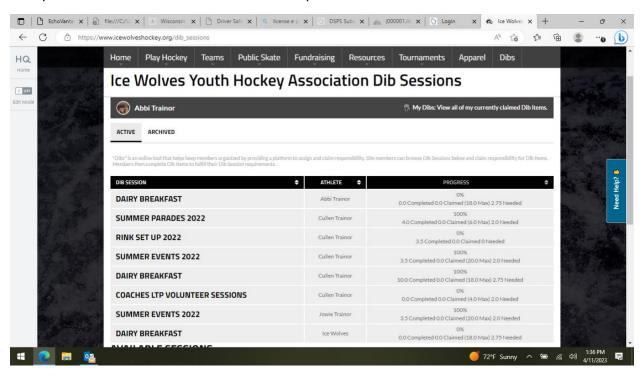
This will be my attempt to clarify the process of how to claim and check the status of your DIBS.

First you will visit our website icewolveshockey.com You must then log into your sports engine account. You will not be able to see or access your DIBs if you are not logged in.

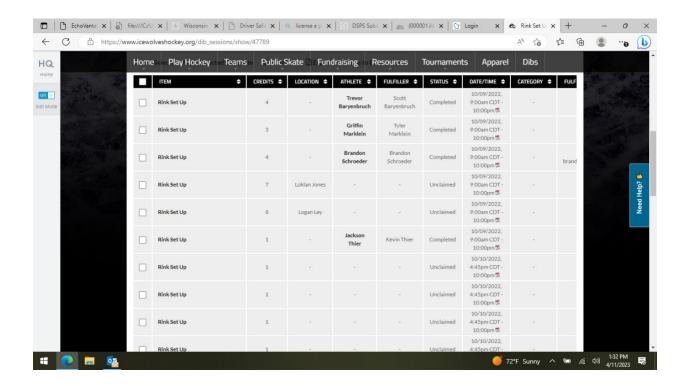
Next you will click on the DIBS tab. Below is what you will see.



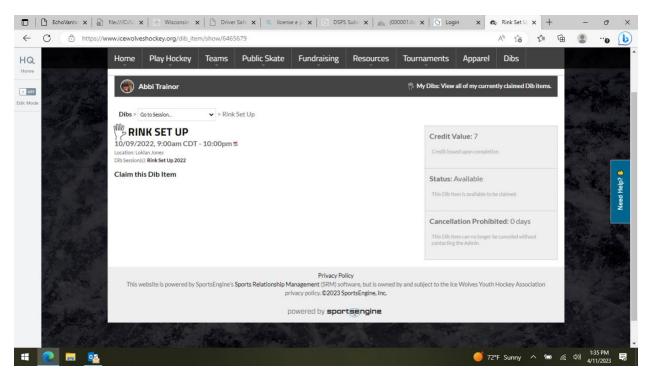
To the right of your name you will see My Dibs: View all of my currently claimed dibs. This will show you how many Dibs you currently have.

If you have written down your Dibs at the rink (particularly for rink set up) I have put these into the session, but you will need to claim them. To do this you will go to the Rink Set Up 2022 session and scroll through until you find your name. I put all of these in for you, but I will not do this in the future (rink tear down). It will be your responsibility to claim them.

For example below...the items that are bold and the athletes name is under athlete are already claimed in Dibs by the individual who completed them. It they are not in bold and the name is under location, they need to be claimed by you. (If you are having trouble finding the dibs or it appears empty make sure you have the dates filtered correctly.)



In order to claim these you will click on the rink set up button which is to the left of your non-bold name. It will look like this.



You will click claim this Dib item and proceed to claim. When I see this is done I will mark as complete and it will reflect on your total dibs.

I understand that this is a little confusing, but it is necessary for all to claim and complete the Dibs in sports engine so we can track. It will be expected that you do this for any unclaimed items that I put in for rink set up and you will also have to claim the items on your own for tear down, I will not be going in and putting names in, because it will still require you to log in and verify.
