

A LOOK BACK... Oct. 19, 2019

The Previous Meeting

Playing at the home of the Princeton Vikings the 1988 State Runners-up to the Wildcats, against the 1989 State Runners-up in Moeller, the Wildcats showed ferocity out of the starting gate. The Cats showed no signs of weariness from the travel, clawing their way to No. 9 in the Joe Eitel computer rankings with a win, just 0.3097 behind No. 8 Cleveland Heights.

From the opening drive, the Saint Ignatius defense played smashmouth, hard-nosed football.

The Wildcats' offense came alive on its second drive. On a 3rd and long, Griffin Hanna '20 rolled out of the pocket. Looking for options on the nearside, Hanna saw Henry Cook '20 come open. Hanna lofted a perfect pass over the arms of the defensive back and into Henry Cook's hands. The senior wideout did the rest, galloping untouched for the opening score, 65 yards in all.

The Saint Ignatius quickstrike offense pulled out another trick after a quick Moeller three-and-out. On the first play of the drive, Cook came open again. The star athlete caught Moeller in a zone coverage with a slant across the middle. Once Hanna got him the ball, Cook jetted through the defense and all the way to the end zone for a 56-yard score. In the blink of an eye, the Wildcats held a 21-0 lead.

Entering the break, the Wildcats held a commanding 28-7 lead.

The running clock began midway through the fourth quarter. A couple of Hanna passes and a dose of James Crosby '20 pushed the Wildcats ahead.

"They're a good program, they'll be back," Kyle says. "Last year, they won the GCL. They've got some young kids coming up who will be good."

Looking at the stats, the Wildcats dominated in all aspects. Hanna tallied 296 passing yards vs. just 27 for Moeller. Led by Welcsh's 17-carry, 75-yard day, the Wildcats outgained the Crusaders on the ground, 109-70. Take away White's 55-yard TD, and Moeller gained just 42 yards on 38 plays.

Wildcats Storylines ...

THE MATCHUP: This will be the 11th all-time meeting between the Wildcats and Crusaders. Saint Ignatius owns an 8-2 advantage over Archbishop Moeller. The Cats won the previous match-up 38-7 in 2019. The two programs did not see each other in 2020 due to the shortened season. There is history between these two programs as they have met twice in the state championship game; coach Chuck Kyle '69 and the Wildcats have won two championships against the Crusaders, one in 1989 and the other in 1993. Moeller comes into this match-up 5-2 after dropping an overtime thriller to Cincinnati Elder, 59-58. Saint Ignatius comes off a 19-14 loss to St. Edward a week ago.

STREAK ENDS: Marty Lenehan's six-game touchdown streak ended last Saturday night as the Eagles kept him out of the endzone. Despite not finding paydirt, Lenehan was terrific in the ground and pound in the rain carrying the rock 19 times for 87 yards. The Wildcats will look to get the ground game going early vs. the Crusaders.

MAX SPEED: The track and field star Max Muresan showed off his big-play ability vs. St. Edward on Saturday. The senior caught a pass on a quick hitch route from Pierce Spencer and went 69-yards for the score evading the Eagles' secondary. The offense is looking for a balance between the run and pass and Muresan's quick-strike ability may be essential for the Wildcats in the back half of the regular season.

TRENCH FIGHT: Last week's game vs. St. Edward was a battle in the trenches that saw the Wildcats leave everything on the field. The Cats stopped the Eagles on a fourth and short two times in the ball game. Great plays made by Thomas Wasinski, Christopher Aerni, Peter Chalhoub and many others kept Saint Ignatius in the ball game. The defensive line has been phenomenal all season long and d-line coaches Dave Cicetti and Mark Sullivan must be grinning ear to ear on how well their student-athletes have performed this season.

STRONG SECONDARY: Playing a high octane offense such as St. Edward, you'd expect big plays made downfield from the arm of Christian Ramos. However, the Wildcat secondary was masterful in limiting the passing game for Ramos. Seniors Jack Mangan and Griffin Taliak both recorded picks to halt the Eagles' offense. Franklin Pike and AJ Spellacy offered significant support in limiting the pass. Pike was also used on a corner blitz and sacked Ramos for a four-yard loss in the second half. Despite the loss, the Wildcat secondary held Ramos to 11-21 passing for 124 yards. The secondary will look to continue to make life hard for the Moeller passing game on Saturday.

