From Jerry Petitgoue, Executive Director

**WBCA Executive Board "Zoom" Meeting January 12, 2025**

The meeting was called to order by Jerry Petitgoue, Executive Director.

Attendance was taken by Joan Petitgoue and Jay Benish. Those absent were: Lance Marifke, Scott Emerich, Luke Francois, Mike Flanagan and David Royston.

Recognition: Dave Lindow, New Grade/Jr. High Rep; Ryan Walz, New Private School Rep; Andy Banasik, New AD Rep; Chris Zwettler, Coaching Game 1,000; Kate Abiad, Pendant Sent for Service; Kaleen McGettigan, 200 Wins; Cliff Thompson, Board and Student Legacy Award Update; Randy Storlie, Special Needs Scholarship Update; Jay Benish, Tribute Award Update on Junior Bridgeman and David Gruber; Board Member HOF Inductees 2025, Todd Fergot and Jack Hervet.

Financial Report for Showcase, Hall of Fame Banquet, Youth Clinics and Fall Clinic were discussed which had been emailed to the board. There was also a current financial report which included e-mails and mailings through the Accounting Firm of JT and Associates.

A report was given from Dan Burreson, Niki Sutter and Joan Petitgoue concerning the HOF Banquet and inductees for 2025. The event will take place with 30 new inductees on Sunday, September 28<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 in the Sandstone Ballroom of Glacier Canyon Lodge of the Wilderness Resort in Wisconsin Dells. A complete list of all inductees was previously emailed to all executive board members.

Joan Petitgoue reported that the All-State Banquet will be held at Glacier Canyon Lodge of the Wilderness Resort in Wisconsin Dells on Sunday, April 27<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 p.m. Niki Sutter and Lora Staveness are coordinating plans for a speaker TBA. Travis Wilson will work with committee on selection and with Joan on banquet tickets.

Jeff Boos will chair the boys and Kim Weber the girls for the Jerry Petitgoue Invite. The committees will work to promote these events which will take place Tuesday, July 15<sup>th</sup> for the girls and Wednesday, July 16<sup>th</sup> for the boys at the JAG in Wisconsin Dells.

June Jam Update: Tom Andres said that the girls' schedule is June 12-13 with 55 teams (hopefully more this year) and the boys' schedule is June 21-22 with 112 teams hopeful. He and his committee will be working on appropriate schedules and he will need 6 volunteers to help with each of the sessions. More information will be forthcoming soon.

Expansion of the state tournament: Todd stated that 90% of the coaches are in favor of the expansion. He and the committee will continue to move forward with the process. They will also continue to move forward with the shot clock and starting in spring there will be progress in all areas of the contact days.

Girls' All-Star Games-Girls: Loren Homb stated that the date set for the girls' all-star week is June 23-25 at the JAG in the Dells as in the past and that he has 90% of his coaches already in place. The nominations forms will be out and the girls will be staying at the Chula Vista Resort.

Boys' All-Star Games-Boys: Mike Huser stated that the boys week will be June 24-26 at the JAG in the Dells. He stated that they will be finalizing their coaches' list within the next week. The players will be chosen the first week in April. Matt McGraw said that the 3-pt. contest will run the same as last year.

All-Star Entertainment: Jim Scheidler stated that the Spirit Squad will again perform this year as well as the Rim Rockers and we may try to add some pep bands. The spirit squad will pay for their rooms and transportation and Jim and Dave Royston will set up a schedule for their performances.

Showcase Camp-Boys: Lee Rabas will work with his committee to move forward with this.

Showcase Camp-Girls: Jack Hervert will work with his committee to try and get numbers to work with for this event.

Newsletter: Jake Erbentraut will continue to format this. We will move from 4 to 3 newsletters per year at this point.

Elections: Dennis Uppena said that the following positions will be up for reelection at our next election. They are: D4-Girls; College Rep-Men; College Rep-Women; Milwaukee City Rep; Madison City Rep; Green Bay Rep.

