CODE OF ETHICS

Preamble

One of the distinguishing characteristics of a profession in education may be that its members are cognizant of, and perhaps dedicated to, rendering a service to humanity. As educators who choose to coach football, we must understand that the justification for football is that it provides educational and physical values for those who play the game, and the game essentially belongs to the players who choose to play it. The welfare of the game depends on how coaches live up to the spirit and letter of ethical conduct, and how coaches, as educators, model ethical conduct, and remain mindful of the trust and confidence placed in them by colleagues, players, and the public.

Purpose

This code of ethics has been developed to protect, promote, and preserve the best interests of the game and the coaching profession. Its primary purpose is to clarify and distinguish ethical and professional practices from those which are detrimental. Its secondary purpose is to emphasize the value of football as an experience that contributes to the overall education of the student-athlete and to stress proper functions in relation to schools, players, and the public.

Article One – Responsibility to Players

1. Coaches shall be aware of the tremendous influence they have on the education of the student-athlete; therefore, they shall never place the value of winning above the value of instilling the highest ideals of character and integrity.
2. Coaches shall follow or create and enforce a set of training rules for players that reflect the positive values of abstaining from drugs, alcohol, and tobacco.
3. Coaches shall never place the value of winning over the safety and welfare of players.
4. Coaches shall not exert pressure on faculty members to give players special consideration.
5. Coaches shall show respect to all players by treating them with integrity and honesty in both verbal and nonverbal behavior, regardless of their role or contribution to the team.
6. Coaches are responsible for their players' actions on the field and must not permit them to perform with the intent of causing injury to opposing players.
7. Coaches shall not seek unfair advantage by teaching deliberate unsportsmanlike behavior to players; they shall instruct players to play within the written rules and within the spirit of the game at all times.

Article Two – Professional Behavior

1. Coaches shall exemplify the highest moral character, behavior, and leadership.
2. Coaches shall display modesty in victory and be gracious in defeat.
3. Coaches shall promote ethical relationships among fellow coaches.
4. Prior to, and following contests, coaches for the competing teams should meet and exchange cordial greetings to set the correct tone for the event.

Article Three – Sportsmanship

1. Coaches shall exhibit, model, and teach good sportsmanship.
2. Coaches shall exert their influence to enhance sportsmanship by spectators, both directly and by working closely with cheerleaders, pep clubs, booster groups, parents, and administrators.

Article Four – Scouting

It is considered ethical to scout opponents only during games and agreed upon scrimmages, and within the designated rules of the conference or section by-laws. The head coach is responsible for the actions of his scouts.

Article Five – Relationships with Game Officials

Coaches shall respect the integrity and judgment of the game official. Coaches shall not indulge in conduct which would incite players or spectators against officials. Public criticism of officials is considered unethical.

Charles Adams, III

Minneapolis North



Charles was named the head football coach at Minneapolis North High School in August of 2010 and during his tenure has led his alma mater in a football resurgence. Charles had previous head coaching experience at the youth level with the Minneapolis Police Activities League and he Brooklyn Center Youth Football League.

A native of Minneapolis, Charles was a 4-year starter and All-Conference tight end at Minneapolis North playing for Mike Favor and Rufus Bess. He also played basketball and played golf for the Polars.

Charles has an Associate of Science degree in Law Enforcement from Minneapolis Community and Technical College. He has served as Minneapolis

police officer since 2003.

Before taking over the head coaching duties at North, Charles served as an assistant coach for four seasons, coaching the offensive line.

In his decade as the head football coach, Charles has been named the Section Coach of the Year 7 times, winning 7 Section titles and 7 District championships. He's led the Polars to Prep Bowl appearances in 2015, 2016 and 2019. In 2016 Coach Adams was named as the Minnesota Vikings High School Football Coach of the Year. He currently has 35 of his former players competing at the college level, including Tyler Johnson, the Gopher's All-Time leading pass receiver.

Charles resides in Minneapolis and is married to Andreaua and they have three children, Adrian, Anyla and Audria. In his free time he enjoys fishing, grilling and running summer youth camps in Minneapolis. He is quick to point out the biggest influence in his life – his father – Charles Adams II.

Charles' efforts to give back to his alma mater and his community make him a very deserving recipient of our Man of the Year Award.

