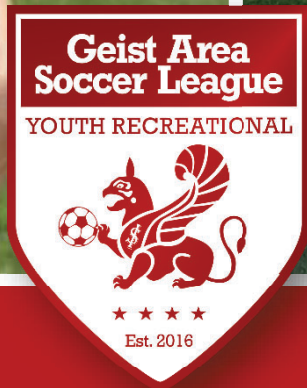

## PLAYER RIGHTS & RESPONSIBILITIES?

Every player will NEED the following for practices and games:

- Shin guards (no exceptions)
  - Plenty of water
  - Proper Shoes (cleats preferred, can wear sneakers)
  - Age Appropriate Soccer Ball ([see Game Chart](#))
  - Player Uniforms (jersey, shorts and socks) are provided as part of registration fee.

**What are your Player RIGHTS?:**

- To have fun
- To learn skills
- To be coached as a child, not as an adult
- To get to play your fair share

**What are your Player RESPONSIBILITIES?:**

- To try your best at all times
- To give your coaches the respect and attention they deserve
- To be present and on time for all team activities
- To respect the rights of your teammates

## FIELD SAFETY

We will not practice or play games in bad weather that can threaten the safety of the players. We have set rules for coaches and parents to follow to make sure we play in safe environments. If bad weather or field conditions are not safe for playing, the Directors will notify coaches. You can also check the [Field Status](#) to see if playing fields are open or closed.

### Conditions: Thunder/Lightning

We do not play if lightning is sited within 10 miles of the playing fields. Please use a weather app to determine lighting distance. Accuweather, Local News or [Lightning App](#). If lightning is in the forecast Directors may close park before practice.

### Conditions: Snow/Ice/Rain

We can play in flurries but not when snow is covering the ground. We do not want players to slip and fall. We also want to preserve the fields and not tear them up, so we may close during heavy rain or saturation. Typically the Park is closed during Nov-Feb, but we all know Indiana weather always has a mind of her own. If driving conditions are poor, we will likely cancel indoor soccer too. Always check Field Status before heading to fields.

### Conditions: Cold/Heat

In extreme cold or heat, we will either close or put restrictions on play. In the heat, we will have mandatory water breaks, shade breaks and reduced playing times. In the cold, we will encourage proper attire and reduce playing times. Younger players should always yield to parent/coach real time decisions if Field Status is Open or older kids are still playing.