WEATHER CONDITIONS: The rain began to fall at a steady pace halfway through the second quarter vs. St. Edward. The weather appeared to affect both offenses as neither side could develop a rhythm. The rain turned from a drizzle to a downpour. Despite the rain, Eldridge put the Eagles in challenging positions with his punts as he would average 31.8 yards per punt in the rain. Eldrige went 0-2 on field goals; however, it did appear that his field goal in the second quarter went through the uprights but was called no good on the field.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN: The captains for the 2021 season are #22 Marty Lenehan, #34 Christopher Aerni, #95 Peter Chalhoub and #99 Thomas Wasinski.

Learning about the Crusaders ...

NOAH'S ARM: The signal-caller for the Crusaders is senior Noah Geselbracht. Geselbracht has lit up the field with his arm this season as he has totaled 1,483 yards through the air (leading the Greater Catholic League South), completing 67% of his passes. He has also thrown for 18 touchdowns on the year. Geselbracht threw for 426 yards and six touchdowns in the overtime loss to Cincinnati Elder last week. The Wildcat secondary will be busy in week eight, limiting the Moeller pass game.

SHARE THE WEALTH: Arguably the favorite target for Gesel-bracht this season is junior Tennel Bryant. Bryant has been the recipient of nine touchdown receptions this season from Geselbracht. Coming into week eight, Bryant has 41 receptions for 445 yards. A week ago against Cincinnati Elder, Bryant racked up 12 receptions for 175 yards and three touchdowns. Bryant leads Moeller in points with 60 on the season. Other favorite targets of Geselbracht are Jared Merk, Kurt Thompson, Josh Kattus and Brandon White. White is a University of Kentucky commit with lightning-quick ability as a receiver and kick returner.

ONE-TWO PUNCH: Archbishop Moeller rolls out a balanced offense that can succeed by air and through the ground. The duo backfield of Jordan Marshall and Alec Weeder can make life difficult for any defense. Marshall this season has carried the football 70 times for 458 yards and five touchdowns, while Weeder has 54 carries for 313 yards and four touchdowns. Weeder would score in the overtime period vs. the Panthers last week to keep the Crusaders in the ball game; however, the PAT would be blocked and Moeller would fall 58-59.

GINNETTI'S DEFENSE: The leader on the Crusader defense is junior middle linebacker, Joseph Ginnetti. Ginnetti leads all Moeller tacklers with 60 on the season. Ginnetti comes into week eight with an interception streak of two games, coming away with picks from La Salle and Elder. The middle linebacker always needs to be identified on the field and Ginnetti is a player that the Wildcat offense must be aware of each play.

CHASING THE QB: Senior defensive end Chase Brown leads the GCL in sacks this season with four. The 6'3" 220 lbs edge rusher had a fantastic performance last Saturday against Elder as he got after the quarterback twice and forced a fumble on the Panthers. Brown will go up against Saint Ignatius' Brian Keane and Ashton Montgomery. Brandon Martin comes in second on the team with sacks at three. Jack Sellers is third in sacks as he has two on the season coming from his defensive back position.

DB FRANKLIN PIKE '21



Franklin Pike is a fundamentally sound player for defensive coordinator Ryan Franzinger's '02 defense.

Pike is a player that worked hard during the off-season to get where he is today as a starting cornerback for the Wildcats. The senior was terrific in last week's game vs. St. Edward, along with his teammates, in allowing just 124 yards through the air.

Pike recorded his first sack of the season on a corner blitz and was able to take Christian Ramos down from the blindside to stall a St. Edward possession.

Pike is a difficult player to beat in one-on-one coverage, and it appears he gets stronger with every performance. Pike will be a crucial player to watch against a Moeller offense that scored 58 points last week on the road vs. Cincinnati Elder.

GAME PREVIEW

WILDCATS LOOK TO CLEAN UP UNFORCED ERRORS VS. CRUSADERS

The Wildcats' four-game winning streak ended last week as they fell to St. Edward 19-14. The weather conditions became difficult near the end of the first half as the rain began to fall. Head Football Coach Chuck Kyle '69 knows that the team had its chances in the ball game and just fell short.