Larry Herm — Foley HS/Bethel University



Larry was born in Chicago, Illinois and grew up in Toledo, Ohio. He returned to the suburbs of Chicago as a teenager where he participated in football, wrestling and track at Amos Alonzo Stagg High School. He attended Winona State University and obtained two Bachelor of Science Degrees; one in Physical Education and the other in School and Community Health while earning varsity letters in both football and wrestling. Larry later earned a Master's Degree in Physical Education at St. Cloud State University and became a Certified Strength and Conditioning Coach through

the National Strength and Conditioning Association. He taught in Foley for 36 years, beginning in 1982. Larry retired in 2016 and is now working at Bethel University. Larry has been involved with football as a player or as a coach for over 50 years. He has coached every level of football from 7th grade to college football for the past 39 years. Larry compiled a record of 157-109 while acting as the head football coach at Foley for 27 years. His football team earned a State title in 1998 with a 21-7 victory over Jackson County Central and a Final Four appearance in 2000. He was honored to coach the 1999 Outstate Metro All-Star football game. Larry coached wrestling for 31 years with dual teams in the state tournament twenty times, and assisted with State Titles in 1989, 1993, and 1994. He coached track from 1982-1989 and returned as a Strength Coach from 2012-2016 and assisted with the State title team in 2013. Larry is now an assistant strength and conditioning coach at Bethel University where he also serves as an assistant football coach working with receivers.

Larry has been married to Sue Herm for 39 years. She is a Professor of Nursing at St. Cloud State University. They have two married sons; Ryan and Joanna Herm live in Minnetonka. Eric and Blair Herm live in St. Louis Park.

In 2017 Larry was diagnosed with prostate cancer. He had the prostate removed and 3 months later it was determined that he had stage 4 prostate cancer. After a series of events and the help of Dave Nelson along with Randy and Roseann Shaver, Larry connected with Dr. Rao of the University of Minnesota.

A 2005 graduate of St. Cloud State with a degree in mass communications, Cosgrove was a standout defensive end for the Huskie football squad, earning All-Conference honors three times and being named to the National Football Coaches Association All-America Team in 2005.

Good will take over the head coaching duties at Redlands in the fall of 2021.

Bob Bostad – University of Wisconsin

Coach Bostad competed his fourth season as inside linebackers coach at Wisconsin in 2020, his second stint with the program he helped reach unprecedented offensive success during a six-year run that saw the Badgers claim a pair of Big Ten championships. Across his nine years on staff at UW, Bostad has directly coached 10 first-team All-Americans. A former college player at the position, Bostad began leading Wisconsin's inside linebackers in 2017 after spending the previous 27 years as an offensive coach. His first season on the defensive side was a success, with his linebackers contributing to a unit that was among the nation's best while leading the Badgers to a school-record 13 wins and Orange Bowl title. Bostad got his coaching start at his alma mater, UW-Stevens Point, where he coached the offensive line from 1990-91.

Collin Prosser – Minnesota State Mankato

Coach Prosser is the offensive line coach for the Mavericks and this past season they averaged over 6.0 yards per attempt, setting a school record with over 4200 yards rushing. Prosser was a member of the Wayne State College football team and was captain his senior year. He served two years as a graduate assistant at the University of South Dakota and four seasons with Morningside College. He returned to USD for two seasons before landing in Mankato. Collin and Heather have three sons – Colton, Camden and Brevin.

Matt Campbell – Iowa State University

Matt Campbell has changed the culture and his footprint is all over the success of the Iowa State football program since taking over as head coach prior to the 2016 season. Campbell, who owns the best winning percentage in school history, initiated his rebuilding plan and laid the foundation by imploring his team to "Trust The Process." His team listened, sparking Iowa State to one of its most fruitful periods in the history of the program. National rankings and bowl berths have become the norm thanks to Campbell's leadership. The three-time Big 12 Coach of the Year (2017, 2018, 2020) has led the Cyclones to four-straight bowl games, a school record, yearly appearances in the national rankings and the most wins in school history (32) over the last four seasons. In 2020, Campbell led the Cyclones to a first-place finish in the final Big 12 regular-season standings, a spot in the Big 12 Championship game and a New Year's Six bowl game, all program firsts. Campbell's recent four-year run at ISU has caught the nation's attention with its drastic improvement, placing Iowa State football into the national rankings and the college football spotlight. Iowa State has appeared in the College Football Playoff Rankings in each of the last four seasons, earning its highest ranking in school history at No. 6 in 2020.