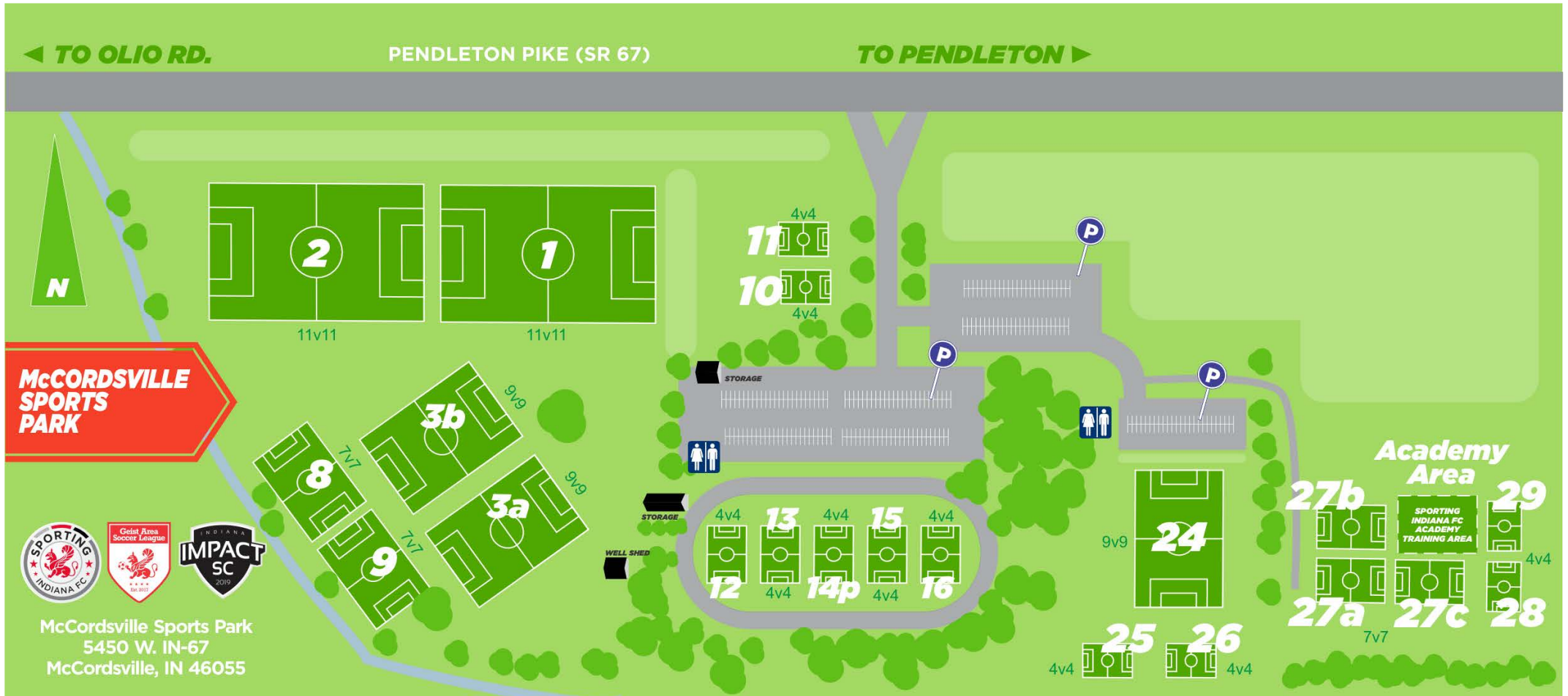

with some games on Fields 25-27.

