#### CENTRAL DAUPHIN ICE HOCKEY CLUB PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT

This participation agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the undersigned Parent(s) or Legal Guardian(s) of "the player" named below (collectively referred to in this Agreement as "Participants") and the Central Dauphin Ice Hockey Club ("CDIHC"),

- 1. Participants desire and have voluntarily signed this Agreement requesting that the player be permitted to play ice hockey with and through the CDIHC for the 2023-2024 season ("the season").
- 2. Participants agree to read, sign, and abide by the CDIHC Code of Conduct and any rules handed down by the Central Pennsylvania Interscholastic Hockey League ("CPIHL"), the governing organization in which the CDIHC is a member. Participants also acknowledge and agree that failure to comply with any of these rules may result in consequences including, but not limited to, decreased playing time, game suspensions, and expulsion from the CDIHC without a refund of any fees paid by Participants to CDIHC. Any decision resulting in such consequences shall be within the sole discretion of the CDIHC and Participants agree that such decision by CDIHC shall be binding and final
- 3. Upon signing this Agreement, Participants agree to pay the CDIHC a \$100 non-refundable deposit. This fee will be credited towards the Participants' total fees due for the entire season, if the player is approved for a spot on a CDIHC team by the CDIHC and its coaching staff. Any decision as to whether a player is accepted onto a CDIHC team or remains playing with any CDIHC team for the entire season, shall be within the sole discretion of the CDIHC Board in consultation with the coaching staff. Any CDIHC decision in this regard shall be final and binding upon Participants.
- 4. Participants agree to make all payments due on or before the payment due dates established by the CDIHC. When a payment is 15 days late the parents will be notified that they have 15 days to become current or their son/daughter will be suspended from further team activities until they are current with their financial responsibilities. If they fail to make payment within 15 days, the player is suspended indefinitely from further team activities up to and including practices and games. The player will not be reinstated until the family financial responsibilities have been met. The coach of the respective team will be directed to not play that player or allow them to participate in any team activity until that time. Participants further agree to pay additional amounts as adjustments to the cost of the season for reasonable and/or unforeseen expenses incurred during the season, e.g. unexpected increases in the CPIHL league fees, or the final cost adjustment based upon total player membership. Participants agree that refunds shall not be issued for any player quitting the team, any dissatisfaction (including complaints about a team's win/loss record or the amount of playing time available to the player), any player suspension or expulsion, or consequences stemming from the player missing practices or games. The CDIHC Board shall consider all other matters on a case-by-case basis. This should not be construed, however, as guarantee that any partial or full refund for shall be approved since any ability to make refunds shall be subject to CDIHC financial constraints.
- 5. Participants agree to return all CDIHC-owned jerseys, and any other CDIHC-owned property in Participants' possession, at the end of the season in reasonably good condition; failure to return any items belonging to the CDIHC shall result in Participants' liability for the replacement cost of the jerseys (at \$175 per jersey) or other CDIHC-owned property. Participants agree to pay such amounts that the CDIHC may reasonably determine as the replacement value.
- 6. Participants understand and agree that they are solely financially responsible for all equipment required by the player (except for those items specifically provided by the CDIHC, such as socks) and for providing transportation to dry land, to practices, and to games.
- 7. Participants agree to conduct themselves in an appropriate, "sportsman-like" manner at all times, and to refrain from violence or verbal abuse toward the coaching staff, the CPIHL officials, other players, parents, or the CDIHC Board members. Participants agree to follow USA Hockey Code of Conduct for Parents and Spectators. Participants agree to a twenty-four (24) hour "cooling-off period" prior to contacting coaches or CDIHC Board members about any grievance or complaint. Participants who fail to comply with these requirements agree to give up their right to attend or play in any CPIHL games.

8. Participants agree that neither the CPIHL nor the CDIHC (including CDIHC board members, coaches, or other CDIHC officials or parents) shall be responsible for any injuries to the player, or damages that that may occur to the Participants, while participating in club activities as detailed in the USA Hockey Waiver of Liability Agreement. Participants shall defend, indemnify, and hold CDIHC and the CPIHL, its officers, agents, and employees harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees) or claims for injury or damages arising out of the performance of this Agreement.

9. All players and families will be asked to participate in at least one fundraiser throughout the year.



#### CENTRAL DAUPHIN ICE HOCKEY CLUB CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. There is no "I" in team. Ice Hockey is a team sport. There should be no personal goals. They should be TEAM goals--an assist is as important as a goal.
- 2. You will be expected to follow all school rules. You are a student athlete and a representative of the Central Dauphin Ice Hockey team.
- 3. It is expected that Ice Hockey will be an important commitment to you. Please do not waste the time of coaches, managers, and other players by not performing. Be committed to being the best you can be.
- 4. Please understand the concept of constructive criticism. Our goal and the goal of the coaches is to make you a better person and a better hockey player, in that order.
- Please recognize that your coaches are not paid, they do this because of their love of young people and their love of the game. They deserve your utmost respect and cooperation.
- 6. Additionally, your teammates, officials and your competitors also deserve your respect. Good sportsmanship is a number one priority.
- 7. Commitment and sacrifice are expected from all
- 8. Practice is especially important. Show up on time, ready to skate, ready to work out for dry land. Every practice is an important preparation for the games, and they are all run for YOUR benefit.
- 9. If you are ill or cannot attend practice for any other reason, it is your responsibility to contact your Head Coach prior to the practice and notify him/het. Failure to do so may result in disciplinary action(s) to be determined by the coach, such as being ineligible to play in the next game.
- 10. You are expected to be at all games during the season except in the case of illness, family emergency, or a scholastic event. Your teammates and coaches are counting on you to be there. You must notify your Head Coach with as much advance notice as possible if you are not able to be at a game. Failure to do so may result in disciplinary action(s) to be determined by the coach, such as being ineligible to play in the next game.
- 11. Parents, please observe the MANDATORY 24-hour "cooling off" period when dealing with any conflicts, whether the conflict be with a coach, an official, a board member, or any other person. We will not tolerate parents confronting coaches before or after games.
- 12. If you are asked to leave the ice for "behavioral problems," you will be automatically suspended for 1 game or more, as determined by the board.
- 13. Any penalty due to fighting or resulting in a game suspension will require a player to appear before the CDIHC Disciplinary Committee to determine if further disciplinary action is necessary.

