Convenor Reminders & Score-table Instructions

- 1. All media persons must be pre-registered, pay entry fee, have a wrist band AND a lanyard. Lanyards are not to be shared.
- 2. Unless training someone, only the following people can be at the score table:
 - a. Scorebook attendant
 - b. Clock attendant
 - c. Shot clock attendant.
 - d. The officials are to have 1 chair each that they can use to sit beside the score table (3 officials)
 - e. There are to be NO friends sitting beside or standing behind the score tables. The only additional people that can be there are the convenor if they aren't part of the table, or OBA staff.

3. Scorebook:

- a. Rosters have been validated by OSBA and the head coaches within 24 hours of tip-off.
- b. The attendant is to fill out the scorebook completely with first and last names and jersey numbers as noted in this document's rosters list.
- c. Coaches are to review the rosters for accuracy and sign-off.
- d. Ensure that date and time is noted in the appropriate section of the scorebook.
- e. Any protests/technical fouls are to be noted accordingly on the scoresheet.
- f. Ensure the Officiating Crew names are on the scoresheet.
- g. Home team is to wear Light, Away team is Dark.

4. Staffing

- a. OSBA has an amended rule from FIBA: Benches are to have a maximum of 20 seats (increase from 16).
- A maximum15 (instead of 12) dressed/undressed players (note, players that are not on the roster cannot sit on the bench, this includes undeclared OBA Development League players, rostered players' siblings, parents, etc.),
 - One (1) Head Coach,
 - One (1) Lead Assistant/Associate Coach,
 - Up to three (3) Bench Personnel (e.g., can include only, other Assistant/Apprentice Coaches, Athletic Directors, Program Directors, Managers, Doctors, Physiotherapist/Athletic Therapists, Strength and Conditioning Coaches/ "Trainers", or Statisticians) on the bench.
- c. If you have an AT/Physio/RMT that is there to treat your kids, they MUST be on your eligibility form, and are to stay at the end of the bench, or behind the bench if there is room.
- d. You are allowed a maximum of 15 kids on your roster, and any undressed student-athletes should be in team gear if they are on the bench. Students that are not on the roster (including siblings) are NOT allowed on the bench.
- e. As per FIBA Rules, only a maximum number of twenty-one (21) members of the final team delegation Roster shall be permitted courtside access to the team bench starting fifteen (15) minutes prior to the start of the game until the end of the game. (20 bench seats +1 AT/Physio).

5. Bench Decorum

- a. The only people allowed on the bench are the coaches/staff and eligible players that are listed on the roster sheets included in this book.
- b. If you have an injured player that is undressed, if they are on the eligibility form, they are part of the team.
- c. There are to be no player siblings, other students (in the case of senior teams, no junior team members are to be on the bench unless they are added to your official roster).
- d. There are to be no parents or other spectators on the side of the floor where the benches are, unless you are in a facility that has bleacher seating behind the bench areas. Even if in a designated spectator area, behind the bench they are not to participate in team huddles.
- e. There are to be no coaches from other teams in your program on the bench unless they are listed as part of the coaching staff.

6. Spectators

- a. Spectators are bound by the Ontario Basketball Code of Conduct. Please take the time to remind your parents of this.
- b. Fans should not be taunting players, officials, or fans of the other team.
- c. Fans are there to cheer and not coach from the sidelines.
- d. Fans are not to be at the score table.
- e. Fans are not to be on the benches, behind the benches, or involved in team huddles.
- f. Fans can only be behind the bench if you are in a facility that has bleacher seating behind the bench. In this case, please manage your fans if they are attempting to be part of your huddles.
- g. Fans are to be in fan designated areas.
- h. Fans are NOT to be on within the marked playing areas. In the case of an injury on the floor, for the safety of the athlete, coaches and trained staff are to be the ones to approach the athlete. Parents should not be coming onto the floor unless called by the coaches.