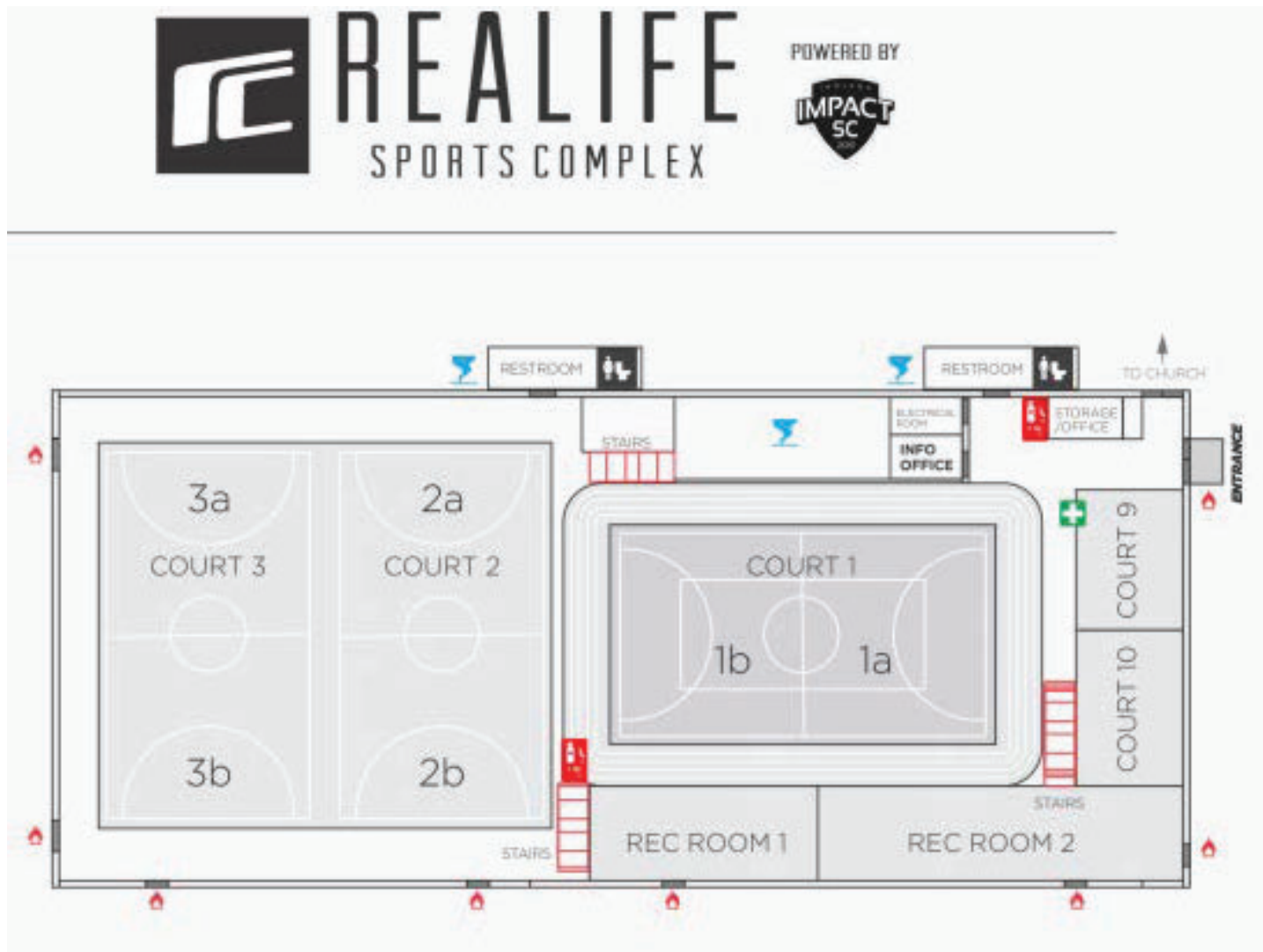

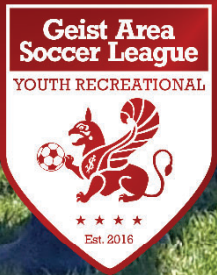

# PARENT SIDELINES ETHICS

## PARENT SIDELINE ETHICS

This is a reminder that we all have roles to play in your player's development. These quick 90 second videos produced by the FA focus on a parent's actions with the player, the referee, on the sideline and the car ride. Sometimes as driven parents we forget to look from the kid's perspective and just let kids be kids. We get caught up in pushing our kids or thinking about the next level we forget to enjoy the current level. Thank you all for being a very thoughtful group of parents.

### Roles

There are four roles that you can be during the season:

1. Player
2. Coach
3. Referee
4. Parent or Fan

Unfortunately, parents, you are too old to be a player on this team, so #1 is out. As for #2, the club has hired someone to do that job, so that role is taken. The league assigns referees for our games, so unless you are a certified official and happen to be assigned to our game, that role is also taken. So, that leaves #4 for you to fill.

So, what makes an effective parent or fan on the sidelines? It is critical that you are supportive and encouraging, not only to our players but to all the players on the field. We are working hard to teach new skills and ideas within the game, and it can be intimidating for the players to try new things. Creative players make soccer such an exciting and beautiful game to watch! Creativity only comes when players feel free to try new things. Rest assured, the coaches will channel their experimentation in the right directions. [Click to watch Scene 2](#)

It is also very important that you do not coach the players or give instructions for what to do on the field. While this is hard when you see an obvious opportunity, it is in the players' best interests to allow them to find opportunities on their own. The more you coach from the sidelines, the more confusing and muddled the message becomes, and the less impact the coaches will have when they have something to say to the players. The players can also become dependent on instructions and not develop the ability to think for themselves on the field.

