ABOUT THE WILDCATS ...

Wildcats Storylines ...

THE FIRST CONTEST: Saint Ignatius and River Rouge (MI) will be playing each other on the gridiron for the first time in program history. The Panthers are a powerhouse in Michigan as they play out of Division 3 in the Michigan Metro Athletic Conference. River Rouge has competed for a state championship in Michigan for the last two seasons, winning in 2019 and runner-ups in 2020. River Rouge was awarded a win this past week vs. Hamtramck due to a forfeit. The Wildcats are coming off an instant classic against Archbishop Hoban winning 33-27 on a kick-six. The second half of the regular season will kick-off against River Rouge on Saturday at Byers Field at 4 p.m.

ENDZONE MARTY: Marty Lenehan continues his streak of finding pay dirt this season after last week's 30-yard touchdown run against Archbishop Hoban. Lenehan has found the endzone in all five games this season, bringing his season total to nine. Lenehan last week toted the rock 15 times for 78 yards vs. the Knights. The Wildcats have made a living this season with their run game between Lenehan and Joey Georges, winning the time of possession. The run game has been essential in the Cats' three-game winning streak and will look to be just as necessary against the Panthers in week six.

MEN UP FRONT: The Wildcats' two returning starters on the offensive line are seniors Ashton Montgomery and Brian Keane, who anchor the left and right tackles this year. Looking at the guards, senior Joe Ryland and junior Dominic Ference lock down the left and right guard spots. Junior Pat Lavelle is the center for the Wildcats offense for 2021. The run game for the Wildcats falls on the shoulders of the big uglies as the offensive line continues to impress in 2021. The Cats offense wears down an opponent with a heavy dose of the run game and the men up front pave the way for Lenehan and Georges to hurt a defense.

TRIFECTA DEFENSE: The Saint Ignatius defense came into week five with zero defensive touchdowns. They walked away from Byers Field last Saturday with three defensive scores for the win. Peter Chalhoub's scoop and score in the second quarter gave the Wildcats their first lead of the night. In the third quarter, Junior Max Palinski came with a critical pick-six to give the Wildcats a 17-10 lead. The third touchdown came from the clutch combo of Griffin Taliak and Franklin Pike. Taliak read the snap perfectly and blocked Charlie Durkin's potential game-winning kick that fell into the hands of Pike for a game-winning 72-yard touchdown.

PALINSKI'S PALS: Max Palinski has shown his importance on the football field for the defense at the outside linebacker spot. Palinski last week came away with a 20-yard pick-six in the third quarter. Hoban quarterback Jayvian Crable threw the ball while being pressured by Joey Kause and Will Robinson and Palinski was right there to make a play on the ball. Christopher Aerni added in five tackles last week from his middle linebacker position, while Gavin Berger and Blase Mastrianni combined for four tackles. The linebacking core will have some added beef as the Wildcats have called up two linebackers from the Junior Varsity roster. Sophomores Michael Krebs and Ryan Ardire look to gain experience at the varsity level at a young age.

GRIFFIN'S BLOCK PARTY: Last Saturday, Griffin Taliak was the hero against Archbishop Hoban, blocking the Knights game-winning field goal recovered from Franklin Pike for a game-winning touchdown for the Cats. Taliak has been a one-person wrecking crew on special teams for the Wildcats this season. The senior safety has totaled four blocks in the 2021 season. Two blocked punts, one blocked PAT and one blocked field goal. Taliak is a dual-sport athlete at Saint Ignatius as he is an attacker on the Lacrosse team. He uses that great speed on the football field to disrupt an opponent's offense and special teams. Taliak has a nack for finding the football and has been a critical part of the Wildcats' winning streak.

IN ELDRIDGE WE TRUST: Zeb Eldridge was masterful in the 33-27 win over Archbishop Hoban last Saturday night. The senior kicker came in the clutch in a prominent spot for the Cats. As the game was tied at 24, all with 8:42 remaining in the game, Eldridge booted a 48-yard kick through the uprights to give the Wildcats a 27-24 lead. Eldridge also helped the field position game last week with three booming punts in the winning effort. Eldridge's longest was a 50-yard punt to back up the Knights' offense. Eldridge's average was 42.6 on three punts.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN: The captains for the 2021 season are #22 Marty Lenehan, #34 Christopher Aerni, #95 Peter Chalhoub and #99 Thomas Wasinski.