7. Coaches Attire

- a. To ensure the OSBA is run in a professional manner, all bench staff will adhere to the following guidelines regarding attire. Items recommended to be worn on the bench include:
 - Golf shirts (preferably with school/academy logo)
 - Dress pants/shorts or golf shorts
 - Sneakers or dress shoes

8. Student-Athlete Conduct

- a. Athletes on the bench should be wearing team gear that will allow them to be easily identified on the bench as an undressed athlete. This could be in the form of a team-track suit, which most teams have for their kids.
- b. If there are athletes from junior teams, or other sports teams from your program, they are to be seated in the designated spectator seating area.
- c. Student-Athletes are bound by the Code of Conduct, which again includes respect for the officiating crew, respect for the onsite staff, respect for the hosting facility, respect for coaches and other athletes.

OSBA/CBOC Referee Coaches and the CBOC points of emphasis:

This weekend you may see several OSBA/CBOC Referee Coaches and Observers on site. Their role is not to evaluate the coaches. They are there to review and educate our Officials to assist them in their professional development and career growth.

We ask that you review the following documents, so you have an awareness of the Points of Emphasis that the Officials are focusing on to better the game and provide efficient regulation of the FIBA rules.

Useful links, documents, and downloads -- Everything from the most up-to-date FIBA Rule Book, to Casebooks, League Rule Modifications and more.

Rule changes effective October 1, 2022

OSBA Policies and Resources

The POE's identified in previous seasons that are still in effect:

- 1. ILLEGAL CONTACT (Dribbler, Off-Ball, Post Play)
- **2. SCREENING** (ball screens, screener responsibilities)
- **3. GAME CONTROL** (addressing bench behaviors, coach-official interactions)
- 4. UNSPORTSMANLIKE FOUL

(C1 – No attempt to play the ball, C2 – Excessive/Hard contact, C3 – Unnecessary contact to stop transition, C4 – clear path foul and its applications)

Other Points of Emphasis for 2023-2024 (this is always evolving):

- 1. **COMMUNICATION** (improvement needed between players, coaches and officials)
- 2. PIVOT FOOT (identifying the pivot foot and correctly calling travelling violations)
- **3. PROTECTING SHOOTERS** (up, down and then rebound, drives to the basket)
- **4. REBOUNDING** (identifying matchups and which areas to officiate when)

We ask the following of you, your bench staff, your parents/spectators, and your student athletes:

- Always respectful to the Officials. At the OSBA level, you are more than volunteer coaches, you are professional coaches.
- We have all not agreed with a call at multiple times in our coaching careers, but remember the Officials are there to keep everyone safe and enforce the rules of the game. We are all human and see things from different angles on the floor.
- We ask that you **DO NOT immediately** approach the Officiating Crew at half-time, or immediately following a game. This also applies to the Assignors and Evaluators.
- After a 3-hour window of time, the Officiating Crew and/or an Assignor or Evaluator can be contacted to discuss the GAME. There will be no discussions on a specific call.

The OSBA has had several interactions between several different levels of people (Players, Coaches, spectators) that have been less than professional in the previous season and do not align with the Code of Conduct. Please remind your players, and have your players remind their supporters that officials are there to ensure the safety of the game and to work with everyone to give the kids the most enjoyable experience.

All teams have signed off on the Governance items listed on page 4 at the time of registration in RAMP.

- o If you have you any questions about the Code of Conduct or the Zero-Tolerance policies, please visit the <u>Governance</u> section of the Ontario Basketball Association website.
- Please ensure your spectators are aware of the Spectator Code of Conduct.
- o If you have a question about a call during the game, please approach the referees with respect. Do not approach referees at half time or after the game. We ask that everyone gives themselves 3 hours to reflect on the game prior to reaching out about any issues with the game. (Yes, this statement is intentionally repeated)

Side note: Officials will issue technical fouls as they see fit. They are there to officiate the game and make the calls that are to the best of their ability at that time with the information on hand.

The Disciplinary Panel will not rescind technical fouls assessed during the game. If you have a concern about any calls or the overall game, please follow the process to submit a complaint to the Fair Play Commissioner. The incident reports will be reviewed, and if anything is flagged as a learning opportunity for any parties, follow up will be made.