- 14. Drug and Alcohol Policy: If a player has a problem, please seek help from coaches, parents, doctors, or someone who can help. If a player comes forward and seeks help, we will work out a plan with parents and counselors to keep the player playing hockey, if that is the wishes of the player and his/her parents. If a player is caught at any hockey function either in possession of drugs and/or alcohol or appearing to be under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol, he/she will be suspended for the remainder of the season. If a player is arrested for any of the above, he/she will be suspended for the remainder of the season. Alcohol and drug use/abuse will not be tolerated.
- 15. No fighting, cursing, smoking (including vape pens and e-cigarettes), illegal drugs, drinking (alcohol), or tobacco products will be tolerated. Academics First!!
- 16. Good Sportsmanship, good characters good behavior, honesty, integrity and dedication are expected and to be displayed by Central Dauphin Ice Hockey Club players AT ALL TIMES. Failure to do so will result in disciplinary action to be determined by the coaches.

3rd & 4th grade players may PRACTICE ONLY with the Middle School Team for a fee of \$300 per season.

PAYMENT DUE DATES – Payments are due on the 1st of each month. After 15 days, if the monthly payment has not been made you will receive written/emailed notice of non-payment. If at 30 days the payment remains delinquent, the player will be placed on an administrative suspension. Once the financial obligations have been satisfied the player will be returned to a reinstated status. Should the player leave the organization after being placed on a suspended status and/or fail to satisfy the required payments before the close of the current playing season, their information will be forwarded to the AAHA for inclusion on their financial delinquency no pay/no play register which could prevent future playing eligibility for any organization.

\*These rates are estimated based on actual 2019-20 fees & costs and are subject to revision once actual CPIHL costs for 2023-24 are confirmed in the fall. Should it be necessary to change the fees, all members will be provided an updated payment schedule as soon as possible.

\*\*Evaluation/Registration Fees are non-refundable and must be paid prior to on-ice evaluations and are included in the season player fee.

Jersey fee for new High School Players are \$175.00 and must be received by August 1st so that personalized jerseys (1 Home and 1 Away) can be ordered in time for the beginning of the season. Previous players wishing/needing to replace their jerseys may do so at their own expense.

Checks should be made payable to CDIHC and delivered to the club treasurer. Checks may also be mailed to CDIHC, PO Box 61181, Harrisburg, PA 17106. Members requiring additional payment information may contact the club treasurer at <a href="mailto:treas@cdicehockey.org">treas@cdicehockey.org</a>. Payments are NON-REFUNDABLE unless otherwise stated. A \$30.00 service charge will be applied to any player account should a check payment be returned as unpaid.

### USA HOCKEY SAFESPORT CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS



#### About SafeSport

USA Hockey believes that all hockey players deserve to play the game free from any form of emotional, physical, or sexual misconduct. In order to provide that environment, USA Hockey has teamed up with the U.S. Center for SafeSport, a national, independent, non-profit organization, that serves two primary purposes. First, it provides education and training to coaches, administrators, athletes, parents, and sports organizations to prevent emotional, physical, and sexual misconduct from occurring. Second, it provides response and resolution services to receive all reports of misconduct, and investigate those reports, issuing decisions and sanctions if necessary. U.S. Center for SafeSport was established by Congress through the Protecting Young Victims from Sexual Abuse and Safe Sport Authorization Act of 2017.

### Who needs to be SafeSport Certified?

All CDIHC coaches, board members, team managers, those transporting players to games and/or practices, and volunteers who have potential one-on-one interactions between themselves (an adult) and a minor (one of the players) are required to have their SafeSport certification. In 2019, the U.S. Center for SafeSport updated their requirements, noting that team players turning 18 during the season effectively become an adult. As a result, they would need to be certified because they would then be adults potentially alone with minors (those under the age of 18). For this reason, any player who is 17 years of age prior to December 31 of the year which the season is being played is required to take the SafeSport Certification.

With the April 2020 update, the U. S. Center for SafeSport has changed and requires the certification annually. The initial core certification is a longer course, while the refresher course, which can be taken to renew certification, is not as lengthy as the initial course.

For student athletes, there are courses available based on age group—preschool, K-2, 3-5, Middle School, and High School—which are designed as an introduction for the young athletes and their parents to understand the importance of a positive environment for sports where bully and misconduct is less likely to happen, but also how and where to report it, should it happen. These courses are voluntary, and not required in any way, but available as a resource. They are not able to be used to replace the core training needed for certification.

#### How to take the SafeSport Certification

1.	•	if your player needs to have their certification for SafeSport.
	Will your pla	yer reach the age of 17 on or before December 31, 2023?
	No	He/she does not need certified, and nothing further is required. However, there are voluntary courses available online based on age-group if parents or the athlete wish to take them. Proceed only if you want your player to take the voluntary course.
	Yes	He/she needs certified before being rostered with any team—high school, travel, or rec.





5. Click the link "CLICK HERE FOR U.S. CENTER FOR SAFESPORT TRAINING."






# USA HOCKEY SAFESPORT CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS
