The Learning to Train program is open to all players in U9/U10 and U11/U12 age divisions regardless of experience and skill level as the program will provide players with the opportunity to learn the skills of soccer through games and practices.

Here is what the Learning to Train Program at Pickering FC looks like. For more information email <u>admin-rec@pickeringfc.ca</u>.

Recreational Soccer is:

- An opportunity for players to be active twice a week with a game and practice.
- Learning to play the game through the practices and games.
- Playing in a team setting, making new friends and having fun.
- Coaches are volunteers can be a parent, older sibling, or a university/high school student.
 - Coaches are provided with an information manual and have access to support from the club though admin help, coaching tips and practice drills.
 - Remember: your child is learning to play the game and the coach is also learning his/her role as the coach of the team.

In the registration fee, players receive:

- Home and away jersey in PFC colours, shorts, socks, individual picture, and participation medal.
 The coach is responsible for receiving these times from the Club and for the distribution to the players.
- The coach will be in contact with parents prior to the start of the season to introduce themselves and provide information on uniform pick up and the schedule.
- Size 4 soccer ball players bring their ball to all to games and practices.
- Games, practices and year end event.

U9/U10 - players born in 2014 and 2015 - will turn 9 or 10 in 2024

U11/U12 - players born in 2012 and 2011 - will turn 11 or 12 in 2024

Teams will play one game a week and will have one 1-hour practice a week.

- 14 games during the season plus one game at the Year End Event on September 9.
- Season starts week of May 27 to May 30.
