

KMIC COVID-19 RE-OPENING PLAN

JUNE 28TH, 2020

The Kettle Moraine Ice Center is committed to providing ice for our user groups, while simultaneously adhering to the CDC and Washington County Health Department recommendations and guidelines. For everyone's safety, we ask that you take extra precautions before entering the Kettle Moraine Ice Center.

These rules and procedures will be in affect from July 31st – September 4th and can be subject to change immediately by Kettle Moraine Ice Center Management:

- If you are sick, do not enter the building and social distance from anyone you know that has been in the facility.
- Wash your hands frequently.
- Utilize the hand sanitizer stations that will be added in the building.
- Only one parent is permitted into the Kettle Moraine Ice Center at a time to limit the number of customers into the facility at one time.

Scheduling & Facility Ammenities

1. There will be no public skate scheduled until further notice.
2. Concessions will not be available until further notice.

Traffic Control Procedures

1. No locker room access will be permitted for youth hockey and figure skating programs. We highly recommend skaters come as fully dressed as possible for all on ice activities. Adult hockey participants will be assigned locker rooms but will not be permitted to use the locker room bathrooms or showers.
2. The upper and lower lobbies of the Kettle Moraine Ice Center will act as staging areas for on ice participants to get dressed. Parents/Guardians will not be allowed onto the bleacher area in order to limit the amount of cleaning required by KMIC staff.
3. The Kettle Moraine Ice Center master schedule will assign user groups to enter/exit specific lobby areas in order to limit contact with other user groups. Parents/Guardians will be required to stay in those assigned lobby areas while their skaters are on the ice. Please practice social distancing while waiting in your assigned lobby area.

Cleaning Procedures

1. Kettle Moraine Ice Center staff will be required to wipe down all common contact points in each staging area in between user groups. They will also be required to routinely disinfect all door handles, floors, and chairs.
2. Locker room benches as well as door handles will be cleaned after each adult user group. Please note locker room bathrooms and showers will not be available until further notice.
3. The Kettle Moraine Ice Center has contracted Sanisport of Wisconsin to routinely disinfect all rental equipment after being used for youth hockey programming, as well as locker rooms and all common areas in the facility.
4. Social distancing signs will be placed in all areas used by customers.

5. Hand sanitizing stations will be available in both lobbies and all locker rooms. Please use them as much as needed.
6. Kettle Moraine Ice Center staff will have authorization to take random temperature checks if deemed necessary by management.
7. Skaters will be required to bring their own water bottle labeled with their last name.

UPDATE 8/1/2020:

Per Governor Evers' Executive Order 82, declaring a public health emergency, and corresponding Emergency Order 1 requiring face coverings in the state of Wisconsin, the Kettle Moraine Ice Center and Washington County Youth Hockey Association will begin requiring face coverings for individuals 5 and older inside our facilities beginning Saturday, August 1.

Do I need to wear a face covering when I exercise?

Per the executive order it depends on where you are exercising. You do not need to wear a face covering if you are exercising in a private residence or outdoors. For example, you do not need to wear a mask if you are riding your bike on a trail. But you do need to wear a face covering if you are exercising indoors or in an enclosed space and other people are present, such as a gym, or studio.

Face coverings may be temporarily removed during the following situations:

- When you are eating or drinking
- When you are communicating with someone who is deaf or hard of hearing and you cannot communicate while wearing a mask.
- While in pool/whirlpool
- Working as a lifeguard or group fitness /swim instructor
- While you are showering
- While you are changing clothes

We understand that some people will not be wearing a mask in the facility due to some of the exemptions in the executive order and/or underlying conditions and we will respect the privacy of our members by not questioning them. I hope this helps you make a decision regarding continuing to utilize the facility in a way that you feel is healthy.
