

# Previous Matchups vs. St. Edward (31-24-1)





On Friday, for the 57th time, the Wildcats and Eagles will face off on the gridiron.

The rivalry match has earned many monikers over the years, but perhaps "The Game" is the best descriptor of the battle between two West side powerhouse programs.

This year's game promises to be extra special at FirstEnergy Stadium. The game, part of the Great American Rivalry series, will pit two playoff-bound teams jockeying for position in computer rankings, hoping to earn a home game in the first week of the playoffs. The Game promises to be a classic once again this season.

### ABOUT THE WILDCATS ...

### Wildcats Storylines ...

MILESTONE ACHIEVED: With the Wildcats' win over Archbishop Moeller, Coach Chuck Kyle '69 now has more wins (351) than every other Saint Ignatius head coach combined (350).

GCL CHAMPS: For the first time in program history, the Wildcats defeated three Cincinnati teams in the regular season. All three teams - Elder, Archbishop Moeller, and St. Xavier - are members of the Greater Catholic League (GCL) South, making the Wildcats the unofficial conference champs. Moeller claimed the official title by defeating Elder on October 5, 24-21. Only once in program history have the Wildcats beaten three Cincinnati teams in one full season - in 2008. The Wildcats defeated La Salle (50-0) and St. Xavier (19-16 in OT) in the regular season and Elder (28-20) in the state championship.

**CONSISTENTLY GOOD:** The Saint Ignatius passing attack has reliably provided the Wildcats with points during the team's seven-game winning streak. The Wildcats have notched a passing touchdown in each of the last seven contests. Quarterback Patrick Delahunty has thrown for 150 yards in each of the last 6 games, totaling 1,600 yards and 15 touchdowns on the season. The senior enjoyed a breakout game vs. St. Xavier, notching a career-high 311 yards and 3 touchdowns. Delahunty is averaging 177.8 yards through the air this year. Delahunty also has 130 yards and 3 touchdowns on the ground.

**TWO-WAY THREATS:** The Wildcats have a number of two-way studs who play both offense and defense. Senior Jack Kennedy splits time at wide receiver and cornerback, junior Connor Cmiel plays wideout and corner, and Jack Welcsh shares snaps at running back and safety. The trio has a combined for 1,742 all-purpose yards this season on offense and special teams, along with 32.5 tackles and 4 interceptions on defense.

THREE YARDS AND A CLOUD OF DUST: Jahadge Bo Floyd and Jack Welcsh have both run the ball effectively this season. Floyd has gritted out 472 rushing yards and 5 touchdowns on the year, averaging 3.7 yards per carry. Welcsh has notched 313 yards and 4 touchdowns, averaging 5.4 yards per carry. James Crosby and Michael Mangan also figure into the mix for the Wildcats. As a team, the Wildcats have rushing touchdowns in seven of nine games this season.

**TWO-MINUTE WARRIORS:** The Wildcats have become quite adept at the 2-minute drill this season. Under Coach Kyle, the Wildcats work on it a lot in practice, but without a defense on the field. The practice teaches the team cadence and timing, along with the clock rules. The extra work has resulted in great results. The Wildcats have scored in the final minute in the last four games. On the season, the Wildcats have scored 38 points in the final two minutes of the first half, including 24 with less than a minute remaining. The Wildcats have been the last team to score in the second quarter in eight of nine games this season. In 2018, the Football Cats are outscoring opponents 98-35 in the second stanza.

**UNDER PRESSURE:** Since Tommy Eichenberg moved to middle linebacker in Week 3, the Wildcats' defense has been nearly unstoppable. Opponents have scored just 53 points, an average of 7.57 during the team's winning streak. As a team, the Wildcats play a 3-3 stack, mixing up coverages under Defensive Coordinator Ryan Franzinger '02. Against a zone run St. Edward team, the Wildcats will be paying close attention to gap integrity. Look for the Wildcats' defensive linemen to occupy blocks to the team's linebackers, who will flow to the seam.

