It is recommended that you wash the jerseys when you get them at the beginning of the season, before wearing for the first time.

Washing Instructions:

- Wash each jersey separately. Do <u>not</u> wash the red jersey with the white jersey
 - o Do not wash with garments containing buttons, zippers, velcro, or heavy fabrics
- Always use mild laundry detergent
 - Do not use chlorine bleach
 - Do not use color safe bleach
 - Do not soak
- Wash in COLD water only
- Remove from washer immediately
- Tumble dry on LOW or Hang to dry on a plastic hanger
- Do not use an iron

Please remember that, like many garments, our jerseys may be subject to dye migration due to the following reasons:

- From sitting wet for a prolonged period of time
 - Prevent from sitting wet in a pile, on a bench, or in a bag after use
 - All jerseys should be washed ASAP after wearing to avoid bleeding that may occur when perspiration or dampness is left in the jersey
 - Hang until being laundered plastic hangers are best.
 - o Prevent from sitting wet in a washer of water or in the bottom of a washer

Additional Information:

- A \$250 jersey deposit per player will be collected by the WHA before a jersey set will be issued at the start of the season
 - This deposit check will <u>NOT</u> be cashed. It will be held with the WHA Treasurer and handed back to parents or shred at the end of the season provided there is no damage to the jerseys
 - Damage to the jerseys (outside normal wear and tear from hockey games) such as cuts, velcro marks, food or beverage stains or rust marks from skates may result in the loss of all or a portion of your jersey deposit
 - If at the time of check-in, a jersey is damaged beyond reasonable wear and tear from game play, the
 - \$250 deposit check will be cashed by the WHA to fund replacement jerseys
- Please do not alter the jerseys in any way
- Jerseys MUST be kept in a garment bag when they are being transported
