

Ontario Soccer Course Management



- Ontario Soccer has significantly changed the new Match Official accreditation management process*
- Clubs will no longer apply to, or host courses
 - All students will register with and pay Ontario Soccer directly
 - Clubs will receive \$10.00 per Match Official upon their graduation
- Students will be required to select a Club/District/Academy when they register
 - This selection will allow you to follow the students progress





The Students Workflow



- The new workflow is shown on the next slide
 - The workflow requires the student to use self guided learning techniques
- Each student must:
 - Complete a number of self guided modules on Law
 - Attend a mandatory webinar
 - Small Sided All Law Review
 - Entry Level Laws 11 and 12
 - Pass the exam
 - Attend a practical session
 - Pass a signals test
- The student may also attend further optional webinars

The Student Workflow



Optional Webinars

The student may also attend further optional webinars that will be offered through April and May.

- These are offered to assist students in areas where they are seeking clarification
- These will be offered on a weekly basis (dependent on student numbers)



There are now only 3 tools for Clubs in the Course Management menu

- Student Progress
- Webinar schedules
- · Practical session schedule






Underneath the tools are some information pages to help you

Student Progress - Club Selection

When a student registers for a course they are required to select a Club. If they select your Club then the student will appear on this tool.





EXAMPLE:

14 students have selected this club


The students progress through the workflow is shown in the Table

You will be able to watch each students progress through the course

To find out further details on each student click on the students name (next slide)

Student Progress - Individual Information





When you click on a students name you can see full details on the course.


In this case the student attended 3 optional webinars, the mandatory webinar and has completed the course graduating at the end of February.

You can also see the Practical Session that they attended.

You will also see the students contact information should you need to reach out to assist the student.

Student Progress - Contacting Students





The Student Progress tool allows you to send emails to an individual or a group of students.


In this example the Club Head Referee is reaching out to 2 students who have still not taken the exam.

Check off the box on the far left to select the students who you want to contact.

Student Progress - Export Students


The Student Progress tool also has an 'export to excel' tool which will generate a spreadsheet showing a list of your students and their contact information

The second tool is the Webinar Schedule

All webinars are scheduled by Ontario Soccer


They are available for you in a read only mode

Webinar Schedule - Reviewing Details


This is a read only page giving more details on a webinar





Practical Session - Schedule Tool






Your third tool is the Practical Session Schedule tool

Use this tool to apply to host a practical session

To start this process click the 'Add New Practical Session' button

Please note that if you are co hosting a Small Sided and an Entry Level practical session at the same time and location (recommended), then you will need to enter them as separate sessions with the same field date and time.

Practical Sessions - Details






Complete the form and add a map of the location

It must be approved by your District and Ontario Soccer


Only when both approvals have been granted will students be able to register for the session

Practical Sessions - Details

ONTARIO SOCCER.

If you change the middle drop down box to your District you will be able to see all the practical sessions scheduled in your District.



Note however that you can only edit your own session.


In this example Session #23 has received approval from both the District and the Province so students may register for that session.

All other sessions however still require approval before students may register for them.

If you need to cancel a session click on the 'edit' link.

Practical Session - Making Changes





When you **click edit** you will be able to make changes to the request.

To cancel the session scroll to the foot of the page and click the 'Cancel Session' button.

Practical Session Delivery

ONTARIO SOCCER.

- Ontario Soccer will work with the Club/District/Academy in the delivery of Practical Sessions.
 - Ontario Soccer will cover the fees and travel costs of:
 - Lead Instructor
 - Provincial Development Officer
 - Up to 3 Co-Instructors
- Ontario Soccer will provide a consistent set curriculum including station activities
- Each District will have above costs paid for one practical session.
 - Consideration for additional sessions will be taken for Districts with over 100 new Match Officials. These will be reviewed on an individual basis.
 - Many Districts have asked to take the lead on scheduling the Practical Sessions and inviting all new Match Officials to one large event.
 - We highly recommend that the District connect with the Clubs to deliver these sessions

Benefits of District Led Practical Sessions



- Districts can connect with a Club/Academy to book a field for one large central Practical session
- All Club Head Referees that have students will attend and act as volunteers
 - This allows the CHR to connect with the students on a face-toface basis
 - Badges will be sent out prior to event for CHRs to hand out to their new officials
- Students can meet other new officials in their area
- District Referee Coordinator could take this opportunity to introduce themselves to new Match Officials

Club Led Practical Sessions



- Clubs can certainly host their own practical sessions.
 Reasons for this could be:
 - Large club with enough numbers
 - Geography not close to the District hosted session
 - Local support network that can deliver the day
- All practical sessions must still be booked on Ref Centre
 - District will still approve any non-District hosted practical sessions
 - District could offer to assist in possible
- Students will still be required to reserve a spot

Practical Sessions

- All practical sessions must be booked on Ref Centre
 - District will approve any non-District hosted practical sessions
 - Ontario Soccer will assign lead instructor, co-instructors and Provincial Development Officer
- Students will be required to reserve a spot at a Practical Session
- This could be a 'grand event':
 - · sponsors,
 - social media coverage,
 - recruitment tool,
 - record and interview new match officials,
 - meet and greet with parents as they drop the student off for the session
