














How We Grow?

Texas Jr. Stars 2023-2024 Details



- 10U A and 10U AA, will have 2 x 30-30-30 practices, 1 shared, 1 game per week (games based on schedule)
- 12U A and 12UAA, will have 2 x 30-30-30 practices, 1 shared, 1 game per week (games based on schedule)
- 14U A, AA, 16UAA will have 2 x 75 min full ice practices, 1 game per week (games based on schedule)
- All Teams, 1 ROI Session per week
- All Teams, 1 tracked conditioning session per week
- All Teams, 1 Hockey IQ or Video Review per week
- Leadership Course, Culture Club Sessions- Sportsmanship, Empathy 101, Safesport/Diversity training,
 Coach Training
- Program-wide Team Bonding August 11th

Texas Jr. Stars 2023-2024 Additional Details



- Practices will predominantly be at The Crossover, with some ice at Northcross and HEB Center.
- AMHA will provide 2 jerseys (Home and Away), 2 pairs socks (Home and Away), 2 pant shells (Home and Away), 1 practice jersey, 1 practice sock, 1 tryout jersey.
- All registered players will get a free season ticket to all Austin Ice Bats home games at The Crossover!

- Tryout registration opens May 1st and closes May 29th. \$100 additional late fee starting May 30. No exceptions, except players moving from out of state.
- \$500 tryout fee is deposit for TJS or TRS 2023-24 Season. Will be applied to registration following placement.

 Videographer, Social activities, and other opportunities. In the tryout registration you'll have a spot to indicate your interest.

Texas Jr. Stars 2023-2024 Important Dates



May 1st Registration for Tryouts/Placement for TJS Opens.

May 1st Scholarship Application Registration will be on the website May 1st.

May 15th Registration for TRS programs open. Space is limited.

June 10-11 Tryouts/Placement weekend. Coaches will narrow down field to 30-33 players depending on age group and invite to TJS training camp.

July 31st through August 11th TJS training camp for team placement. Sessions take place in the evenings and on the weekend.

Season starts July 31st, 2023 and ends last weekend of Feb or 1st weekend of March depending on playoff dates.

August 12th, Saturday TJS Team Bonding Event once teams are determined.

Placement/Tryout Format:

June 10-11 Weekend Players will attend Placement weekend.

Players will participate in on-ice, off-ice and classroom sessions over the weekend.

Schedules will be released May 30th based on registration #'s.

Sunday, June 11th families will receive an invitation to attend the TJS Training camp (July 31-August 11) or the TRS training camp (September 11-24).

AA and A teams will be selected at this time. TRS training camp will determine upper or lower seeding in leagues. All TRS players will attend TRS training camp.