Tom Allen – Indiana University

Coach Allen was the 2020 American Football Coaches Association National Coach of the Year, and his 24 wins are the most for an Indiana head football coach over his first four seasons. He was named the 2020 Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year (Big Ten coaches vote) and the Dave McClain Coach of the Year (Big Ten media vote). He received the 2020 Grant Teaff Coach of the Year from the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. Coach Allen became the third IU head coach to be named AFCA National Coach of the Year along with Bo McMillin (1945) and John Pont (1967). He joined Bill Mallory (1986 and 1987) as the only Hoosier head coaches to earn B1G Coach of the Year honors. Allen was also a finalist for the 2020 Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award, the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award, the Dodd Trophy, and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

Dave Doeren – North Carolina State University

Coach Doeren has been the head coach of the Wolfpack for nine seasons. Last fall his team posted an 8-4 record and earned the sixth bowl bid of his Wolfpack tenure. Their seven ACC victories was a new school record. He came to NC State after leading the program at Northern Illinois to its most successful two years in program history. His first Husky squad won the school's first Mid-American Conference Championship since 1983 and tied the school record with 11 wins. His second version repeated as league champions and set a new school record by posting 12 victories for the season and earned a trip to the Orange Bowl - the first BCS berth ever for a MAC school. Doeren and his wife, Sara, have three sons: Jacob, Luke and Connor.

Gary Fasching – St. John's

Gary Fasching started his coaching career in 1982 as an assistant coach at St. Cloud Cathedral. He would become head coach at Cathedral 4 years later and lead Cathedral to back to back State Championships in 1992 & 1993. In 1995, he joined John Gagliardi's staff at Saint John's as a defensive assistant and recruiting coordinator. In his 17 years as an assistant, Saint John's won 10 MIAC titles and made 12 NCAA appearances, winning the National Title in 2003. In 2013, Fasching replaced the legendary Gagliardi as Head Football Coach at Saint John's University. Fasching completed his 7th season in 2019, leading Saint John's to a 12-2 record and a berth in the NCAA Final Four. In his 7 years, at the helm, the Johnnies have won 3 MIAC conference championships, and have made 6 straight NCAA playoff appearances, tying a conference record held by his predecessor Gagliardi. Fasching has been named the MIAC Coach of the Year in 4 of the past 7 years and has an overall record of 70 – 14.

Tim Brewster – University of Florida

Coach Brewster just completed his first season directing the tight ends at Florida, coming to Gainesville after one season overseeing the tight ends at North Carolina. Brewster has spent over 30 years in coaching, most recently as the assistant head coach/tight ends coach at North Carolina. He was a collegiate head coach for four seasons, an NFL assistant coach for five seasons and an assistant coach at six different "Power 5" schools, including with Coach Mullen at Mississippi State. An accomplished recruiter, Brewster helped UNC boast the 19th best recruiting class in the country in 2020, according to 247sports' rankings. Prior to his short stint with the Tar Heels, he helped build the Seminoles' top-ranked 2016 recruiting class, which featured 18 four- or five-star rated players as well as 13 Under Armour All-Americans and four U.S. Army All-Americans. He helped the Seminoles' recruiting classes rank in the top 10 of ESPN's team rankings all five years he was on the FSU staff, including in the top five four times. Brewster was named the ACC's Top Recruiter by ESPN, made 247Sports' Top 10 Recruiters list and was among Rivals' Top 25 Recruiters.

Brian Callahan joined the University of Minnesota staff in January 2017. He coached the tight ends during the 2017 season, but was named Offensive Line Coach prior to spring practice in 2018. Callahan came to Minnesota from Western Michigan, where he coached the offensive line from 2013-17. His other college stops include Eastern Illinois, Akron, Texas El-Paso and Northern Michigan. He started his coaching career in 1992 at the high school level and has been a graduate assistant at Pittsburgh, Oklahoma and Louisville. As a team, the 2019 secondary ended the year with 14 interceptions, which ranked second in the Big Ten. Louisiana native Jabbar Juluke just completed his fourth year as a member of the Louisiana Ragin' Cajuns football staff. Coach Murdock served as assistant offensive-line coach at Carroll HS in Southlake, TX from 2006-2012. In 2013 he became the head offensive-line coach at Marble Falls HS for one season before moving to Austin Westlake in 2014 as offensive-line coach and run-game coordinator. Coach Murdock was on staff at Southlake Carroll for the 2006 and 2011 State Championships, as well as the 2019 season at Austin Westlake. Over the last 5 years at Westlake, their team has reached the state-finals twice, semi-finals twice, and averaged playing 15 games per season. Craig Stern rejoined the coaching staff at Concordia-St. Paul as defensive coordinator in February of 2017. Before returning to the Golden Bears, Stern coached 13 seasons at St. Olaf College including four years as head coach of the Oles. His first collegiate coaching experience came at Dana College (Neb.) and his first coaching experience came at the prep level at St. Cloud Apollo High School and Kimball High School while finishing his degree at St. Cloud State University. He earned his bachelor of science from SCSU in secondary education in 1996 with dual minors history and coaching. He completed his master's degree at Concordia in 2001 in education with an emphasis in youth development.

