

BRITTANY HICKS



Brittany Hicks is a world class softball/fast pitch athlete and silver medallist at the 2011 Pan Am Games in Guadalajara, Mexico. She has participated in the Canadian National Championships for the past five years, winning two gold medals, and two silver medals.

Brittany started her sport career as a youngster at Bellmoore Elementary School in Binbrook and attended Saltfleet Secondary School in Stoney Creek where she was a multi-sport athlete, athlete of the year and OFSAA medalist in track and field and badminton.

Brittany attended McMaster University and graduated in 2013 with a BSc in Kinesiology and is currently working on her Master's degree at Western University in Human Biomechanics.

Brittany has competed for the varsity softball (6 years), fencing (2 years) and track and field team (1 year). She continues to try new sports and strives to compete at the highest level.

We are so proud of Brittany and her outstanding athletic and academic achievements.

DOREEN KING

Doreen King was born and raised in New Zealand where she competed for the Dunedin Swim Club and the University of Otago. She competed in many junior and senior national championships there.

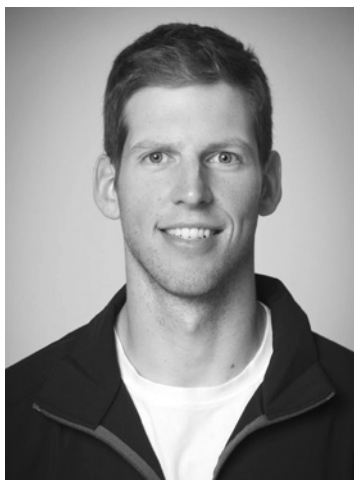
She moved to Montreal with her husband Les in 1962, later to Columbus Ohio and finally to Ancaster in 1970 where she has been swimming with the Ancaster Swim Club since.

Doreen is the gold medalist in the FINA World Masters Championships held in Montreal in August 2014. She won gold in the 100m breaststroke and silver in the 50m breaststroke. At the Canadian National Championships in June in Windsor, Doreen placed first in the 200m breaststroke, first in the 50 m and second in the 100m to qualify for Worlds. For her, the sport of swimming is "about the camaraderie and staying fit and nimble." Her coach Alex Parent notes her outstanding ability to perform under pressure and to train hard all year.

Doreen has passed her love of sports and being active her entire life on to her family. She is very proud of her two athletic sons and three very athletic grandsons. Congratulations on your achievements Doreen and as you celebrate your 80th birthday.



Keynote Speaker



JEREMIAH BROWN

Jeremiah Brown was born in Hamilton, Ontario and played hockey growing up in Cobourg. He played varsity football at McMaster University, graduating with a Bachelor of Commerce.

Inspired by the Canadian Men's Eight gold-medal performance in Beijing, Jeremiah began rowing in 2009, completing a learn-to-row program in which he put in more than 1,700 hours on the water. He then placed second at the 2010 Canadian national championships in the single sculls. He joined the national team on a full-time basis in January 2011 and quickly established himself on the powerful Canadian Men's Eight crew. That year Jeremiah and his teammates won bronze at the World Championships and in 2012 set the current world record at a World Cup event in Lucerne, Switzerland.

After a disastrous last-place finish in their first race at the 2012 summer games in London, the Men's Eight orchestrated a remarkable comeback overtaking the British crew in the final moments to bring home the silver medal.

The 2012 Canadian Men's Eight: Brian Price, Will Crothers, Jeremiah Brown, Andrew Byrnes, Malcolm Howard, Conlin McCabe, Rob Gibson, Doug Csima, Gabe Bergen.

In March of this year, Jeremiah was named an Honorary Fellow of The Royal Conservatory of Music. He currently resides in Victoria, BC with his son, Ethan.