***Soccer is a player's game; let them find their way! Mistakes are a fantastic learning opportunity!***



## PARENT SIDELINE ETHICS, continued...

### Referees

Please do not, under any circumstances, yell at the referees or the opposing players. The officials are doing their best and, in most cases, are young referees learning the process themselves. We need more good referees in the game, and it is important that we support the development of our young officials.

When you yell at a referee, it causes several problems. First, you will create a confrontational situation which only serves to make the referee angry. No amount of yelling or complaining will change a call. It will only sensitize the referee to look for more problems from our team or sideline. More importantly, yelling at a referee models poor behavior for your player on the field. [Click to watch Scene 3](#)

### Setting a Positive Tone

Please feel free to cheer for or congratulate a good play by players from either team. I find that congratulating an opposing player for a great effort helps keep games safer, more fair, and competitive.

Please do not offer external rewards for results to your players. When players are motivated by external rewards (\$1 for every goal you score or ice cream if you win), they do not learn to find internal motivation for their play. It creates mini-professionals who will try to negotiate a raise at every opportunity. These things focus players on outcomes, things they do not necessarily have direct control of, instead of on the process of playing.

### The Car Ride Home

One of the most difficult times for young players is in the car on the way home from a tough game. Be sure to ask your players what they enjoyed about the game, what they did well, what they learned, what they want to get better at before the next game. These questions, rather than a critical analysis of their play, and the faults of the team, will help them to deal appropriately with a loss and be prepared to come back to training with enthusiasm. ### Older Players

For older players (ages 15 and above), we spend more time working on tactics (decisions on the field) and the mental aspects of competing. With competition, there are both winners and losers in a game, and it is important to know how to appropriately deal with both sides of that competitive coin.

The true champions are the ones who learn how to use a loss to improve and set their sights forward to the next opportunity to compete. This is an important life lesson that comes from playing competitive sports.

While I am an extremely competitive person, and I love to win, I do not endorse the idea of winning at any cost. We will compete hard within the spirit and the rules of the game and let the results stand. This is also an important lesson for players in what it means to have integrity of character. 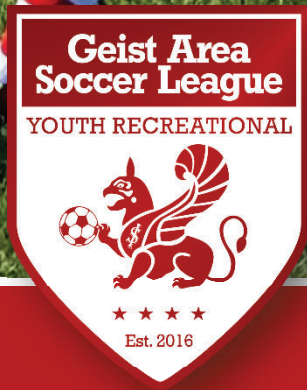
### Conclusion

In summary, be reactionary-positive! Avoid giving instruction in the flow of the game or being critical of the players. We as adults will create the atmosphere and attitude for the team.

### *Players will watch, listen, and model how we react.*

If we get upset, angry, or frustrated and show that emotion, the players will feel that way, too. If we a positive, fun, excited atmosphere that celebrates playing the game, the players will have a great experience and want to keep playing.

There is nothing we will teach the players this year that will make them great players by the end of the year. Instead, it is the attitude about playing the game that will have a lasting effect. We as adults control that atmosphere, both on the field and in the car ride home.

# CODE OF CONDUCT

## ZERO-TOLERANCE POLICY AGAINST ABUSE

Purpose: Sporting Indiana FC is committed to providing a safe environment for its members and participants and to preventing abusive conduct in any form. Every member of this organization is responsible for protecting our participants and ensuring their safety and well-being while involved in sponsored activities. See Sporting Indiana FC [Code of Conduct](#)

GASL/SIFC promotes good sportsmanship throughout the organization and encourages qualities of mutual respect, courtesy, and tolerance in all participants, coaches, officials, and volunteers. We advocate building strong self-images among the youth participants. Children with strong self-images may be less likely targets for abuse. Similarly, they may be less likely to abuse or bully others around them.