Chad Christianson has been the Head Football Coach in Hancock for 11 years. He grew up playing 9-man football in Verndale for Mike Mahlen. After high school Chad went to the University of Minnesota, Morris where he played baseball for four years. Chad and his wife Ashley (who is a kindergarten teacher) live in Hancock with their three daughters where he is the Head Football Coach, Head Baseball Coach, Dean of Students, Activities Director and teaches secondary and college math. When Chad took over the football program at Hancock, which is in west central Minnesota, they had not had a winning season in several years. In his first year coaching there were only 17 players out in grades 9-12. During his tenure, Hancock Football has gone from 6-49 for his first 6 years to 37-13 for the last 5, 20-1 the last two seasons with the lone loss coming in the 2019 Prep Bowl. Chad has been named the 2019 and 2020 Sub-district 9 West-South Coach of the Year and also the 2019 and 2020 Section 4-9man Coach of the Year.

Terry Horan – Concordia College

Coach Horan is entering his 19th season at the helm of the Cobbers and is on the brink of another coaching milestone. In his first 18 seasons Horan has amassed 124 overall wins and is only the third coach in program history to win 100 games. He also has 95 victories against MIAC opponents and could become only the third coach in Concordia history to win 100 conference games. During his 18-year tenure Horan has posted a very consistent 67.4% winning percentage. He has guided Concordia to 14 top 4 finishes in the MIAC in the past 15 seasons. Horan was an All-American while playing at Concordia from 1985 to 1988. He still holds the school record for most touchdowns in a single season as well as reception, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns for a career. He also is the second all-time scoring leader for the Cobbers.

Jerry Olszewski – Augustana University

Jerry Olszewski entered his eighth season as the Augustana head football coach in 2020 as a two-time NSIC Coach of the Year. Entering his 13th season overall as a head coach, Coach Olszewski owns a career record of 79-50 while owning a 47-34 record in seven completed seasons at Augustana. He was named the 21st head coach in school history on Dec. 12, 2012, after five seasons as the head coach at St. Olaf in Northfield, Minnesota. The 2019 season saw Coach Olszewski become the only coach in Augustana history to guide the Vikings to more than one playoff appearance as AU tallied a 9-3 overall record and a trip to the NCAA Playoffs. He was named the NSIC Coach of the Year. Olszewski earned his bachelor's degree at Wisconsin-Stevens Point (1993) and a master's degree from Minnesota State-Mankato (1995). He earned All-Wisconsin State University Conference honors as a defensive back at Stevens Point and led the league in interceptions (1990). He and his wife, Deana, are the parents of one son Jett, and two daughters, Jersey and J.J.

Coach Kenn is a 31 year coaching veteran and has coached on the high school, college, professional, and private sector levels. He is a highly sought-after physical preparation coach and public speaker. Prior to coming to Grand Rapids, Spahn coached for five years at Bigfork School, helping them to their only Section Championship and State Tournament appearance in school history. Prior to Bigfork, Spahn coached for a year at The Colorado College as their running backs and assistant special teams coach. Entz was voted as MVFC Coach of the Year, and was selected as the FCS Region 4 Coach of the Year and National Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association. He was runner-up for the STATS FCS Eddie Robinson Award.

Mack Brown, whose charismatic style and disciplined approach propelled the University of North Carolina to the Top Five and the University of Texas to the 2005 BCS National Championship, began his second stint as head coach in Chapel Hill on Nov. 27, 2018, and in just two short years, has led another Carolina resurgence. A 43-year veteran of collegiate coaching, Brown has served as a head coach for 32 seasons with stops at Texas (1998-2013), North Carolina (1988-97, 2019-20), Tulane (1985-87), and Appalachian State (1983). Over his 32 seasons, Brown has posted a record of 259-132-1 (.662). Those 259 career victories rank seventh on the FBS all-time list and are the most among active coaches. The 2005 Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year and the 2008 Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year, Brown is one of a handful of coaches in college football history to lead two separate programs to Top-Five national finishes.

Characterized by his motivational skills, enthusiasm and passion for all things Northwestern, Fitzgerald has shaped Chicago's Big Ten Team into one that consistently achieves excellence in all three phases of the student-athlete experience: academics, athletics and community outreach. Fitzgerald has built the Wildcats' program into a consistent winner. He has guided the Wildcats to two Big Ten West Division titles (2018, 2020) in three seasons, and four consecutive bowl victories since 2016. Northwestern is one of only four Big Ten programs to make multiple appearances in the league's championship game.

