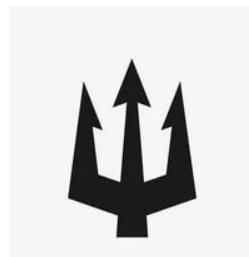

This location was chosen because of its abundance of fish, extensive public artificial reef program, relatively shallow diving, and reduced boat traffic.

Rules are subject to change

Competition:

The tournament will be a 2-day tournament (Wednesday & Thursday July 17 & 18) with 6 hours of diving and 1/2 hour travel times at both the beginning and end of the dive time. The tournament days may be moved later in the week or reduced to one day in case of bad weather.

Current Tides Bottom

78-84 degrees but can get thermoclines on bottom in summer down to low 75s. 20-65 feet average but tournament zone goes out to 150 feet.

Tournament Day(s) will be moved if seas over 4-5' and/or small craft advisory.

0 to 3 knots, usually slight but can be stronger deeper and further south in zone.

3 feet.

Reef, sandy bottom, hard and soft coral, and abundant public artificial reefs.

Fish List

FWC will be present

(Rules and fish list will be updated with any new regulations and/or by USOA director up to captains meeting)

20 fish maximum, 1 point per pound + 1 point per fish with 25 point maximum per fish. In addition to the 20 fish aggregate, lionfish are worth 1 point each, up to maximum of 10 fish.

Local and visiting teams are highly encouraged to bring their own knowledgeable observer.

Grouper

Grouper - black or gag x1 (24" total length)

Grouper - red up to x3 (20" total length)

*Total aggregate 3 grouper - only 1 can be black/gag.

Snapper - x10 (5 maximum per species) Snapper - mutton (18" total length)

Snapper - mangrove, dog, schoolmaster, yellowtail, lane, mahogany, cubera* (12" total length)

*Allowed 2 cubera over 30" per diver or vessel per day, whichever is less - included in 10 snapper total aggregate

Jacks

Amberjack x1 (28" fork)

Other Jacks – yellow, almaco, x 5 (16" total length)

Mackerel

King x2 (24" fork) Spanish/Cero x5 (12" fork)

All Other Species

Cobia x1 (36" fork, max 2 per vessel) Since only two per vessel, we will vote at captains meeting.

Hogfish x1 (16" fork)

Porgy - any species x 5 (12" total length) Rainbow runner x 5 (16" total length) Triggerfish - gray/ocean x5 (12" fork) Margate white x 2 (12" total length)

Bonus

Lionfish x 10 (1 point per fish, any size)

Disqualifications:

If a diver brings more than 20 fish to the table, the largest fish will be disallowed until only 20 fish remain on the table. Also, if the total count of any species is exceeded, the largest fish in that category will be disallowed until the maximum number is met. All legal possession limits must be adhered to. Any violation of State or Federal law will result in automatic disqualification of the diver. Every diver must possess a State of Florida Saltwater fishing license. Fish must be iced down and kept separated (separate coolers, stringers, etc.) while on the boat during tournament. Fish appearing not fresh or improperly handled will be disqualified. Fish reaching the measuring table in such condition that their original size is in doubt shall result in disqualification of either the individual diver or the entire team, at the discretion of the Meet Committee. Chumming and flashers are not allowed. Fish may not be upgraded. Once a fish is on the boat, it stays on the boat! Team members may help each other land fish but no other help is allowed between teammates - including no sharing/trading of catch. No loaded spearguns allowed on the boat. All guns must be loaded and unloaded in the water.

Points & Scoring:

Entered fish will be donated to the Men's & Women's World Team and local Florida Keys charity TBD.

Each diver will receive one point per fish and one point per pound up to a maximum of 24 pounds per fish for a maximum score of 25 points per fish. Any fish over 24 pounds will only count as 25 points. Plus, Lionfish bonus of 10 points (1 point per lionfish). Scoring shall be calculated by percent (%) of first place individual's score for each diver on each day and then both day's percentages will be added together for a total 2-day score. The converted percent scores will also be used to determine Team standings. The exact method used is the same one in place to determine USOA's National Team for the World Championships. (For Club 1, 2 & 3 placement, it will be determined by last day club aggregate score)

Observer:

Local and visiting teams are highly encouraged to bring their own knowledgeable observer. Observers should be intimately familiar with FL fishing laws and be knowledgeable about spearfishing in general - to best protect their team's interests. Triton Freedivers reserves the right to assign observers in the event a team cannot provide one. Observers are encouraged to be present at the competitor's meeting and will be

assigned to a team then. Observers will receive a special package for \$50.00 that includes tournament shirt, awards banquet entry and 20 raffle tickets. This package is also available for team boat captains.

