

PEGASUS SLOWPITCH SOFTBALL ASSOCIATION HALL OF FAME CRITERIA

The Pegasus Slowpitch Softball Hall of Fame began in 2002 to recognize past and present league members who have made a significant contribution to the continued development and lasting success of the league. May we all continue to honor and remember those who have toiled that we might move on, instructed that we might grow, inspired that we might reach for new heights and encouraged us that we might continue the legacy they began. They have given of themselves – all for the love of this league... their league... our league.

Eligibility: Any 10-year member of the Pegasus Slowpitch Softball Association, whether living or deceased, can be nominated for the Hall of Fame. The candidate must be considered in good standing with the league at the time the application is submitted. Applicants can be current or former players, umpires, coaches, managers, scorekeepers and honorary members. The 10-year membership period does not have to be concurrent... but a total of 10 years of involvement with the league is required. The nominee should have made a significant contribution to PSSA. Anyone familiar with a candidate can make nominations via the form, found on the elections and nominations page of the PSSA website (www.dallaspssa.org), or by requesting a form from the Hall of Fame Chairperson at HallofFame@dallaspssa.org.

Applications: Applications should include a brief description of the candidate's personal history, contributions that justify their induction into the Hall of Fame, letters of recommendation and photographs, if at all possible. Consider that some Hall of Fame members may not recognize each candidate by name only, so photos and references may help them in their decision to induct a candidate. Be sure to include all aspects of league involvement when describing a candidate... playing, coaching, fundraising, community involvement or leadership service at the local and/or national level .

Voting process: Upon verification of eligibility, application packages will be forwarded to all living Hall of Fame members as soon after the deadline as possible via electronic mail. Members will consider each applicant based on the information provided and return yea/nay votes for each candidate to the Hall of Fame Chairman.

Confirmation: Candidates who receive at least 2/3 of the votes cast will be inducted into the Hall of Fame at a date and time to be determined. Candidates who fail to get 2/3 vote will have their nomination retained for the following year; if that candidate fails to get confirmed after 2nd vote, a new application will be required for future consideration.
