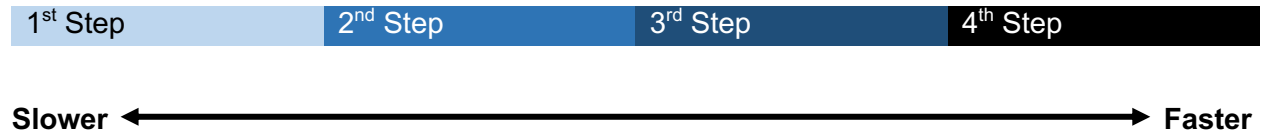


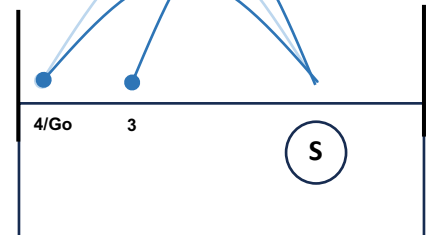


South County's offense and play-calling is based off a 4-step approach. When the setter touches the ball, the attacker should be on a certain step. 1st step sets are slower and 4th step sets are our fastest. Our default Out-of-System play call should be a 4-Gap-5 to allow our middles to be involved in every play. We want every set to be attacked inside the antennae to allow for maximum attack range.



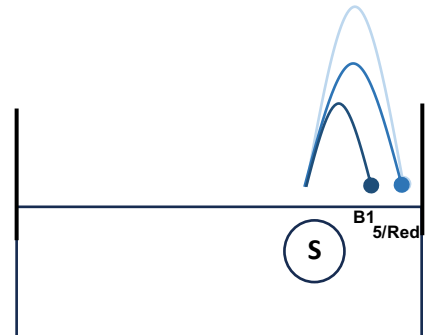
Outside Attacks

Call	Location	Signal
4	3ft by 3ft	4 fingers up
Go	3ft by 3ft	"L"
3	3ft off, in Gap	3 fingers up



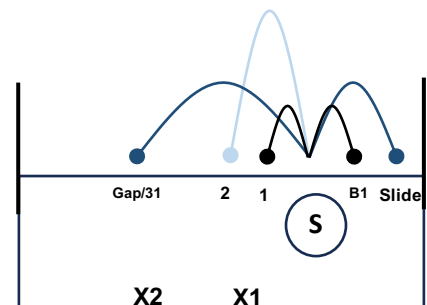
Opposite/Right Side Attacks

Call	Location	Signal
5	3ft by 3ft	5 fingers up
Red	3ft by 3ft	"Spiderman"
Back 1	Behind Setter	Pinky up



Middle Attack

Call	Location	Signal
2	Middle of Court	2 fingers up
Gap/31	3ft off, in Gap	Fist
Slide	3ft off, 3ft in	"Hang Loose"
1	3ft off, on setter	1 finger up
Back 1	3ft off, behind setter	Pinky up



*Middles have 2 primary starting points depending on the play call