**FLYING NOT PERMITTED:** The Wildcats' secondary was on fire vs. St. Xavier, intercepting four passes. The Wildcats have 10 picks and 34 pass breakups on the season. Cornerback Jett Elad and safeties Danny Scelza and Mitch Puhalsky will be key in shutting down St. Edward's big-play passing game.

**KICKING CANCER, ONE POINT AT A TIME:** The Wildcats special teams unit has dedicated the 2018 season to raising money for pediatric cancer research. Teaming up with Kick-It for Cancer, the Wildcats have tallied 59 points and raised \$4,150 for the cause thus far this season. Since Matt Colella '14 began the Kick-It program, the Cats have helped Kick-It raise \$1 million for children's cancer research.

### **ABOUT ST. EDWARD ...**

#### Learning about the Eagles ...

**PLAYOFF-BOUND:** The 2018 Eagles are headed to the playoffs for the ninth straight season. The team clinched the berth with a 29-22 victory over Archbishop Moeller, the Eagles' sixth straight win. St. Edward will be making its 24th playoff appearance in the first week of the playoffs on November 3. Today's game will determine seeding.

**LOMBARDO'S LEGION:** St. Edward has enjoyed great success since Tom Lombardo assumed the reins in April 2015. Lombardo has led the Eagles to a 39-8 record in the last four seasons, and a Division I State Championship in 2015. The Eagles will be looking for state title No. 4 this November.

**BIG PLAY OFFENSE:** St. Edward runs an offense that's always ready to hit on a big play. The Eagles average about 376 yards of total offense per game, scoring 34.8 points per game this season. The Eagles run the offense primarily out of the shotgun formation with 3-4 wideouts.

**GARRETT'S GUYS:** The St. Edward offense is led by quarter-back Garrett Dzuro. The senior split time at the position last season and is the starter this year. Dzuro is a dual-threat QB with quick legs and a strong arm. On the season, Dzuro has 1,069 yards and 15 touchdowns through the air, along with 534 yards and 5 scores on the ground.

THE SPEEDSTERS: Watch out for Jordan Castleberry and Quintel Kent – the two seniors are the Eagles' most dangerous playmakers. Castleberry is a quick back with a flash of speed that's second to none. The 5'7, 195-pound back has 956 rushing yards and 13 touchdowns this year. Kent is a big-play wideout who burned Moeller for the game-winning score last week. On the year, the 6'0, 165-pound speedster has 594 receiving yards and 8 touchdowns.

**DEFENSIVE SCHEMING:** St. Edward utilizing a 4-man front typically on defense. The Eagles' base defense is a 4-3, but the Eagles will bring in a nickel back to match spread formations. Watch out for a variety of blitz packages.

**DEFENDERS TO WATCH:** The Eagles have a variety of strong players on defense. Caden Kolesar is the heart of the unit at defensive back. Daylan Jernigan is also quick at DB, Seamus O'Malley is strong at defensive line, and the Nash brothers (Logan and Lawson) are ballhawks in the secondary.

**SPECIAL TEAMS:** Gianluca Russo handles most of the kicking duties, notching 23-of-26 PATs and 1-of-2 field goals. Grant Saringer is the kickoff specialist (48.6 yards per kick), and Justin Slattery is the punter (34.6 yard average).

### **GAME PREVIEW**

#### WILDCATS AND EAGLES MEET IN REGULAR SEASON FINALE

Every year since 1971, the Wildcats and Eagles have met on the gridiron. Since the rivalry began, the contest has gained many monikers, but perhaps "The Game" fits the best.

In the regular season matchups since 1971, the Wildcats own the narrowest of advantages, 24-23-1. Overall, Saint Ignatius owns a 31-24-1 margin in the series, as Head Football Coach Chuck Kyle '69 has a 25-12-1 mark vs. the Eagles, including a 24-9 record since 1988.

This year's contest will take place in a unique venue – at FirstEnergy Stadium, the home of the Cleveland Browns. The game will be one that players on both sidelines will remember forever.

### ST. EDWARD OFFENSE VS. SAINT IGNATIUS DEFENSE

Under the direction of Head Coach Tom Lombardo, St. Edward operates a big-play offense. The Eagles are a quick-strike team ready to pounce on the slightest mistake and exploit it for a touchdown.

