NHARA ACC Report

Once again early season weather set the tone for another interesting competition season. We went from nothing to what was a total season's snowfall in the last quarter of the winter. The challenges facing alpine snow sports are not just the weather or the overall cost of participation, we are most immediately impacted by the economic reality of our host resorts/areas—good and bad alike. We all need to continue to be more realistic when dealing with large ski area operations, their needs, and how we can best help them as programs. Youth racing needs to be more flexible with respect to scheduling and be more responsible in how we represent ourselves on every level.

STATE RACE SERIES, PROGRAMMING:

- 40 scored races scheduled, 6 cancelled.
- 5 total U16 qualifying races, all contested.
- 70 total non-scored youth events scheduled statewide.
- 2 total U14 and younger events cancelled.
- NHARA offered 13 total children's championship/invite events.
- 29 total open children's events, 7 U10 only.
- 7 children's skills/training days.

NHARA AO stats and offered programming:

- NHARA had 730 members with Alpine Official (AO) memberships, more than any other Division in U.S. Ski & Snowboard, of which 494 had at least 1 Level 1 AO Certification.
- NHARA hosted 14 AO Education Clinics, 9 in person and 5 via Zoom, with approximately 250 AOs in attendance.
- NHARA had 250 members with at least a Level 1 RF Certification, of which 27 are new this year.
- NHARA had 39 TDs, up from 34 last year, with 25 working as TDs at 90 NHARA Events.

• NHARA is well represented in the AO world of U.S. Ski & Snowboard Alpine, with 4 members sitting on the Eastern Alpine Officials Committee, 3 on the U.S. Ski Snowboard Alpine Officials Education Working Group, and 1 who is the Chair of the U.S. Ski & Snowboard Alpine Rules Working Group.

NHARA is committed to providing the best possible environment for all its members to achieve their athletic goals and remain connected with the sport as lifelong skiers. We are eager to continue working closely with our regional and national assets, always with the goal of being better providers for our membership. NHARA is extremely proud of our truly diverse and committed population of volunteers and industry professionals.

NHARA Alpine Officials Committee Annual Report for Season 2022-2023

As of the close of Season 2022-2023, using the U.S. Ski & Snowboard, Officials Certifications Viewer, there were 6,794 AO Members nationally, which includes Alpine Officials and Coaches with Alpine Official memberships, of which 4,175, 61%, had an AO Certification, meaning Level 1 or higher. The Eastern Region (which has 8 Divisions, NHARA, VARA, MARA, Tri-State, PARA, NYSSRA, NJSRA & SARA) had 3,057 AO Members (45% of the National total), of which 1,926, 63%, had an AO Certification. NHARA had 729 AO Members (11% of the National total & 24% of Eastern), of which 489, 68%, had an AO Certification. NHARA had the following new AO Certifications added this season: 4 Chief of Course, 56 Competition Official, 12 Chief of Race, 31 Jury Advisor (Start and Finish Ref), 1 Race Administrator, 11 Timing & Calculation, 29 Referee and 6 Technical Delegate.

Although we lead the Nation in numbers of AOs in any single Division, we significantly lag behind with respect to the percentage of our Certified AOs who have a Referee Certification. Nationally, 63% of Certified AOs have Referee Certifications. In VARA, with whom we are very close in numbers of AOs, 82% of the Certified AOs have Referee Certifications, while only 51% of our Certified AOs have Referee Certifications. As noted above, we added 29 new Referee Certifications this year, but we still need to work on growing the ranks of Referees. Toward that end, next Clinic Season the NHARA Alpine Officials Committee (hereafter the AOC) will be offering in-house Referee Clinics with Exams for each Club that requests it. This should make it much easier for non-Referee Coaches to obtain their RF 1 Certification. To be successful, Program Directors will need to be engaged. Those Clinics can be week days or nights, as well as weekend days or nights.

