

New Rule Updates for 2025

- MYAS/Gopher State Baseball will not be utilizing rule 1-6-2 from the NFHS Rule Book, therefore one-way electronic communication devices are not permitted from the dugout to the catcher while the team is on defense for the purposes of calling pitches.
- Head First Slides at Home Plate Players are allowed to slide headfirst at all bases, including home plate at all ages.
- Curveballs Curve balls are allowed at both the 12u and 13u age levels.
- Extra Innings If a game is tied and time allows, teams are required to play extra innings for any Gopher State Baseball League game.(This was new 2024)

- ① Represent our community and organization with class.




Key Dates