Although the tournament is "Pre-season" all disciplinary infractions against OSBA teams will be subject to Regular Season Suspension/Infraction penalties.

Fair Play Policy Statement

"Fair play comprises and embodies a number of fundamental values that are not only integral to sport but relevant in everyday life. Fair competition, respect, friendship, team spirit, inclusion, sport without doping, respect for written and unwritten rules such as integrity, ethics, solidarity, tolerance, healthy physical and mental play, excellence, and joy, are the building blocks of fair play that can be experienced and learnt both on and off the field."

For Fair Play to occur, the members of our community need to know, understand, and accept the policies, rules, procedures, and decision-making criteria used by Ontario Basketball. We will strive to share our policies, rules and procedures and our decision-making criteria to clarify and help our membership in their understanding of these areas. Winning is only meaningful when we play fair.

Where an employee, member or spectator believes that there has been a failure of the policy, they should submit their compliant by email to elite@basketball.on.ca with the subject line: Fair Play Complaint and copy the Director of High Performance. The following provides the procedures to be used to address situations of concern.

Role of the OSBA Disciplinary Panel:

1. Receives complaint.

• All complaints will be sent to all members of the OSBA Disciplinary Panel and the Commissioner of Fair Play and Resolution. Safe Sport Committed will be engaged as required, as well as the Association President.

2. Investigates complaint.

- The Committees provide a fair and neutral investigation of facts alleged in the complaint. To that end, the Committee's Chair and/or the Commissioner of Fair Play and Resolution may communicate with the complainant and the respondent to clarify the following:
 - O Who is the complainant and what is the complaint?
 - o Does the complainant have direct eyewitness evidence of the facts alleged?
 - O What Fair Play principles have been contravened?
 - o Who is the respondent? Are there multiple respondents?
 - o Is the respondent a player, coach, club or official?
 - o Is the respondent a member of Ontario Basketball?

The Committee's Chair and/or the Commissioner of Fair Play and Resolution will prepare a brief synopsis of his or her investigation to be placed before the members of the OSBA Discipline Committee.

3. Sends complaint to the respondent.

 The respondent is required to provide the Committee's Chair and/or Commissioner of Fair Play and Resolution with their response to the complaint within a period no longer than 7 calendar days (including weekends/statutory holidays).
 Failure to do so will result in sanctions being placed against the respondent.

4. Creates a case file and sends the file to the members of the OSBA Discipline Committee.

• The case file will contain letters of complaint and response, the investigation report, and any other relevant information.

5. Receives a written decision from the Chair of the Discipline Committee.

• The Commissioner of Fair Play and Resolution should receive a written decision from the Chair of the Discipline Committee within two (2) weeks of the Discipline Hearing.

a) Complaint is Dismissed.

 The Commissioner of Fair Play/Commissioner of Fair Play and Resolution sends a copy of the decision to the complainant, the respondent, and Ontario Basketball's Executive Director.

b) Complaint is Sent to the Discipline Committee

- o The Commissioner of Fair Play and Resolution sets a Discipline Hearing date, time, and place.
- The Commissioner of Fair Play/Commissioner of Fair Play and Resolution sends letters to the complainant and respondent giving reasonable notice (at least two (2) weeks) of the Discipline Hearing.
- The Commissioner of Fair Play/Commissioner of Fair Play and Resolution sends a copy of the case file to the members of the Discipline Committee Panel who will hear the complaint.
- Within two (2) weeks of the hearing date, the Commissioner of Fair Play and Resolution should receive a signed copy of the Discipline Committee Panel's decision from the Chair of the Discipline Committee.
- The Commissioner of Fair Play and Resolution sends copies of the decision to the complainant and the respondent.

Role of the Chair of the OSBA Discipline Committee

- 1. Receives the case file from the Commissioner of Fair Play and Resolution.
- 2. Calls to order the OSBA Discipline Panel.
- 3. Attends the Discipline Hearing.