Mr. Basketball and Miss Basketball: Dennis Uppena and Niki Sutter both stated that they will have their categories narrowed to 6 by January 26<sup>th</sup> and will vote on the final candidate in March.

National Convention: Ken Barrett will attend the convention to represent Wisconsin in Savannah, Georgia from July 8-11. He stated that the John Wooden Award winners for Wisconsin have been chosen. They are Win Parkinson (Boys) and Jim Myers (Girls).

Photography Update: Jim Jones continues to ask if anyone wants to volunteer to assist him with group pictures events such as the HOF Banquet. He would like to change the photos area for pictures at the All-State Banquet and move it to the back away from the dark corner in which the plaques are received.

Corporate Sponsors: M3 Insurance Company of Madison has donated \$5,000 to be used for the boys' hospitality room. American Family Insurance may improve their donation. The Bucks will provide a "Suite" at a game as a prize for the all-star fundraising initiative.

Girls' Basketball Solutions: Jon Nedelcoff sent out a document from the meeting to create a toolbox for information. Please let anyone know how to sustain and improve programs.

Milwaukee Clinic: Lance Marifke will again head up this event and welcomes any comments for improvement.

Hospitality Rooms: The hospitality room for both the girls' and boys' events will remain similar to last year. Only one family guest will be allowed with each member.

Membership: Travis Wilson stated that membership will increase as we get nearer to the awards season. Bobbi Kelsey will work with the MPS schools. Academic All-State will be based on work through the first semester. The All-Star nominations will be out this week. Special Awards such as 1<sup>st</sup> Team Award and the Tom Andres Academic Award will be put online for member coaches.

WIAA Report: (Lavar Ridgeway) stated that the WIAA will be everything as in the past to assist in the June Jam event. They will continue to assist, when they can, on issues involving the shot clock, expansion of the state tournament and contact days. (Melissa Gehring) said that they are very concerned that there are 6,000 less girls participating in sports. She also said that the Advisory Committee will meet on April 16<sup>th</sup> and the Athletic Directors on April 19<sup>th</sup>.

Motion to adjourn: A motion was made by Terry Erickson and seconded by Dennis Semrau to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried unanimously.

## **Youth Sports Parents: Five perspectives from a dad, noted author**

There was an article recently published in the USA Today that was forwarded to me. Stephen Borelli interviewed Jeff Nelligen, author of the book *Four Lessons From My Three Sons: How You Can Raise Resilient Kids*. He says he attended about 2,300 of his sons' games over a 22-year span. He mentioned that he would intentionally show up in a suit and tie. His reasoning was that he knew the dedication and commitment the team put into the game, "So when I show up dressed up nicely, it's my way of showing you and your team the respect you deserve." While he admits it was "way out there," he was trying to instill a gesture to his boys and qualities

that you earn including respect, confidence, motivation, and self-satisfaction. He also expounded on the perspective of being a parent saying, “Our job is not just to build a relationship with our kids. We already have that. It’s to help them build a relationship with the world.” And sports play a huge role for kids, in his opinion. He says that sports play a critical role in self-discovery: What they like and dislike; how they fit in; and how they ultimately conduct themselves. Nelligen encouraged parents to take five distinct perspectives:

1. **Enjoy yourself: Let your kids see you more than hear you at games.** Your connection is a signal of the commitment you have to one another to experience this sports journey together. He says, yes, blowout losses or the moments when your kid doesn’t play well can be stressful. But seeing everything unfold, and how your kid handles it, can be one of the true rewards of kid’s sports.
2. **Your kid doesn’t have to be the star to reap the full benefits of sports.** Nelligen explains, “Sometimes we push kids into sports, or other activities, with unrealistic expectations.” Instead, he suggests the kids allow them to figure out their roles for themselves.
3. **‘It’s the end of the world’: Your kid will learn way more from a loss than he or she will from a win.** The author stated that with losses, your kids become more resilient. Losses are uncomfortable and are necessary. “Nothing is ever as bad as it seems,” he writes in his book. “Everyone has tough times and there are only three choices: Lie to yourself, wallow in self-pity or drive forward.”
4. **Try using humor instead of a lecture.** “If you aren’t baggin’, you aren’t mowin’,” came out of the boys watching their father meticulously bag grass clippings while mowing the yard. The words offered the lesson of seeing things through to the end. Humor is the operative factor in reaching a kid,” Nelligen writes. “Humor *a/ways* triumphs. No kid responds to lectures but kids respond to a gag, a one-liner, a quip.”
5. **Setting the example: Our basic conduct requires no skill.** We sometimes find ourselves on a team where we might not like everyone, or the coach, but, as Nelligen says, we force ourselves to get along with everyone to ensure the overall success of the unit. Doing so takes effort. Nelligen has ensured all three of his sons, who went on to serve in the military (two out of the Naval Academy and West Point and one out of Williams College), lived by those principles. But so has he. “Watching them out on the field or basketball court or wrestling mat or (in) a swimming pool provided basic joy,” he wrote in his book. “All I had do was show up – how hard was that?”

What an interesting perspective and one that everyone can benefit from?

## **The Value of Postgame Feedback**

It is common practice for officials to understand the importance of conducting a detailed pregame meeting, no matter how familiar officials are with each other. Successful officials are known for their attention to detail in pregame discussions and live by the credo, “*The day begins*”

*the night before.*” These respected officials avoid on-court problems knowing that the game begins well before the tipoff.

But while the game may be finished when the final buzzer sounds, officials need to know that a postgame discussion is a valuable component in an attempt to take their game to the next level. These meetings are expected as you move into the College level of officiating. In my view, postgame meetings should occur at every level of officiating. Honest feedback will only serve to strengthen your game.

If boundary lines are not clearly drawn, postgame feedback can create a toxic environment. It should not be an opportunity of blow off steam or get something off of your chest. Dialogue needs to be delivered in a positive and respectful tone. The conversation needs to frame around non-threatening questions. Here are some guidelines to follow.

1. Reflect on the entire game and quality of both calls and non-calls.
2. Discuss any calls that were challenging or controversial. Remember that all calls need to be defensible on tape after the game.
3. Discuss what went well during the game emphasizing both double and cadence whistles.
4. Discuss ways to take the game to an even higher level for the next contest.
5. Discuss any rules or enforcements that may need clarity.

These questions will allow for a smooth transition into identifying any rulings or court coverage issues that many have sparked some controversy or confusion. It will also serve to strengthen rules knowledge and game mechanics for your next assignment.

Finally, it is important that you conclude a postgame meeting on a good note to ensure that you leave the locker room with positive feelings about the game. On the way home, I trust that you will spend a great deal of time reflecting, revisiting and re-evaluating your game. This will lead to having a “*season of significance.*”


## Book Bits

### Running the Show by Dick Devenzio


Devenzio was an All-American at Duke and played professionally. He later created the Point Guard College (PGC) Basketball Camps, which are popular today. In *Running the Show*, Coach Devenzio gives advice on a variety of basketball related topics to both players and coaches.

- Good coaches are good because they realize they can't get things done themselves or by begging. You have to form a partnership with your top players.
- As a good coach, I think you have to have control of the three major aspects of offense: shooting, passing, and dribbling. On defense, you have to make sure that your team is truly working to make it difficult for the other team to score, and you need players that have the right approach to playing and practicing the game.
- A good coach needs to have a list of game and non-game stuff and who has responsibility for assuring that each aspect is handled.
- Your drills have to be structured in such a way that people win and lose constantly.
- I like all of my players to know how much playing time they have earned, and I like all of my players to know that the playing time they have earned is exactly the playing time they will get.
- Spend 5 percent maximum talking to referees during the game and 95 percent talking to your players.