Learning about the Panthers ...

JOHNSON FILE: Christian Johnson is the starting quarterback for the Panthers this season. Johnson is a transfer from Detroit Cass Tech and is in his junior season. In his first varsity start on August 28, Johnson threw for three touchdowns in River Rouge's 56-0 win vs. Eastpointe to open the season. In a match-up vs. Warren De La Salle, Johnson led his squad to a comeback that fell just short as they would fall 38-29, where he would throw two touchdown passes to Jalen Holly. Despite not playing last year because of the transfer protocol, Johnson was highly involved with the River Rouge offense to take over at quarterback in his junior season.

AIR ATTACK: The Panthers have versatile weapons at wide receiver this season. It all begins with Jalen Holly. Holly is the lone returner on the offense for a River Rouge team that made it to the Division 3 State Championship a season ago. Holly scored twice in the 56-0 win in the season opener vs. Eastpointe, as he has shown to be Johnson's favorite target in the open field. Holly also tallied two touchdown receptions in the 38-29 loss against Warren De La Salle. Brandon Wideman is another playmaker for the Panthers' offense; Johnson connected on a 65-yard touchdown to Wideman to kick off the season. Lastly, there is Nick Marsh. Marsh is a sophomore and already a four-star prospect. The 6'3" 185 lbs receiver saw time in the State Championship game as a freshman, having four catches for 85 yards and a touchdown. The Panthers' offense can hurt you in many ways.

SCHEDULING ISSUES: River Rouge is coming into week six after being idle in week five due to a Hamtramck forfeit. COVID-19 has caused changes to the schedule for River Rouge as they were initially supposed to play Renaissance on September 3. Due to a covid outbreak at Renaissance, the Panthers scheduled a Michigan powerhouse in Warren De La Salle. The Panthers were given three days to practice for Warren De La Salle and despite the loss, the Panthers put up a valiant effort against one of the state's formidable foes.

BLITZING D: The Panthers began the season with six starters returning on the defense that plays an aggressive brand of football. Davonte Miles is the feature on the Panthers defense as the 6'5" 285 lbs defensive lineman was originally committed to play at the University of Michigan but has reopened his recruitment. Miles and the defense will be looking to force turnovers on the Wildcats in week six as the offensive line for the Cats will have its hands full with a tremendous defensive opponent.

The Wildcats have played at least one game at Byers Field in 36 of the last 38 years (seasons without games - 1984 and 1991) 2021 marks the 94th season that football has been played on this location, now known as Byers Field atRobert M. Boulton Stadium. The press box, which has been upgraded in the past five seasons with a new working media area and new windows, seats 30 journalists and broadcasters. New field turf was installed for the 2012 season. The stadium has also had handicap seating added to both sets of grandstands, including 46 wheelchair and com-panion seats on the home side of the stadium. Parma City Schools invested nearly \$1.2 million into the facility during the summer of 2014, including a new parking lot on the south end of the stadium and the full replacement of the parking lot on the east side of the stadium under the press box. On August 26, 2009, Byers Field was re-dedicated and renamed in honor of Robert M. Boulton, the retired Superintendent of Ath-letics for the Parma City Schools and a Parma Senior High grad. The new name - Byers Field at Robert M. Boulton Stadium was revealed, during a 50-yard line ceremony, to Mr. Boulton for his many years of service to the community.



GAME PREVIEW

WILDCATS SEEKING FOURTH CONSECUTIVE VICTORY

For the first time in program history, Saint Ignatius will play River Rouge on the gridiron. The Cats are coming off an emotional roller coaster against the Archbishop Hoban Knights after a 33-27 victory in the final seconds thanks to a Griffin Taliak field goal block and Franklin Pike score. "That is what we had to do, go for the block," says Head Football Coach Chuck Kyle '69. "The ball landed right in the hands of Pike, who has great speed and the rest is history."