The Chair of the OSBA Discipline Committee and OSBA Discipline Committee Panel members will attend the Discipline Hearing, chaired by the Commissioner of Fair Play and Resolution. It is the responsibility of the Chair of the OSBA Discipline Committee to ensure that the OSBA Discipline Committee Panel's decision is written and signed within two (2) weeks following the hearing.

4. Reviews signed copy of the decision.

The Chair of the OSBA Discipline Committee reviews the OSBA Discipline Committee Panel's decision to ensure completeness and accuracy. The decision is then forwarded to the Commissioner of Fair Play and Resolution.

Media

All Media must have pre-registered through the link that was available on the Fall Showcase site and published on social media throughout this past week.

Each approved and Accredited Media person is bound by the terms and conditions of their registration and will be required to comply with onsite staff direction. You will be given a sheet with your pass that outlines the "dos and do nots".

Accredited Media Persons will be required to always wear the lanyard, and it is **NOT to be shared with anyone else**. If the lanyard is shared, the person who was assigned the media badge will have their accreditation removed for the weekend and will not be approved for any further applications to OSBA events in the future. If multiple members of your company team are registered, EACH PERSON is required to pay admission and have their own lanyard. Lanyards cannot be shared.

Onsite staff reserve the right to ask you to confirm your identity at any time they feel as though a pass may have been shared.

OSBA Team Media personnel must be registered as a rostered member of the team and be wearing clearly identifiable clothing that shows they are a part of the OSBA team (logo on polo shirt, slacks, etc.) aligning with the professionalism in the dress code.

Media space is limited at this event and if not pre-registered for the event within 24 hours of the first game, media passes will not be provided, and entrance will be allowed as a spectator sitting in the designated spectator area only.

Media with Media Lanyards are NOT permitted to be on the baseline while there is an active play going for safety reasons. The officials will be monitoring this and will ask media to move if needed. The onsite Convenors will also be monitoring media behaviour as outlined in your registration.

Media that is NOT pre-registered will not be able to purchase media accreditation passes at the door. They will need to pay gate entrance fees. Once approved, eligible media people will be sent a link to purchase their media accreditation entrance fee at the rate of \$40 until 11:59 PM on September 28, 2023. If the gate fee is not paid prior to the date the tournament starts, they will be charged \$50 at the door to obtain their media lanyard.

Media are required to pay the full media accreditation entrance fee, even if they are there for a single day only.

Rules of Play

- All league games will be governed by the International Basketball Federation (FIBA) rules.
- The one exception to the FIBA ruleset is that the OSBA will allow team rosters to have up to 15 student-athletes per game.
- Games will be 8-minute quarters.
- Each team will have 2-time outs per half.
- Bonus shots will occur at 7 team fouls within each quarter.
- Halftime will be 8-minutes.
- If an overtime period is required, overtime will be 1-period of 4 minutes. Overtime periods of 4 minutes each will continue to be played until there is not a tied score at the end of the overtime period.
- Teams will be eligible for a minimum of a 10-minute warm up due to the fast turnaround in game times.

Intermissions

Intermissions will be two minutes between quarters and 8 minutes during halftime beginning immediately. At the 3:00-minute mark of halftime, the timekeeper shall notify officials and teams with a horn that they have 3:00 minutes before end of halftime. It is recommended that teams return to their benches at the 2:00-minute mark of halftime.

Game Ball

The OSBA has signed a sponsorship deal with Spalding for the 2023-2024 season. As such, the **Spalding Precision** will continue to be the official game ball for all games. Each program will be provided with an official women's and men's game ball.

Game Day Protocol

The following protocol should be followed in advance of every game:

(Using a 7 pm tip time as an example) – This will be adjusted due to the quick turnaround of games; teams will be eligible for a minimum of a 10-minute warm up.

6:54	6:00	Team come to benches to prepare for player introductions & anthem Officials move to score table area and introduce themselves to coaches
6:57	3:00	Final 3 minutes before tip-off, players can go warm up again or stay in team huddle
7:00	10:00	Opening tip - Game starts

Facility Protocol

- a. The playing surface must meet FIBA regulations.
- b. The host must ensure that there is a proper functioning game clock, shot clock and FIBA scorebook in advance of the game.
- c. The host is responsible for establishing a buffer zone between the visiting team bench and the fans.
- d. The host's event manager is responsible for managing and supervising the buffer zone.
- e. Safety precautions, such as the padding of end walls when there is not 12-foot clearance, are the host's responsibility.