This past season, NHARA had 25 TDs work 90 events; Matt Howard did a great job getting TD coverage for all sanctioned events, but his job was by no means easy. The AOC has recognized over the last several years that an infusion of new, young people (male & female) with significant experience on the hill is needed in our TD ranks. I am happy to report that over the last 2 seasons, the AOC has worked to help 22 NHARA members become new TDs; 13 last season and 9 this season. Most are relatively young and deeply engaged coaches who are, in alpha order: Josh Bedard, Marc Bourgoin, Doug Clarke, JP Daignauilt, Sam Damon, Ben Drummond, Mike Fairbrother, Julia Ford, Brian Gilman, Jason Guilbert, Craig Leaman, Bryant Lehr, Andy Locke, Aaron Loukes, Dan Marshall, Jason Nelson, Derek Pelletier, Joe Peznola, Eric Price, Brennan Smith, Justin Sperry and Scott Wilkinson. The AOC is appreciative of their willingness to put in the time and energy to study for and to pass both the TC1 and TD1 Exams, and to be the U. S. Ski & Snowboard representative at sanctioned events in the future. I am also appreciative of the help provided in that endeavor by many people, including Bill McQuade, Jill Firstbrook, Fred Turton, Carl Anderson, and Scott Wilkinson. Additionally, between the last 2 seasons, Jill Firstbrook, Tory Amorello, Jason Nelson and Julia Ford have all be instrumental by providing venues for these new TDs to attend Clinics and take exams.

The AOC welcomed 3 new Members this season, Ben Drummond, Program Director at the Holderness School and a new NHARA TD, Andy Locke, head coach at Colby Sawyer College and

a new NHARA TD, and Scott Wilkinson, RA at Proctor Academy & Gunstock, and a new NHARA TD. Moving forward each Member of the AOC will be have responsibilities for implementing new programs, presenting AO Clinics and proctoring AO Exams.

This past season the AOC hosted 14 AO Update Clinics, 9 in person and 5 via Zoom, with approximately 250 AOs in attendance, down from approximately 350 last year. Included in the Clinics were 2 TD Update Clinics, which are required every year for all TDs to maintain their TD Certification. The reduction in AO Update Clinic attendance is a serious concern, as it is almost a 30% drop over the average attendance over the last 3 years. If that downward trend continues, we will have problems filling AO position on the hill a few years down the road; a problem that will make the lack of gatekeeper problem we are in the midst of seem minor. Without certified AOs (CR, CC, RF, JA & TD) as required by the Sanction Agreements for each event, we will risk losing insurance coverage and may need to cancel races. This is not hyperbole; it is a very real problem. Many AOs age out of the sport as their children age out of racing, but that has always been the case. Racer membership is up across the State, which means those who could volunteer, primarily parents, are just not doing it. Volunteerism is falling and we, as an organization, need to find ways to draw parents back into the sport, in meaningful ways that support the teams and, by the way, get the volunteers some of the best seats in the house. Name another youth sport in which parents have the chance to not only be on the field, be on the court, or be on the diamond watching their children participate in what will become a lifelong sport for virtually all races, but can also help prepare and manage the course in a meaningful way.

The AOC plans to re-build the AO Webpage on the NHARA Website so that it includes links to all U.S. Ski & Snowboard educational materials, including AO Study Guides, Update & Review materials, PowerPoint Presentations, and Videos. It also plans to make a series of short NHARA AO Videos, one for entry level parents who need a primer on ski racing, including how they can participate in an on-hill, meaningful role, and several other videos targeting specific AO positions, made by AOs with a proven track record in those positions. Those specific AO position videos will be modeled upon a video used in the U.S. Ski & Snowboard TD Update this past season, which featured Paul Van Slyke and Greg Towle, moderated by Laura Sullivan, discussing the interplay between the Chief of Race and TD the Technical Delegate. We plan to make those videos available on the NHARA AO webpage for direct viewing and for downloading to be used by Clubs internally.

Last, but certainly not least, Scott Wilkinson, in a unanimous vote of the Eastern Alpine Officials Committee, was named Eastern Alpine Official of the Year. Most reading, or hearing, this Report know that Scott, following in his father's footsteps, has helped NHARA in many ways in recent years, but to be sure this Board understands the depth and breadth of his contributions, I will paste below part of the Nomination that was submitted in support of Scott for that Award:

(1) Scott has been the Gunstock Ski Club RA for many years and he currently holds the following AO Certifications: CC1, CO3, CR1, JA2, RA3, TC3 & TD1. A few years ago, Scott stepped into the role of Proctor RA, while maintaining his RA and TC work

Ski Industry health varied by region dependent on weather and to a lesser extent economic influences. Retailers in NE were hit hard early with a lack of consumer demand as winter whimpered in yet bounced back when the season showed signs of life in March. The general mood at retail throughout the region is solid yet a little underwhelming coming off a record 2021/2022 season. Expect demand for Race Equipment to remain strong as this market is consistent year over year. Manufactures have rebounded somewhat with production capacity which will hopefully support earlier delivery of race products. That said, expect early sell-through and continued damand/scarcity especially for trending gear.

