EVENT RULES

Hot Shot Competition

- This will be for grades 3-8 Only
- The Hot Shot preliminary round will be held by each team at a practice designated by their coach in order to get their top scorer. That player then advances to shoot during Husky Havoc on December 1st
- There are 6 spots kids can shoot from. Scoring is as follows:
 - o A layup on either side is worth 1 point...the hash mark below either elbow is worth 2 points, free throw is worth 3 points, and a shot from the top of the key is worth 5 points.
- Shooters have 1 minute to make as many baskets as they can. The shooter can shoot from any of the spots he wants as many times as he wants in that one minute.
 - o If a shot is made the shooter gets that point value for the shot. Hence if it is a lay-up the shooter gets one point...if the shooter makes a three from the top of the key it is worth 5.
- Shooter only gets one ball and gets his own rebounds.
- Coaches will do all the scoring.

3 Point Competition:

- This will be for grades 9-12 only.
- The three-point preliminary round will be held by each team at a practice designated by their coach.
- Top two 9th graders advance, top two B-squad shooters advance, & the top 4 varsity kids move on.
- Preliminary Round Rules:
 - o 1 minute timed shooting from one spot (of player's choice outside the arc). Player may move to a different spot if he chooses as long as it is outside the arc.
 - o Minimum group of 4 players at a basket (three+ rebounders and one shooter).
 - o 3 basketballs must be available for each shooter/basket (no more than 3).
- Final round to be done the night of Husky Havoc.

OHS & OBA Inter-squad Scrimmages:

- All players are invited to play during their respective time.
- Whoever shows up to play for their grade will be placed on one of two teams once at the event (they will NOT be kept on their OBA team). Coaches will do their best to separate the teams evenly.
- OBA kids wear your OBA uniform & high school kids will wear their practice gear.
- We would like to see the OBA coaches in attendance to coach and run their teams. If not, someone on our high school staff will gladly fill in if needed.
- Players will be announced for each team and have them come out to half court (similar to starting line-ups). The clock will then start and run for 15 minutes or however much time is left on their allotted 20 minutes. The more organized and early the players and coaches are...the more time on the court the kids will have. Coaches will do their best to ensure all kids get as close to equal playing time.
 - o I would suggest players should be there a minimum of 15-20 minutes prior to their scheduled game time.