The Wildcats walk into week six with a 3-2 record on the season, taking on a Michigan powerhouse in River Rouge. The Panthers play out of the Michigan Metro Athletic Conference and have made appearances in the Division 3 State Championship in the previous two seasons, winning in 2019.

SAINT IGNATIUS OFFENSE VS. RIVER ROUGE DEFENSE

The rushing gain continues to be the bread and butter for the Saint Ignatius offense. Last week against Archbishop Hoban, Marty Lenehan scored his ninth touchdown, continuing his touchdown streak in 2021. Lenehan carried the ball 15 times for 78 yards and found paydirt in the third quarter. Senior quarterback Joey Pfaff added 32 yards on the ground on five carries. The Wildcats finished with 136 yards rushing against the Knights.

The passing game will be the most significant question mark for the Wildcat offense against River Rouge. Not only will Saint Ignatius have to deal with an aggressive Panther defense, but potentially rain showers on Saturday in Parma.

River Rouge brings in a defense that enjoys blitzing on the opposition. There are six returning starters on the defense for River Rouge. Highlighting the defense is Davonte Miles, who stands at 6'5" 285 lbs. Miles was committed to playing football at the University of Michigan but reopened his recruitment during the summer.

"Defensively, they are very skilled; we have to be balanced," emphasizes Kyle. "The running game will help the passing game; this is a good battle, as emotional last week was vs. Hoban, we have to come back with energy this week."

River Rouge has faced challenges in the 2021 season with scheduling issues due to the pandemic. Instead of playing Renaissance in week two, they faced off against Warren De La Salle, a powerhouse in Michigan high school football. With just days to prepare, River Rouge put up a tremendous fight as they would fall 38-29. The Panthers are battle-tested and coming off a week where they were idle due to a forfeit from Hamtramck.

The offense for Saint Ignatius will have an exciting challenge on their hands in week six vs. the Panthers. Lenehan will be the focal point of the offense for coach Kyle's Wildcats and will be a key in opening the passing lanes for Pfaff as the offense looks for a balance.

SAINT IGNATIUS DEFENSE VS. RIVER ROUGE OFFENSE

The Saint Ignatius defense is coming off a dominating performance against Archbishop Hoban. The Cats defensive 11 came away with three touchdowns in the 33-27 victory on Saturday. Peter Chalhoub scored the first defensive touchdown with a scoop and score on a botched Knights snap. Max Palinski scored on a pick-six and Franklin Pike won the game on a blocked field goal return.

"We are playing great team defense; our secondary certainly has speed," Kyle explains. "Our defensive line is strong and quick, we knew they were going to be good and they are proving it this season."

This week, the Saint Ignatius defense will be out with one of their captains and top defenders in Chalhoub, who will miss week six due to an injury. The defense will see a rotation of Eugene Gibbons and Will Robinson.

"We are a solid team all the way around," says Kyle. "We believe that we can contribute in all facets of the game."

River Rouge has a versatile offense with dangerous weapons at the receiver position. Jalen Holly is the favorite target to junior quarterback Christian Johnson. Holly opened the season with two receiving touchdowns against Eastpointe. The Panthers have a four-star prospect in Nick Marsh. Marsh is a sophomore receiver who saw time on varsity as a freshman.

"They can make a big play at any time," says Kyle. "No matter the down and distance, we have to be alert at keeping them under control."

The secondary for the Wildcats will have a great test against the Panthers'Panthers' offense. Joe Norris, Franklin Pike and Griffin Taliak will be the focal points of the defensive secondary for Saint Ignatius. The Cats will look to limit the big play from the Panthers'Panthers' offense in week six.

With this being the first match-up between these two programs, both have little knowledge on what to expect when stepping on the field.

"We do a film exchange and that is about it," says Kyle. "One of the important aspects that the kids need to understand is there will be adjustments made throughout the game."

The weather may play a factor in the Panthers' offense and challenge their ability to throw the football down the field. The Wildcat defense must be prepared to slow the Panthers down.

