Tour Code of Conduct Standards



The Danville Oaks Rugby Club Tour Code of Conduct Standards will be communicated to the players and parents prior to the team departing for the tour. Players and parents must read this tour code of conduct, and players must agree to this tour code of conduct prior to departure.

A reasonable curfew will be set when all players must be in their rooms each evening while on tour. A bed check will be performed each evening of the players after curfew to ensure all players are in their rooms at a specified time. A visual inspection of the room may be conducted. Player free time will be monitored by an adult chaperone while on tour.

No alcohol or illegal drugs are allowed to be consumed by players. Prescription medications not prescribed to that specific player or taken in excess of the proscribed amount shall be classified as illegal drugs.

Players must abide by the general Danville Oaks Code of Conduct while on tour. As a participant of the Danville Oaks Rugby Club in a touring event an Oaks player must also promise they will:

- Show good character and values. Be honest, trustworthy, and responsible.
- Respect themselves, teammates, coaches, officials, opponents and the game.
- Follow team/club rules at all times.
- Give their best effort at all times.
- Declare the use of any and all medications, and NOT use tobacco, e-cigarettes, vaping products, alcohol, illegal drugs (including any and all marijuana products), or banned performance enhancing substances.
- Not engage in any criminal conduct, including, but not limited to laws governing the possession, provision and use of drugs, e-cigarettes, vaping products and/or alcohol.

Violations of the code WILL result in one or more of the following:

a) Dismissal from the event and sent home immediately (additional travel costs will be the responsibility of the player and his family).

b) Suspension/Expulsion from the Oaks event, the club may suspend a player from games, event, or other related club activities. Depending on the severity of the action or misconduct, the Oaks reserve the right to expel the player from the team or the club.

c) Community Service. The player will complete a determined number of hours in a recommended community service project after the event if they are to return in good standing to the Oaks.