- (2) He created and maintained the annual NHARA race calendar as a Google Sheet, which lists races, dates, locations, times, cancellations, rescheduling dates, age classes, genders, TD assigned and any relevant Notes. Additionally, on the version available to all parents and coaches on the NHARA webpage, there are links to whichever on-line registration platform is being used for a particular race, including the race announcement and other relevant documents, and, after the race is finished, there is a link to the results. Additionally, the version available on the NHARA website is broken out by scored and unscored races, which minimizes unnecessary information being presented to parents.
- (3) He, set up a system for collecting, and sent out periodic emails containing, materials that were relevant to RAs, which was quite helpful as RAs worked their way through the new requirements imposed this season on the LOCs, with respect to SafeSport and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies triggered by their inclusion in the revised Sanction Agreements used this season. In dealing with that rather troublesome issue, Scott reached out to Park City for clarification on just what duties had been pushed out to RAs. As we all know, shortly after the season began, Park City substantially modified what was required of RAs. I believe Scott's pointed, yet polite, inquiries helped push things in the right direction.
- (4) Scott hosted an end of season Zoom meeting for all NHARA RAs to debrief on the season, collect thoughts on what worked and what needs to be improved upon.
- (5) Not only has he presented at general U.S. Ski & Snowboard/NHARA AO Education Clinics and ran the NHARA RA Clinic and Update, he, along with Carl Anderson, also presented at TC Clinics and proctored TC Exams.
- (6) This Season alone, Scott worked as RA and/or TC at 22 races and worked as Finish Ref at U18 Nationals DH at Mittersill/Cannon.
- (7) Along with others on the AOC, Scott will be working with me to re-build, from the ground up, the NHARA AO webpage on the NHARA website, with an eye toward including links to **ALL** U.S. Ski & Snowboard Alpine Officials Educational materials.
- (8) And, he has agreed to work with other AO Committee members to create short parent and AO videos referenced above, that will be viewable on the NHARA website but that can also can be pushed out to Clubs for internal AO Education.

I have thoroughly enjoyed working with so many of you over recent years and look forward to many more such years, on the hill.

2022-2023 Annual Report

This again has been a very eventful year for all age groups as well as for coaches and other staff trying to provide the best learning experience for NHARA clubs and their members. This season had its ups and downs again, much of which was provided by Mother Nature. Weather and snow conditions varied from "great" to "difficult".

SEED LISTS

USSA Point Lists were usually available on time. The largest age group racing in our state is U16s.

RACE CALENDARS

2022-2023-Scored and Unscored Race Calendars. Kudos to those involved in creating a meaningful race calendar for all the age groups this season.

NHARA TEAMS

The criteria for each of the NHARA State Teams, updated significantly to reflect changing needs and demographics, has continued to work well. There will continue to be an annual review of the State and Development Team selection criteria by the BOT for retaining as is or updating if deemed necessary before inclusion in the 2023-2024 handbook or on the website.

NHARA MACOMBER CUP, TECNICA CUP AND LAFOLEY SPRING SERIES

The changing focus in the US towards increased emphasis on FIS racing has again had major implications for the success of our two tiered system that has been so successful for many years.

Clubs also have continued to host races when field sizes are small and lift fees imposed by the areas make it difficult for a club to make a small profit or break even. Race penalties in NHARA have risen significantly in the last few years because of the increased number of FIS opportunities in the region. Racers are looking elsewhere for opportunities to lower their points and field sizes have diminished. A suitable program for our U19s continues to be a problem.

Restructuring the series has helped somewhat. All scored races are essentially Open races, with some designated as being scored for Macomber Cup or LaFoley Series for entrants holding a current NHARA membership.

The U16 Qualifier series is the Tecnica Cup Series. This series qualifies athletes for the U16 Regional Championships and Finals. This series is restricted to current U16 NHARA members. In order to be scored the racer must hold a current NHARA membership at the time of participation in the race. Athletes without a current membership at the time of participation were not scored. There was no retroactive scoring for membership purchase after the time of racing.

SCORING

As in the past couple of years scoring for the Macomber and LaFoley series was performed by Jack Jacopino and me independently and then compared for accuracy before posting on the

website. This system works well. However, it depends on accurate submission of race results in .txt format by the host site Race Administrators. The current trend toward results published in .pdf, though pleasing to the eye, do not decode at all well into .txt files.

This problem also affects the ability to produce Scored and Unscored Race Data spreadsheets in a timely manner. These spreadsheets are helpful in providing seasonal data useful for future calendar planning, evaluation of program direction by the Coaches Council, as well as a historical perspective.

MEMBERSHIP

Membership numbers were down a bit this year.

It remains to be seen what the 1923-24 season will bring.