"We missed a couple of field goals, had a penalty after a big play to bring us back," says Kyle. "You look back on certain plays and that is just a part of the game. There were some positive takeaways, we had our opportunities, but life goes on."

The offense totaled 200 yards in a downpour as Lenehan led the way with 19 carries for 87 yards; however, the senior's streak of recording a touchdown ended. The Cats now look ahead to week eight to take on the Archbishop Moeller Crusaders on the road at Norwood Shea Stadium.

SAINT IGNATIUS OFFENSE VS. ARCHBISHOP MOELLER DEFENSE

Coming into week eight, Saint Ignatius will look to clean up unforced errors that plagued them against St. Edward. The Cats threw two interceptions, including a costly pick-six in the second quarter to give early momentum to the Eagles.

The silver lining of the night for the Wildcats offense was a 69-yard touchdown reception from Pierce Spencer to Max Muresan. Muresan is a track and field star on coach Kyle's team and demonstrated his quick-strike ability on the football field for his first varsity touchdown last Saturday.

"His speed is important; if there is one thing that the offense needs to do to go far in the playoffs is hit plays such as that one," explains Kyle. "Our run game has been great, but we have to hit the bigger pass plays when they are available. That is where we need to work and improve."

The Cats may run a two-quarterback combo in week eight, shown last week vs. St. Edward with Spencer and receiver Patrick Tompkins. Tompkins was used for the wildcat formation but threw the ball nine times, showing that he can be more than just a wildcat quarterback.

Defensively for the Archbishop Moeller Crusaders, they are led off the edge by Chase Brown. Brown, this season has totaled four sacks and collecting 17 total tackles and forcing a fumble. In the linebacking core is Joseph Ginnetti, who leads through his middle linebacker spot. Ginnetti leads the defense in tackles with 60 total; he also causes havoc through the air with two interceptions on the season.

"They will shuffle from a 4-3 to 3-4 look on the defense, so we have to be aware of that," emphasizes Kyle. "They have blitz packages they go to often where they will run an overload blitz; that is a challenge. They are an excellent football team."

The defense for the Crusaders is eager to come back out onto the football field after finding themselves in a barn burner of a game against Cincinnati Elder, where they lost in overtime. The Moeller defense allows the most points in the four-team Greater Catholic League South, allowing 25 points per game. The Wildcat offense will seek to have success to get themselves back in the win column; expect a heavy dose of Spencer and Tompkins at the quarterback role.

SAINT IGNATIUS DEFENSE VS. ARCHBISHOP MOELLER OFFENSE

Despite the struggles by the Saint Ignatius offense, the defense put on a tremendous performance against St. Edward in the rain. The Eagles would go 0-3 on fourth down conversions, giving the ball back to the offense. Great play on the interior from Christopher Aerni and the defensive line through St. Edward off their rhythm.

The defense this season for the Wildcats continues to limit opponents and give the team the best chance to win. They will be going up against another high-powered offense in week eight as they take on Moeller.

Quarterback Noah Geselbracht leads Moeller. Geselbracht has thrown for 1,483 yards and 18 touchdowns while completing 67% of his passes. The Crusaders have the prominent strike ability and coach Kyle understands what it will take to slow them down.

"They have a couple of running backs that are big-play guys; they are sprinters on their track team so they can run the distance," Kyle explains. "Offensively, they have a lot of different formations, so we have to read our keys carefully."

The run game for the Crusaders is led by the duo backs of Jordan Marshall and Alec Weeder. Marshall this season has rushed for 458 yards on 70 carries, while Weeder has 313 yards on 54 carries. Both combined have nine touchdowns on the ground. Moeller averages 130.1 yards per game on the ground, which opens up the passing game for Geselbracht. The Crusaders are averaging 287.9 yards through the air per game, which is the most in the GCL South.

Through this season, the Saint Ignatius defense has been able to limit the quick strike from an opponent's offense; they will need to be ready for the versatile offense of the Crusaders in week eight.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Zeb Eldridge was 0-2 on field goal kicks in the harsh rain condition Saturday vs. St. Edward. Both times he had the distance but missed one just to the left and the other just to the right. Eldridge has been masterful in the kicking game despite the two misses, showing why he is a top 50 kicker and punter in the country.

Archbishop Moeller's kicker is William Steele. Steele this season is 4-of-6 when kicking, with 42 yards being his longest kick on the season. However, an extra point elevated Elder to a victory in overtime against their Cincinnati rivals as they would block Steele's PAT to secure a 59-58 win.

