

HHA was formed in 1975. They skated outdoors at Burton Park and had 75 skaters that year. They moved indoors in a Tefloncoated bubble in 1980. The original boards inside were purchased from the NY Rangers which lead to HHA originally picking red, white and blue as the associations colors.

Try Out Fees

Do you ever wonder why you get charged for tryouts and what exactly the fees cover? For starters, it is an additional expense Charged to players because it is an optional add-on, meaning not everyone participates in tryouts and at certain levels tryouts are not even available. When completing the annual registration fee analysis, tryouts are excluded for this reason and is treated as an add-on feature. In FY20, HHA collected \$7,500.00 in registration fees. While the actual expenses vary slightly year over year, on average as shown in the Chart below, 40% of fees cover ice rental expense, 38% for 3rd party goalie tryout assistance, 15% covers 3rd party (non-parent) evaluator expenses, and 7% covers miscellaneous tryout expenses. Miscellaneous items typically include food for volunteers, signage, and various equipment needs.
