BIRDS OF PREY 2024

The 2024 Stifel Birds of Prey World Cup will take place at Beaver Creek Mountain in Colorado from December 6-15, 2024. The event will feature men's and women's alpine skiing, including downhill, super-G, and giant slalom races. The event will also include: live music, beer tastings, ski films, parties, and sponsor activations. The 2024 eve will be the first time men and women have raced together at Beaver Creek since the 2015 Alpine World Ski Championships.

Women's competitions: December, 14th & 15th

Men's competitions: December, 6th, 7th & 8th.

FALL IN VAIL FLOYD HILL PROJECT

A major multiyear infrastructure project on Interstate 70 is set to enter its next phase this fall.

Dubbed the Floyd Hill project, which could be completed by late 2028, seeks to add a new westbound toll lane, build an extended on-ramp from U.S. Highway 6 onto eastbound I-70 and reorient a roughly 1-mile stretch of east and westbound highway with a completely new section of road. It also calls for straightening existing curves to improve motorists' sight, rebuilding damaged bridges, enhancing wildlife connectivity and installing two permanent air quality monitors.

The project started after Labor Day and will run Monday through Thursday between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Traffic will likely be stopped six times per day on average during operations and motorists should be prepared for traffic holds every 60 to 75 minutes.
