Put another way, it is an exercise of the bishop's episcopal ministry meant to "promote acceptance of the Church's salvific doctrine and to encourage the faithful in their following of Christ" (Instruction on Diocesan Synods,

1997, 3). Fr. Evans, Bob & Jenny Heth, Georgia Von Arx, and Aaron Franta will be attending as representatives of Crucifixion and St. Peter's parishes.
