

## **Association Coordinator**

This position is responsible for two areas:

- 1. Overseeing and helping all the team managers for each team
- 2. Send out mass emails for the Board, HOC and some Committee Chairs

## Duties include but are not limited to:

- Assisting Head Coaches:
  - Help find a team manager for a specific team, if the head coach is unable to find one.
  - May need to attend the game scheduling meeting for a specific team, if the head coach or team manager cannot attend.
- Oversees and offers guidance to the team managers:
  - Hold a team manager meeting
  - o Answer and assist team managers with any questions or concerns.
  - Update team manager materials according to Minnesota Hockey and USA Hockey.
  - Update the Bulldog Team Coordinator webpage.
  - Grant permission to the team managers and head coaches for their team website pages.
  - Create family contact lists for each team manager.
- Book hotel blocks for the teams.
- Monitor and respond to emails.
- Attend the annual Open House to help answer any questions for new families.
- Prep team jerseys and get them ready to distribute to the specific teams.
- Attend monthly Board meetings
- Send out mass communication emails to all association families at the direction of the Board, HOC and/or Committee Chairs.
- Add news articles and items to the Bulldog website and calendar

## Tips to help you in the Association Coordinator Position:

- Be willing to ask for help when you don't understand or know the answer good resources are the past Association Coordinator (Jill Stensrud), HOC (for coach related questions), Board members (for some parent questions), Association Registrar (for registration related questions).
- Be willing to be available by cell phone or email. You may have a few instances where you are needed immediately for information relating to coaches, team managers, and practice cancellations.
- Be willing to help direct people with questions to the appropriate committee or group.
- Be willing to learn about the Association, how it works, who is involved in the various positions, and what it takes to get the season up and running.