To this end, GASL/SIFC establishes the following guidelines of behavior and procedures for our staff, volunteers, and participants. All members of this organization, as well as parents, spectators, and other invitees are expected to observe and adhere to these guidelines.

1. Abuse of any kind is not permitted within our organization. This means we do not tolerate physical, sexual, emotional, or verbal abuse or misconduct from our players, coaches, officials, volunteers, parents, or spectators.
2. Physical and sexual abuse, including, but not limited to, striking, hitting, kicking, indecent or wanton gesturing, lewd remarks, indecent exposure, unwanted physical contact, any form of sexual contact or inappropriate touching, are strictly prohibited within GASL/SIFC.
3. Emotional abuse or verbal abuse is prohibited. These include, but are not limited to, such forms of abuse such as yelling, insulting, threatening, mocking, demeaning behavior, or making abusive statements in regard to a person's race, gender, religion, nationality, ethnicity, sex, or age.
4. GASL/SIFC is committed to providing a safe environment for our players, participants, and staff. We do so by appointing all coaches, officials, and volunteers – and anyone affiliated with our organization – as protection advocates. See something, say something. Every member of this organization is responsible for reporting any cases of questionable conduct or alleged mistreatment toward our members by any coach, official, volunteer, player, parent, sibling, or spectator.

# ZERO-TOLERANCE POLICY AGAINST ABUSE (continued)

5. We recommend that every activity sponsored by GASL/SIFC put a “buddy system” in place. Each youth participant should be assigned a buddy during sponsored activities. No child should go anywhere – to the bathrooms, locker rooms, or other location – without his or her buddy. This buddy could be a senior player or team parents only to return back to game or practice.
6. To further protect our youth participants, as well as coaches, officials, and volunteers, we strongly advise that no adult person allow him or herself to be alone with an unrelated child or with any group of children during sponsored activities. In particular, we recommend that coaches and other adult members of this organization:
  - Do not drive alone with an unrelated child participant in the car;
  - Do not take an unrelated child alone to the locker room, bathrooms, or any other private room;
  - Only provide training or individual coaching with the assistance of another adult or the child’s buddy;
  - If you must have a private conversation with a youth participant, do it within view of others, in the gym or on the field, instead of in a private office;
  - Coaches and other adult members of this organization should not socialize individually with nonrelated children outside of sponsored events.
7. We encourage parents to become as active as possible in sponsored activities, games, practices, and other events. The more parents are involved, the less likely it is for abusive situations to develop.
8. When traveling overnight with youth players, children should be paired up with other children of the same gender and similar age. No coach, parent, or other adult should be alone in a hotel room with an unrelated child. Children should be supervised by adults while in hotels at all times.
9. GASL/SIFC will respond quickly to any and all allegations of abuse within this organization. This information will be communicated to the authorities for investigation and will be reviewed by the organization’s Club Director and then the Board of Directors. The alleged offender will be notified of such allegations promptly.
10. Any person accused of sexual or physical abuse may be asked to resign voluntarily or may be suspended by the Club Director and/or the Board of Directors until the matter is resolved. Regardless of criminal or civil guilt in the alleged abuse, the continued presence of the person could be detrimental to the reputation of the organization and could be harmful to the participants. A person who is accused but later cleared of charges, may apply to be reinstated within the organization. Reinstatement is not a right, and no guarantee is made by GASL/SIFC that he or she will be reinstated to his or her former position.

