting a flag be sent to the school. Obviously this was not only a good letter-writing lesson, but also a good example of service. The result? Flags representing the heritage of students are now around the building, thanks to Gonzalez, teacher Molly Olson, the embassies, and most of all, the 2021 AVID students.

And this is not the only service project performed by AVID students. This year the AVID 11 students are participating in a non-profit group's project, *Letters For Our Elders*. Current students in Olson's class write cards and letters to elderly people who have few to write them. Some have commented that both these projects are very appropriate in a school in which the motto is "Enter to learn. Leave to serve." Even better is the fact that both service projects involve improving student writing.


For the first time in 49 years, since the 1972-73 winter season, Roosevelt was represented at the State Nordic ski races. Sophomore **Cai Hallstrom** competed for our TnT (Teddies and Tigers) Nordic ski team in Biwabik. Due to an accidental mishap, Cai had a very memorable race in which he, being a gracious Teddy and allowing other competitors a chance, skied a portion of the race with only ONE SKI! With a 10th place finish at State, this TnT Nordic team has an exciting future, especially when you consider that 49—yes, 49—of the TnT skiers are either current Roosevelt Teddies, or are in middle school, planning to attend RHS.

The rich wrestling tradition at Roosevelt continues with yet another wrestler qualifying for the State Tournament. Junior **Franklin Wohnoutka** qualified in the 145-pound weight class by taking second place in our section and completing his fantastic season at the X!

Franklin and our other wrestlers and coaches are hoping to get funds for a “sub floor” in the wrestling room, to make the concrete floor less impactful, ensuring safety for all our wrestlers when learning and executing new moves and techniques.