Doing the punting duties for the Crusaders will be Kurt Thompson. Thompson averages just under 40 yards per punt this season, pinning opponents inside their 20 yard-line twice.

The special teams game is essential for both programs and may determine who comes out victorious on Saturday afternoon.

The Wildcats and Crusaders will kick off from Norwood Shea Stadium at 4 p.m. Saint Ignatius will be traveling in the morning from Cleveland; it will be interesting to see how the long drive to Cincinnati will affect the Wildcats on Saturday. No matter the case, the Cats are eager to get back out on the field and get back into the win column.

Wildcat Mistakes Give Eagles Path to Victory

LAKEWOOD - The Saint Ignatius Wildcats and the St. Edward Eagles faced off for the 61st time in program history. The Wildcats vs. Eagles rivalry is storied and filled with many classic games. Entering Saturday's matchup, the Wildcats had the all-time advantage between the two schools with a record of 32-27-1. However, this time the highly-ranked Eagles came away, beating the red hot Wildcats by a final score of 19-14. St. Edward won the toss and elected to differ, so the Wildcats began the game on offense. The Cats would quickly punt on a three and out. After the punt, the Eagles' offense looked strong as they drove down the field. Then, Christan Ramos' pass was intercepted by senior Jack Mangan at the 13-yard line. Mangan's pick was his third on the season, which leads the

The offensive possession for the Eagles was short; the Wildcat defense was able to bring up a fourth and one before a false start call forced Saint Edward to punt. The Eagles caught a break as the punt was short and hit Joe Norris on the way down. The Eagles picked up the ball and got the ball back with excellent field position at the Wildcat 39-yard line. Then, Ramos tossed a perfect back-shoulder 36-yard touchdown to Rayshawn Manning on just the second play of the drive. The touchdown was the game's first points for either side and gave the Eagles a six-point lead. The following extra point was wide left and the score remained 6-0.

On the first play of the next drive for the Wildcats, Spencer's pass was tipped at the line of scrimmage and fell into the hands of Jack Riley, who returned it 35 yards for a touchdown. The touchdown and a failed two-point conversation extended the Saint Edward lead 12-0.

The Wildcats were guick to strike back as senior Griffin Taliak intercepted Ramos at the 18-yard line. It was the second and final time the Cats intercepted Ramos. Then, even with the ball back and some momentum, the Wildcat offense could not move the ball. However, the Cats did catch a break as the Eagles were called for a personal foul after running into Eldridge on the punt.

The penalty gave the Wildcat offense a second chance and they capitalized. On the very first play of the drive, Spencer threw a check-down to Max Muresan, a star on Coach Chuck Kyle's '69 Track and Field team, who ran it 69-yards for the Cats' first touchdown of the game.

The third quarter saw a lot of strong defensive play as neither offense could get it going. St. Edward received the opening kickoff in the second half and their first drive was halted thanks to a big fourth-down tackle by Aerni. The Wildcats tried their hand with a trick play following the stop, putting Patrick Tompkins at quarterback. The bold move did not work for the Cats and Eldridge pinned the Eagles deep inside their territory at the four-yard line. Several plays later, with rain beginning to fall, Ramos fumbled and recovered the snap. The near turnover brought up a third and 16, where Taliak tipped the ball away with excellent coverage. Then, on the first play of the fourth quarter, Enovitch ran for a 29-yard pickup, which set up a Ramos touchdown pass into the hands of Jackson Miller. Ramos' second touchdown pass of the game and the following extra point made it 19-7. Another Lenehan run, failed to pick up the first down at the four-yard line, which resulted in a turnover-on-downs. The Eagles would then take over and run the ball to burn time off the clock. The Wildcat defense would eventually force a fourth and four. The Eagles chose to punt and the punt was blocked by AJ Spellacy and recovered and returned for a touchdown by Norris. The special team's touchdown and Eldridge's extra point made it a 19-14 game with the last hope for the Cats to be an onside kick with 28 seconds left. The Wildcats nearly recovered Eldridge's onside attempt but ultimately ended up in the hands of the Eagles, who proceeded to take a knee and close out the game. The final score was 19-14 with the Eagles on top of the Wildcats.