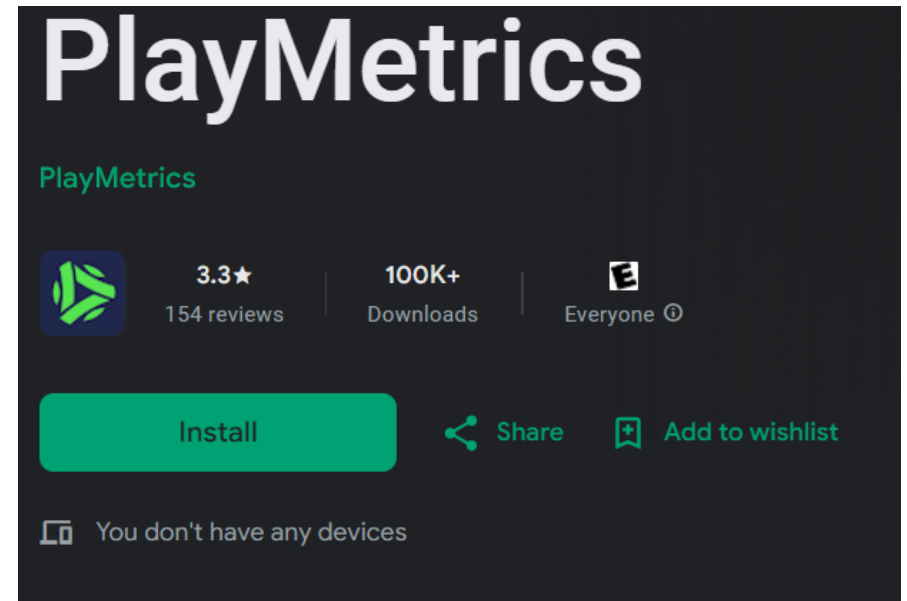

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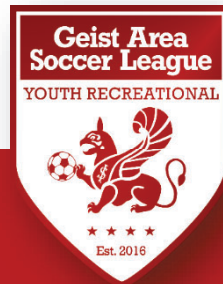

# GASL COACHES CODE OF CONDUCT

1. **I am committed to improving my knowledge of the game** - through coaching education and various training programs, and I will prepare for each game by creating an age-appropriate strategy suitable for the competition.
2. **I understand that soccer is more than the scoreboard** - I understand that the score of a game comes second to the safety and welfare of all my players. I agree to put winning in its proper perspective. I understand that the children I coach today will remember many of the things I do and say when they are adults. I will show unwavering respect for all players, parents, the officials, and the opponents.
3. **I understand my role as a coach when it comes to opposing teams** - I understand that I represent GASL and the community at large. I will demonstrate good sportsmanship at all times. I will not coach, nor allow my players to play, with intent to cause injury to opposing players. I will strive to ensure that neither I nor my players and spectators display hostile behavior towards opposing coaches, opposing players, and opposing parents or family members. I will actively discuss with my players the importance of character, ethics, and sportsmanship. I will never allow or participate in any type of boastful celebrations, or other actions that demean individuals or the sport. I will be gracious in victory and accept defeat with dignity. At the end of each game, my players and I will give our opponents a handshake, and I will instill respect in pre- and post-game rituals.
4. **I understand the importance of allowing referees to judge the game** - I will let referees judge the game. I will endeavor to instill in my players and my sideline spectators a respect for referees. I understand that my attitude can influence my players and spectators. I will display a controlled, restrained, and sportsmanlike attitude toward referees at all times.
5. **I will abide by the laws of the game** - I understand that I am responsible for understanding and competing within the letter and the spirit of the Laws of the Game. I will teach my players to understand and play within the letter and spirit of the Laws as well. I will never, knowingly or intentionally, violate any provision of my Club or League playing time guidelines or other rules and guidelines established by GASL/SIFC.
6. **I understand that I represent Geist Area Soccer and the Geist Area Community in general** - I agree to conduct myself with dignity and to maintain the highest standards of conduct as a coach with GASL. I will always display good sportsmanship and fair play, and I will encourage the same from my players, colleagues, parents, and spectators.
7. **Discipline** - If I fail to comply with this GASL Coaches' Code of Conduct Agreement, or any other rules or regulations enacted by GASL/SIFC, I agree and understand that I am subject to disciplinary actions or sanctions, including, but not limited to, suspension or expulsion from coaching in Geist Area Soccer.