Quarterback Garrett Dzuro leads the offense. The dual-threat signalcaller has 1,069 yards and 15 touchdowns through the air this season and 534 yards and 5 scores on the ground.

The Eagles can pass effectively, but this is a running team. Through eight games, St. Edward has run the ball on 69% of its plays (310 of 447 plays). Jordan Castleberry is the bellcow for a talented rushing attack, with 154 carries for 956 yards and 13 touchdowns. The Eagles utilize a zone read scheme, in which the shifty senior thrives, cutting to the seam and using his quickness to dash through the hole.

On the flipside, the Wildcats' 3-3 stack defense will be paying close attention to gap integrity. Middle linebacker Tommy Eichenberg anchors the front six, leading the team in tackles. Zach McMahan, Aidan Wells, and Anthony Gerace will play a key role in occupying gaps and blockers to allow the 'backers to flow to the ball.

The Wildcats will also need to pay close attention to Quintel Kent. The 6'O, 165-pound wideout tops the team with 38 receptions for 594 yards and 8 touchdowns. Kent caught the game-winning touchdown last week vs. Moeller, and can burn you if you don't pay enough attention to him.

The Wildcats will look to match Kent with skilled cornerbacks, including Jett Elad, Jack Kennedy, and Connor Cmiel. At safety, Danny Scelza, Jack Welcsh, Mitch Puhalsky, and Nick Velotta Jr. will provide help in the run game and help over the top with the

Eagles' deep passing attack.

### SAINT IGNATIUS OFFENSE VS. ST. EDWARD DEFENSE

On defense, the Eagles feature a mix of youth and experience, with six seniors and five juniors in the starting lineup. The Eagles certainly have plenty of playmakers on the defensive side of the ball.

The Eagles will typically line up with a 4-man front, often with two tackles with hands in the dirt and two standup defensive ends. St. Edward switches between 2 and 3 linebackers, depending on the situation.

Up front, defensive end Jeffrey Pietrowski leads the linemen with 72 total tackles (23 solo, 40 assists). Teon Smith, Daylan Jernigan, and Richard Johnson are the top men at linebacker, often blitzing in a variety of ways to stump opposing offenses.

St. Edward possesses a very strong secondary filled with playmakers. Caden Kolesar is the heart of the defensive backfield at cornerback, compiling 7 pass breakups, 3 sacks, and 2 quarterback hits. Logan and Lawson Nash anchor things at corner and safety, respectively. Lawson Nash tops the team with 4 interceptions this season.

On offense, the Wildcats have steadily improved over the course of the season. Much of the credit goes to the offensive line, which has gained a reputation for grit down the stretch, opening running lanes for Jahadge "Bo" Floyd and Jack Welcsh. The Wildcats will need to establish the run early on in this matchup.

The running game has often opened space for the passing game this season. Quarterback Patrick Delahunty has shown off his strong arm and quick legs, finding Connor Cmiel and Jack Kennedy on deep routes, Ethan Biacsi and Nate Conry in the intermediate game, and Jake Lang and Aidan Wells in the red zone.

#### SAINT IGNATIUS SPECIAL TEAMS VS. ST. EDWARD SPECIAL TEAMS

Special teams has been a strength for the Wildcats this season. Rory McConville has handled extra points and field goals well, with Declan Mangan converting a few longer kicks. Pat Otter has pinned opponents deep all year, thanks to great snaps from Sean Wracher.

Gianluca Russo handles most of the kicking duties for the Eagles, notching 23-of-26 PATs and 1-of-2 field goals. Grant Saringer is the kickoff specialist (48.6 yards per kick), and Justin Slattery is the punter (34.6 yard average).

### ST. XAVIER RECAP

#### WILDCATS CLINCH SPOT IN THE PLAYOFFS WITH VICTORY

In a battle of Division I heavyweights, the men of Ohio City once again prevailed over a Cincinnati powerhouse. On a sunny Saturday afternoon in Cincinnati, the Saint Ignatius Wildcats overcame a double-digit deficit to earn a 27-20 victory over the St. Xavier Bombers and claim a spot in the 2018 OHSAA Division I playoffs.