Event Staff

- a. Hosts are required to have a department staff member in a position of authority on-site to oversee event hosting.
- b. This staff member must identify themselves with the visiting team upon their arrival.
- c. Table officials are the responsibility of the host.
- d. Table officials and an announcer must be located close to the playing surface with an unobstructed view and must be properly trained and have all the appropriate equipment available to them.

Security

- a. There should be enough security personnel (Student Staff, Event Staff, Campus Security, and City Police) to control the anticipated number of spectators.
- b. Security personnel should be instructed to observe the spectators and their actions and not the game.
- c. Inebriated spectators should be watched closely and removed if they are disruptive to the game or other spectators.
- d. The host should commit to a zero-tolerance policy towards abuse of officials or visiting teams. Positive fan support should be encouraged and supported. Inappropriate fan reactions such as obscene gestures and abusive language should not be tolerated. Persons engaging in these actions should be given one warning and removed upon second occurrence.
- e. It is recommended that if an anticipated audience of more than two-thirds of the capacity of the venue, professional security (campus security or city police) should be on-site.

P.A. Announcer

- a. The announcer's role at any game is to announce the play in an unbiased manner.
- b. At all times the announcer is to be positive and respectful of both teams.

Artificial or Amplified Noise

- a. Music (including live bands) and computer-generated sounds are only to be played during stoppages of play, timeouts, halftime, etc. It is expected that players will be able to hear their coach's instructions during a timeout.
- b. Music should not be demeaning in nature to the visiting team or to the officials. The host institution must monitor the use of music to ensure that the language and lyrics do not demean, discriminate nor use profanity.
- c. The use of laser pointers, megaphones, amplified music, air horns, whistles, etc. by fans/spectators (including cheerleaders) shall be prohibited during all events.
- d. Other noise makers are at the discretion of the event manager.

Use of Artificial or Amplified Noise

- a. The home team may use amplified music as well as a P.A. Announcer during the pregame and halftime and between periods and timeouts.
- b. The home team may play a quick sound effect lasting no longer than three seconds after the home team scores.
- c. It is permissible to play a sound effect after an opponent's missed free throw, but it must be inserted prior to the shooter receiving the ball for the next attempt.

At other times during the game, the following restrictions apply:

- a. Nothing is to be amplified during opponents' free throws; and
- b. Nothing is to be amplified while opponents have the ball at any time, including for a throw in.
- c. P.A. Announcers will have the time immediately following scored baskets and fouls to announce the names involved as long as it does not overlap a free throw opportunity.

Table Officials

- a. The host shall secure all table officials.
- b. Table officials are required, at a minimum, to be at a high-school level experience and should be familiar with FIBA score sheets, score clock and shot clock procedures.
- c. Training materials/resources will be provided to table officials prior to the start of the season.
- d. The table officials shall include:
 - 1. Game Clock Operator
 - 2. Shot Clock Operator
 - 3. Scorekeeper (Scorebook)

The table may also include:

- 1. Announcer
- 2. Music DJ
- 3. Video Person (1) recording in-game action.
- 4. School/Academy Representative (e.g., athletic manager, director of basketball operations, teacher, etc.)

Late Arrival Policy

If a team is late for reasons outside of their control, there will be a 15-minute grace period after the scheduled start time.

As per FIBA rules Article 20, Rule 20.1:

Article 20. Game lost by forfeit Rule 20.1 - A team shall lose the game by forfeit (recorded as 20-0) if:

- The team is not present or is unable to field 5 players ready to play 15 minutes after the game is scheduled to begin.
- The team's actions prevent the game from being played.
- The team refuses to play after being instructed to do so by the crew chief.

A team who arrives ready to play within the 15-minute grace period, the minimum amount of warm-up time is 5 minutes upon the team's arrival.