With a career record of 56-41 and a 26-18 record at Minnesota, Coach Fleck led the 2019 Gophers to unprecedented heights as the Gophers won 11 games for the first time since 1904! Minnesota also won seven Big Ten games for the first time in school history, beat two top-10 teams, won a January 1 bowl game and ended the season ranked #10 in the nation. He was voted Big Ten Coach of the Year and was named AFCA Region 3 Coach of the Year. He was a finalist for the George Munger Award, Dodd Trophy, Eddie Robinson Award, Bear Bryant Award and AFCA National Coach of the Year. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck, which included a school-record 3.21 in the 2019 fall semester.

Paul Chryst – University of Wisconsin

A former Wisconsin player and assistant coach and a Madison native, Chryst returned to his roots when he was named the Badgers' 30th head coach on Dec. 17, 2014. A two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year selection, Chryst has guided the Badgers to a 52-16 (.765) record over his first five seasons as head coach at his alma mater, including a 34-10 (.773) mark in Big Ten Conference play. UW ranks sixth nationally in wins and winning percentage over those five seasons, trailing only Alabama, Clemson, Ohio State, Oklahoma and Georgia. Chryst is just the third coach in modern Big Ten history to win at least 50 games in his first five seasons as head coach. Only Ohio State's Urban Meyer (61) recorded more wins through four seasons as a Big Ten head coach than Chryst's 52. Chryst has piloted UW to three Big Ten West Division crowns and berths in the Big Ten Football Championship Game. He also owns a 4-1 mark in bowl games that includes a pair of victories in New Year's Six games.

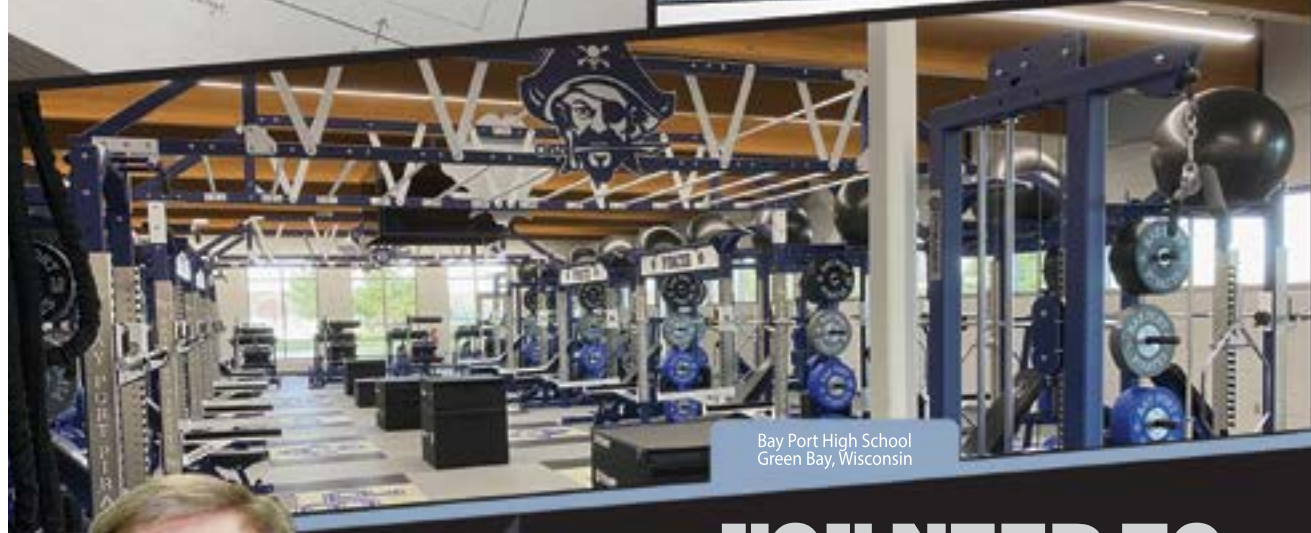
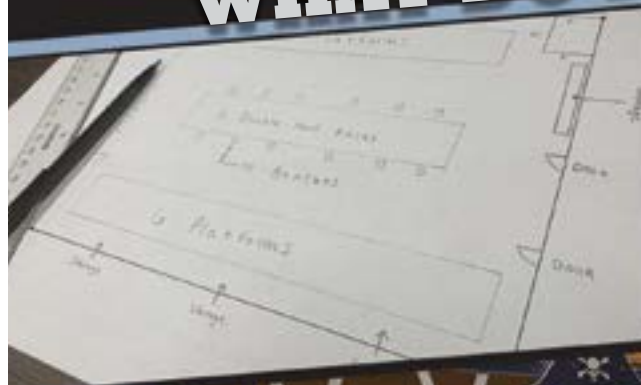