The contest began with a three-and-out for the Wildcats. On St. Xavier's first drive, Jack Welcsh intercepted the Bombers. The Wildcats could not take advantage of the nice field position at the St. Xavier 39-yard line, punting the ball.

Following a beautiful Pat Otter punt, St. Xavier assumed possession deep within its own territory at the 3-yard line. The Bombers picked up four yards on the first play of the drive before striking gold. Wyatt Hudepohl tossed it out wide to running back Chris Payne on a seemingly innocent play. However, Payne pushed past a couple Saint Ignatius tacklers before following his blockers down the sideline. No Wildcat could catch him, and Payne found his way into the end zone for a 93-yard touchdown run. The Bombers missed the ensuing extra point, setting the score at 6-0 St. Xavier with 7:06 left in the first quarter.

The Bombers' defense made a big play a couple drives later. BJ Ferguson picked off the Wildcats with just over a minute left in the first quarter. The Bombers assumed possession at their own 21-yard line but the drive, which stretched into the second quarter, could not capitalize on the turnover.

An unsuccessful Wildcats possession sent the ball back to the Bombers. The Saint Ignatius defense notched its second of three turnovers in the first half. Nick Velotta Jr. intercepted a pass across the middle, returning it to the St. Xavier 26-yard line.

The Wildcats could not find the end zone, but Rory McConville still made the Bombers pay, converting a 35-yard field goal. His sixth field goal of the year narrowed the deficit to 6-3.

The teams exchanged the ball before the Bombers drove down the field in the final minutes of the half. On the eighth play of the drive, Hudepohl lofted a 16-yard touchdown pass to Marshall Lang for a touchdown score. Joe Sullivan's PAT sent the lead to double digits, 13-3.

On the following drive, the Wildcats fumbled. The turnover did not hurt the Cats, as Tommy Eichenberg forced a fumble a couple plays later. The play gave the Cats another shot at narrowing the deficit.

In the final 50 seconds of the half, the Wildcats

drove to the end zone. Patrick Delahunty orchestrated a 6-play, 54-yard march, utilizing several receivers en route to the end zone. Cmiel hauled in a 14-yard touchdown score on a flag route to complete the drive. McConville hit the extra point, leaving the score at 13-10 Bombers entering the second half.

On the first drive of the third, Hudepohl went to work for the Bombers. The junior signalcaller led a 7-play, 68-yard drive. Clifford capped it off with a beautiful catch in the back of the end zone on a fade from Hudepohl. The touchdown and extra point extended the St. Xavier lead to 20-10.

The Wildcats did not panic. Floyd and Delahunty started a march with runs of 16 and 15 yards, setting up the play-action. Cmiel ran a post route right down the middle, outrunning the defensive back and catching a beauty from Delahunty.

The Bombers punted on the following drive before the game turned into a pick party. The Wildcats threw an interception during the next possession. On the next play, the Bombers lofted a deep ball, only to have Jack Kennedy leap in front of the ball for an interception, his second of the year.

With 2:56 left in the third quarter, Delahunty and the methodical Wildcats' offense utilized a strong run game and quick out routes to the sidelines for gains of 10 to Nate Conry and 36 to Cmiel to get traction. Delahunty led the Wildcats to the Bombers' 23-yard line by the end of the third.

The Bombers held strong on the first play of the fourth quarter, a third and long, forcing the Wildcats to attempt the field goal. McConville hit the 37-yarder easily to knot the score at 20.

The Wildcats' defense forced a three-and-out before the Saint Ignatius offense took full control.

Floyd pounded the ball on four straight plays to begin the drive. Delahunty completed a 6-yard pass to Cmiel before Floyd gritted out 4 yards on the next two carries. The runs caused the Bombers' safeties to cheat up on the run, giving Cmiel single coverage on the outside. The junior burned the Bombers, hauling in a 35-yard completion from Delahunty to the 1-yard line.

