POWER PLAY "HOLDS ON" PALS 9-7 PALS "POWER" PLAY NITECAP 9-4



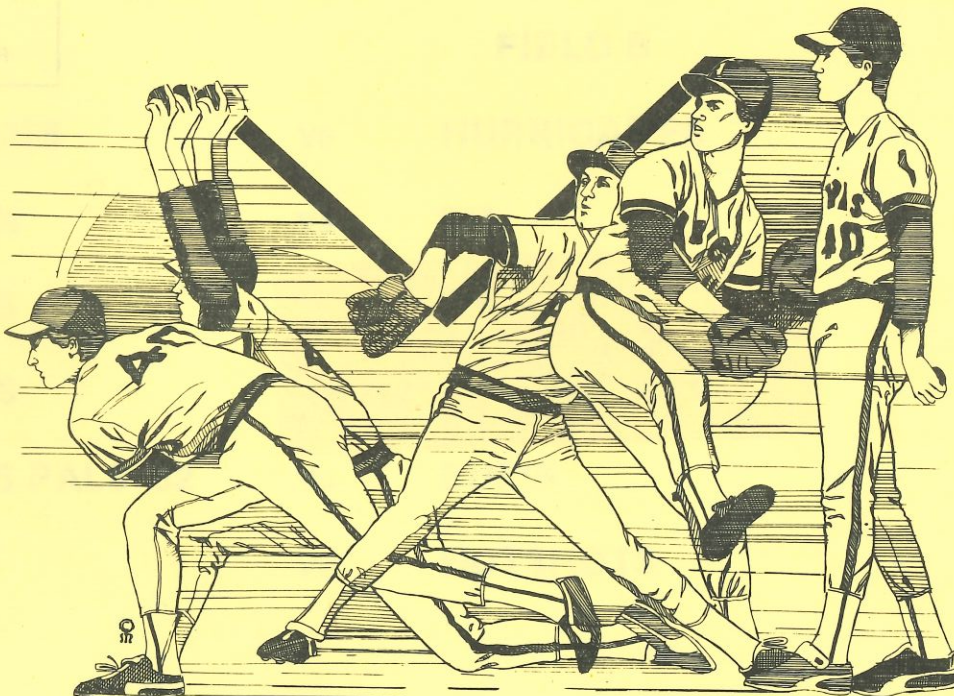

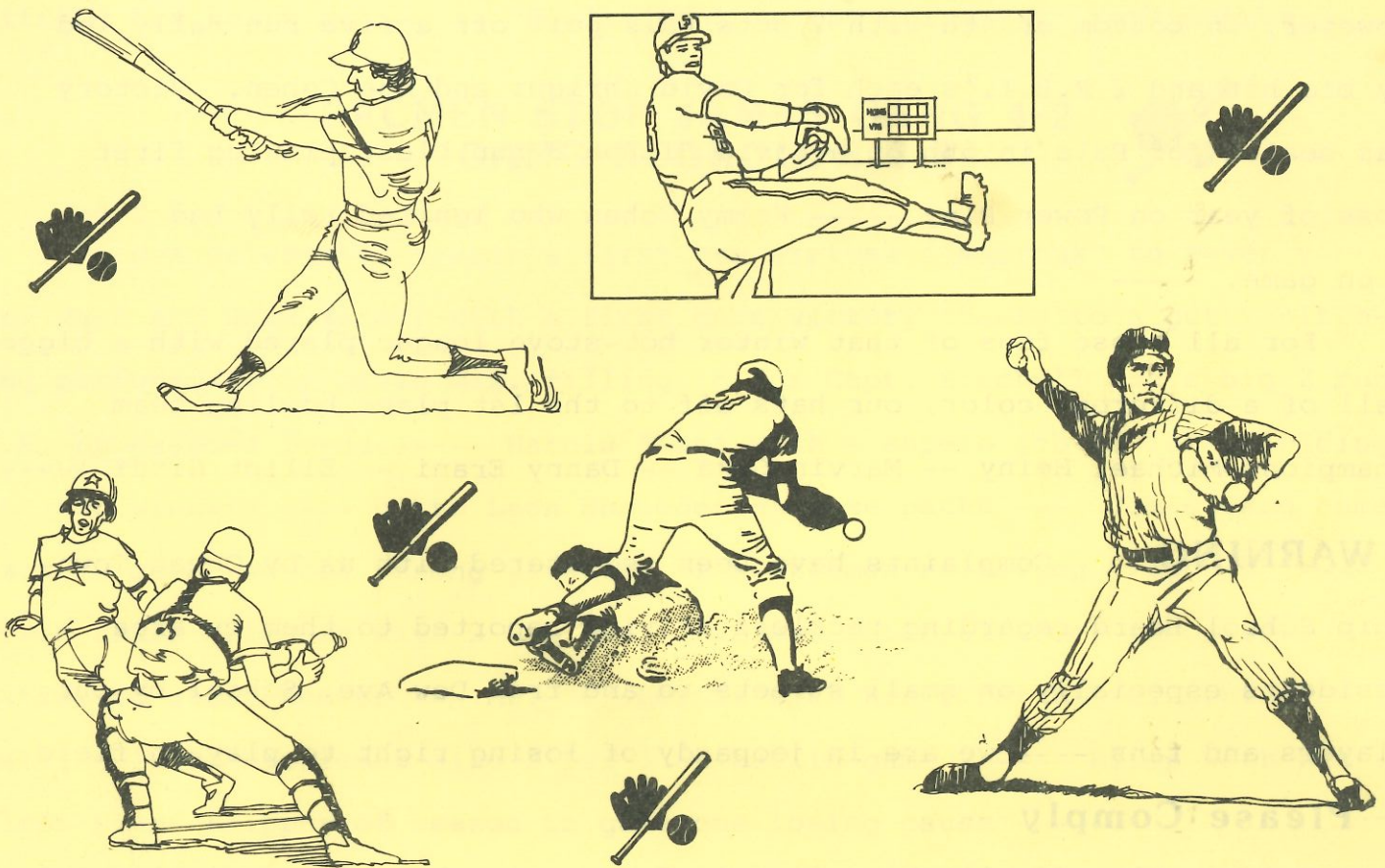