SPECIAL TEAMS

If you ask coach Kyle, special teams win you games, which was evident in last week's victory vs. Archbishop Hoban. "We have to always win the special teams game," emphasizes Kyle. "In high school football, it is so important, we trust in Zeb to hit a long field goal and we'll continue to take those chances."

The Wildcats will seek their fourth straight win on Saturday vs. River Rouge with kick-off at 4 p.m. from Byers Field.

Football Cats Win on a Kick Six

Saint Ignatius entered the contest with a 2-2 record and came into the game looking for a signature win against the 3-1 Archbishop Hoban Knights.

The Knights would take over at their 25-yard line after the punt and they wasted no time putting points on the board. The Knights drove down the field, methodically picking up yards on short runs and passes. That would change when star-running back Lamar Sperling would catch a screen pass on third down and run it 43-yards for a touchdown. Sperling accounted for 66 of the 75 yards on that drive for the Knights. After receiving the ensuing kickoff, the Cats were looking to answer with some points of their own. The drive was propelled forward by huge chunk plays from seniors Marty Lenehan and Collin Vollmer but eventually stalled out after a fumbled snap forced a field goal try. Senior Zeb Eldridge would nail a 39-yarder to open the second quarter; however, the Cats would still trail the Knights 7-3.

Hoban's first drive of the second quarter lasted two plays. The first was a false start penalty. The second was a fumbled snap off the helmet of Hoban quarterback Jayvion Crable, which was picked up and returned for a touchdown by senior defensive end Peter Chalhoub. This made it 10-7 Wildcats and was the first defensive score of the season.

The rest of the second quarter did not play out how either team would have liked. Penalties on offense plagued Hoban and the Wildcats were unable to convert on scoring opportunities. Then, at the end of the first half, Hoban put together a drive to get them into field goal range as Charlie Durkin drilled a 39-yarder to tie the game up 10-10.

The Knights received the second-half kickoff and opened up on offense playing entirely out of sync. Hoban committed several penalties that led to a 3rd & 19 situation. On the ensuing play, the Cats were able to pressure Crable and force him to throw an interception right into the hands of junior linebacker Max Palinski. Palinski returned the interception 20-yards for the defense's second touchdown of the game to give the Wildcats a 17-10 lead.

After taking over with good field position on a punt, the Cats picked up a first down before Lenehan would break loose for a 30-yard touchdown run. Lenehan's ninth touchdown of the campaign put Saint Ignatius up 24-10. The Knights responded with an 80-yard touchdown drive.

The Cats had a chance to end the drive early, but some missed tackles allowed Crable to find Rickey Williams downfield for a 48-yard pickup. The huge completion set up a Sperling

four-yard touchdown run later in the drive. Then just two plays into the next drive for the Cats, Pfaff was picked off over the middle by Caleb Kepler. Kepler had no one in front of him and returned it for a touchdown, which tied the game up once again.

To begin the fourth quarter, Pfaff would spark the offense with a 24-yard run. Following the run, both Pfaff and Joey Georges were able to use their legs to set up an Eldridge 48-yard field goal. The field goal put the Cats back on top 27-24 with 8:42 to play.

Sperling fueled the next drive for the Knights. The senior back helped push Hoban to the Wildcat 35-yard line. Durkin, who was two of three on field goals, made a 45-yard field goal to tie the game at 27 apiece with 5:41 left in the game.

Head Football Coach Chuck Kyle '69 would use his final timeout of the half with two seconds left to attempt to ice Durkin. Coming out of the huddle, the Wildcats had one hope to win the game, block the kick. As the hold was down on the field goal, senior safety Griffin Taliak came flying around the edge and leaped in front of the kick to block it; his third special teams block of the season.

Taliak deflected the kick right into the hands of senior Franklin Pike, who caught the ball in stride and was off to the races. Pike took off down the sideline and, in his own words, "I knew when I got the ball nobody was going to catch me," and he was right. Pike arrived in the endzone with ten other Wildcats trailing him the whole way. The "Kick-Six" put the Wildcats ahead for good with a 33-27 final score.