Three plays after the big play-action pass, Delahunty rolled out on a naked bootleg and found Aidan Wells for a critical 4-yard touchdown catch. In the final 4:17 of the game, the Wildcats held strong on two St. Xavier drives. Merick Hartley ensured victory on the last play of the game, tabbing the team's fourth interception of the game and 10th of the season.

This will be the fourth time that the Wildcats will pay a visit to FirstEnergy Stadium, home to the National Football League's Cleveland Browns. Saint Ignatius lost to Lake Catholic in 2010, 28-21; defeated Cardinal Mooney in 2012, 31-7; and beat St. Edward in 2016, 34-7. The first two of those games were part of the Cleveland Browns' High School Football Charity Game.

Construction on FirstEnergy Stadium began in May 1997 when it was announced that the Cleveland Browns were making a comeback to the city in 1999. It officially opened on September 12, 1999, when the Browns hosted the Pittsburgh Steelers.

The stadium is a natural concrete and glass structure, using precast and concrete for the upper concourse structure. The construction of the base and structure took more than 6,000 truckloads of concrete. The playing surface is Kentucky Bluegrass. FirstEnergy Stadium is one of the few NFL stadiums that has natural grass as its playing surface. The field has an underground heating system for the cold Cleveland winters and for when snow is on the field.

In January of 2013, after Jimmy Haslam bought the Cleveland Browns, he announced that the naming rights of the stadium would be sold to FirstEnergy Corporation, an Akron-based electricity service. Haslam then announced major renovations to the stadium, which included a new audio system, two new scoreboards (4th largest in the NFL), adding more seats to the lower bowl, improving concessions, installing WiFi around the entire stadium, more video screens around the stadium, and enhancing the premium club suites.

### Late QB sneak allows Wildcats to steal away with a victory over the Eagles in Lakewood

LAKEWOOD - LAKEWOOD - For the second consecutive week, the 9-1 Saint Ignatius Wildcats defeated the Associate Press poll's top ranked Division I team. Last week it was the St. Xavier Bombers, 28-14. This week it was the St. Edward Eagles, 17-10.

The Wildcats rode their special teams to a 7-0 lead with 7 minutes and 15 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

Matthew Trickett got off a punt deep into St. Edward territory that the Eagles' return man fumbled. Wildcats running back/linebacker Jack Welcsh recovered the loose football at the St. Edward 8-yard line and two plays later tailback Jahadge Bo Floyd scored from 6 yards out. Trickett's extra-point kick was good.

After driving nearly the length of the field, Saint Ignatius capped an 18-play drive with a 24-yard field goal by Trickett and it was a 10-0 game with 9:24 left in the first half.

Thanks to the Wildcats defense led by its linebackers, Logan Joyce and Tommy Eichenberg, and its secondary, corner Cam Toppin and safety Danny Scelza, it remained a 10-0 game at halftime. Toppin came up with his sixth interception on the season and Scelza made a pick with 1:24 to go in the first half after the Eagles advanced to the Wildcats' 27-yard line. Joyce finished with 10 tackles and a fumble recovery, and Eichenberg, had five solo tackles, seven assists and a sack. Along with his interception, Scelza had six solo tackles and three assists. Safety/wide receiver John Wetula was in on eight tackles, including five solos.

The Eagles got on the scoreboard off a 32-yard field goal by Blaine Stencil with 11:50 remaining to be played and, after recovering the ensuing onside kick at midfield, the Eagles tied the score on an eight-play drive that was capped by a 4-yard touchdown run by tailback Ty Rice and the PAT by Stencil.

The Saint Ignatius' defense forced the Eagles to again punt from deep in their territory. Taking over at the St. Edward 45, Alexander led a four-play drive that featured a 43-yard pass down the middle to wide receiver Nigel Drummond II and Danny's 2-yard, game winning touchdown that was followed by another extra point by Trickett with 1:13 left on the fourth-quarter clock.

St. Edward's final possession began at its 20-yard line after Trickett sent another kickoff into the end zone and. Pressure from Joyce and lineman Zach McMahan resulted in a tipped pass. The Eagles' night ended on an incomplete pass with just 23 seconds remaining in the game.