Protest:

In the event of a protest, protester must submit protest in writing within 1/2 hour of completion of weigh-in (preferably earlier!) along with \$50.00. The \$50.00 protest fee will be refunded if the protest is upheld. One representative from each Council/Club present at the weigh-in will have a vote on the protest committee along with any USOA officers present. The National Director will only vote in a tie. Any decision of the protest committee is final. Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated and is grounds for the immediate disqualification of a diver or entire team.

Eligibility:

Teams: be ed with Friday June13th, 2024).

Competitors must represent a USOA Club or Council in good standing which has been in existence at least 3 months prior to the National Championships (May 15th, 2024) and must individually register USOA at least 30 days prior to the Championships (Competitors must be citizens or legal residents of the United States of America and must be at least 1 years old.

There are 4 team categories: Men's, Women's, Mixed Team and Masters. A Men's Team is made up of 3 men, a Women's Team is made up of 2 women, a Mixed Team is made up of 2 divers - either an adult male with adult female or an adult (male or female) with a minor (male or female ages 13-17 yrs. old), and a Masters Team is made up of 2 divers 55 and older male, female and/or one of each.

Trophies:

All categories: 1st, 2nd & 3rd place teams. Individual overall: men and women 1st, 2nd & 3rd place. Masters Individual: 1st, 2nd & 3rd place (you can be of Master's age (55) but choose not to compete in the Master's Division). Top rookie and top junior trophies. Top Clubs: 1st, 2nd & 3rd place, based on aggregate club points. USOA Spearfishing Athlete of the Year Award. Perpetual USOA US National Championship Trophy – Churchill Trophy (Men) Kate Miller Trophy (Women). Largest fish trophies for the following: Grouper, Mutton, Yellowtail, Mahogany, Cubera, Dog and mackerel (Spanish, cero or king).

Entry Fees:

The entry fee is \$150.00 per competitor and includes a tournament T-shirt, awards banquet, tournament flag, and 20 raffle tickets and other goodies. All are welcome to attend the awards banquet on Wednesday July 17th from 12pm to 4pm at a cost of \$50.00 per person and includes 20 raffle tickets (for participating observers and team boat captains, it also includes a tournament shirt). Tournament T-shirts are \$25.00 each, Tournament Flags are \$20 each while supplies last. Children 13 and under are free (limited seating).

The deadline to register and/or receive a refund for the 2024 US Nationals is Friday June 7th. After the 7th, goes to \$170.00 for competitors and must be approved by USOA National Director. team *Registration, awards banquet, T-shirts and flag purchases will be online- Link will be provided soon.*

Zone 1:

The Nationals zone 1 is bounded on the North by Molasses Reef Buoy C, the South Alligator Reef Buoy B, the West by land and or 3-mile no spearfishing boundary (no diving in the Intracoastal Waterway), and the East by the 150-foot depth mark. It is exactly 18.24 miles long. The tournament will launch out Islamorada, FL at location TBD. There are areas that do not allow spearfishing, please make sure you learn the boundaries well, FWC will be present. They are usually marked with yellow buoys but don't count 100% on the buoys being there. All boats must have GPS tracking on, and the track must be viewable at the end of day. If there is a question as to a Team's location and they cannot prove their location through their track for the day, the Team faces possible disqualification at either the discretion of Triton Freedivers or the Protest Committee. ***No spearing of fish is allowed in the Nationals zone 1 or 2 starting June 15th, 2024.***

Zone 2:

The Nationals zone 2 is bounded on the North by Alligator Reef Buoy B, the South Tennessee Reef Light, the West by land and or 3-mile no spearfishing boundary (no diving in the Intracoastal Waterway), and the East by the 150-foot depth mark. It is exactly 12 miles long. The tournament will launch out Islamorada, FL at location TBD. There are areas that do not allow spearfishing, please make sure you learn the boundaries well, FWC will be present. They are usually marked with yellow buoys but don't count 100% on the buoys being there. All boats must have GPS tracking on, and the track must be viewable at the end of day. If there is a question as to a Team's location and they cannot prove their location through their track for the

day, the Team faces possible disqualification at either the discretion of Triton Freedivers or the Protest Committee. **No spearing of fish is allowed in the Nationals zone 1 or 2 starting June 15th, 2024.**