Coaches

Each OSBA coaching staff member:

- must be a member in good standing with Ontario Basketball (OBA).
- Comply with certification requirements or show proof of working towards obtaining them within the timelines below.
- Comply with all screening requirements.

If these standards are not met, the OSBA member program must show:

- The pathway for development that is being taken for completion by the coach. This will include future NCCP courses and other professional development opportunities.
- The steps taken to find coaches who would have complied.
- The steps that will be taken to increase the number of coaches in the future.

The OSBA program should inform Ontario Basketball as soon as their coaching staff are selected so that a plan can be developed to meet the certification requirements should the coach not meet the requirements at the time of selection.

SCREENING REQUIREMENTS

All coaches and bench personnel must complete and submit a Vulnerable Sector Screening Check to the OSBA prior to the start of the season, provided by the league. This is to be uploaded to RAMP.

The Safe Sport Training module developed by the Coaching Association of Canada (CAC) will help anyone involved in sport identify and prevent situations of maltreatment. All coaches and bench personnel must complete Safe Sport Training module developed by the Coaching Association of Canada (CAC).

OSBA will require all bench personnel to complete the Safe Sport Training module every 12 months aligning with Canada Basketball requirements for Nationals. OSBA administration will check transcripts mid-August to determine who may need renewal for the start of the new fiscal year (September).

For 2023-2024 Administration will send emails out to coaches who require renewal in September. This will then align for the following years to receive a reminder email in August and complete the training within the month of September.

GENDER REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of one (1) member of each coaching staff (this does <u>not</u> include managers and trainers) is of the same gender of the team they are coaching. The roles of each coach must be clearly defined (not just title).

If the head coach (of a female team) is a male, the assistant coach and manager must be a female. The female assistant coach is not to be given the role of assistant coach in name only.

RESPONSIBLITIES

All coaches are responsible for:

- 1) Following the OSBA Code of Conduct
- 2) Following the Zero-Tolerance Policy for coach and referee interaction.
- 3) Ensuring that the student-athletes they coach follow OSBA's Code of Conduct.
- 4) Treat all OBA staff with respect for their authority in the administration of the OSBA.
- 5) Working collaboratively with other league coaches and personnel for the betterment of the student-athlete experience.
- 6) Be always compliant with all information requests in accordance with validating student-athlete eligibility and/or misconduct incidents and following OSBA administration processes and procedures.
- 7) Ensuring all student-athletes on their roster always meet all eligibility requirements.
- 8) Acting as a role model for the student-athletes and an ambassador for their respective school or program as well as the OSBA on and off the court.
- 9) Adhering to the Canada Basketball Anti-doping Policy including zero-tolerance for player and coach doping.
- 10) Coaching fairly and with high sport ethics.
- 11) Encouraging sportsmanship among team members and opponents.
- 12) Have a solid understanding of this operations manual.
- 13) Follow any other applicable policies and procedures <u>as listed on the OBA website</u> if this manual is silent on a specific policy.

DRESS CODE

The dress code is intended to provide guidelines for all coaches, team staff, delegates, and participants in all OSBA events, in terms of their chosen attire. The intent of the OSBA in adopting this dress code is to enhance the professional image of coaching and the OSBA league given the lens of post-secondary recruiting and media coverage.

Acceptable attire includes:

- Team-wear, including warm-up suits, collared shirts, and sweaters, etc.
- Business-wear, including suits, jackets, shirt & tie, sweaters, vests, etc.
- Business-casual wear such as polo-shirts and slacks with appropriate footwear.

Unacceptable attire includes:

• Casual/informal wear, including jeans, t-shirts, shorts, non-matching sweats, flip-flops, ripped jeans etc. Student-athletes are to represent themselves in a professional manner while participating in the OSBA. When travelling, students and coaches should be in team attire OR the uniform they wear in school daily if the school provides a uniform.

Athletes that are not dressing for games due to injury ("roster scratches"), cannot be in on-court uniforms and should be dressed in the same gear they travel in or if the home team, your team gear.


