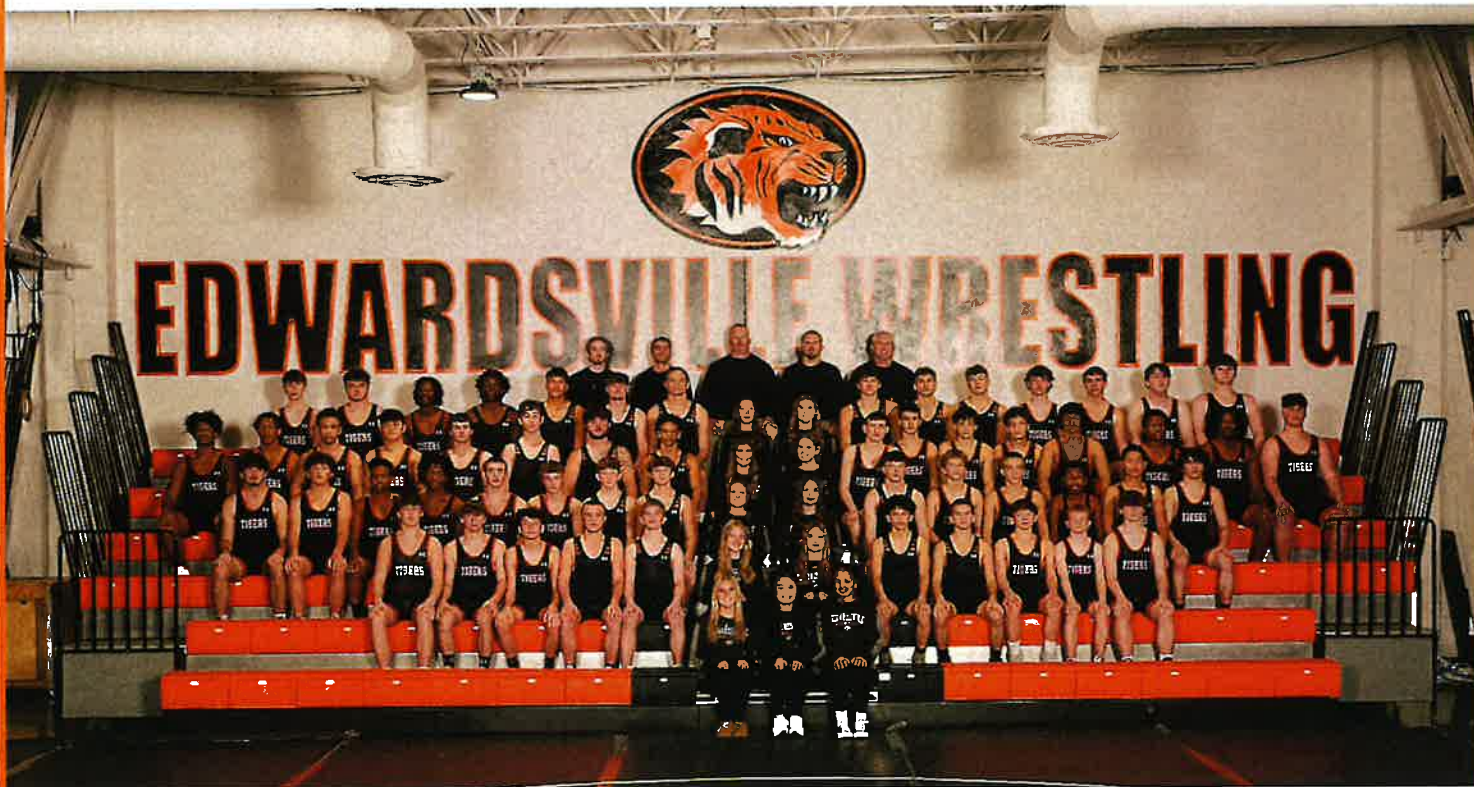

Varsity Overview

Parents, Wrestlers, and Tiger Wrestling Fans welcome to another end of the year celebration where we get to honor our wrestlers. This season, our wrestling program was built around the theme "Burn the Boats," a powerful reminder of what it means to fully commit with no retreat and no excuses. In wrestling, there is no backing away from the challenge in front of you. The wrestlers' step onto the mat alone, face adversity head on, and fight through every position until the final whistle. "Burn the Boats" represented the mindset our athletes embraced all season: giving full effort, trusting their preparation, and refusing to quit when matches became difficult. The lessons learned through this approach go far beyond wins and losses, teaching our wrestlers resilience, accountability, and the confidence to face obstacles with determination, both on the mat and in life.

Our vision for the program is ***"To compete at a high level against elite competition with integrity"***. It is easy to do right thing when things are easy, but just like in life this sport is not easy. I am proud of the way the wrestlers fought through adversity all season long with integrity. We finished the season with a 14-3 record, which resulted in our 15th in a row Southwest Conference Title. This season's success was driven not only by our 14 starters, but by the depth, commitment, and readiness of the entire team. When a starter was out, other wrestlers stepped up without hesitation, earning key wins and proving that our strength came from everyone being prepared, confident, and willing to answer the call when the team needed them most. The Southwest Conference Championship is not something taken for granted but was a goal the wrestlers achieved. Excited for next year with the addition of 3 more teams and having an individual conference tournament in 26-27. The team took care of business at Francis Howell North Tournament and came away as Tournament Champions. The historic Dvorak Tournament was a measuring stick for the wrestlers. The Tigers were able to leave the tournament with 4 individual medals (Michael, Ryan, Roman, Braylon) and a 12th place finish out of 46 teams. The next stop on our journey was the highly competitive Cheesehead Tournament, where every match challenged our wrestlers and served as a valuable learning experience against top-level competition. Facing such a strong field pushed our athletes to grow both technically and mentally. Michael McNamara battled his way into the Top 8 earning an individual medal. The St. Charles West Tournament gave our wrestlers the opportunity to wrestle freely and aggressively, with the confidence that the postseason was just around the corner. The team put together an outstanding performance, leaving the tournament as overall champions and bringing home an impressive 14 individual medals.

The goal of the season is constant growth and development, with the team reaching its peak when it matters most, during the postseason. That goal was clearly achieved at the regional tournament, where the Tigers delivered a strong performance on the day. Nine wrestlers advanced to the finals, and five were crowned Individual Champions. Just as important, every one of the 14 wrestlers contributed by battling for team points, supporting one another, and competing with purpose. This resulted in yet another hard earned Team Regional Championship. The Tigers took on hosting duties for the 3a Sectional Tournament, where there are only barn burner of matches every time you step on the mat. Even though some wrestlers' individual season ended that weekend, they competed at a high level against elite competition with integrity. It was historic day for the Tigers, where they went 4-0 in the blood round and sending a total of 7 wrestlers to the IHSA State Tournament. If you were in the gym during the blood round, you witness the spark that motivated the rest of the team when Bryson Nuttall came back 0-14 with a pin. Michael McNamara, Tim Swaim, Bryson Nuttall, Ryan Richie, Simon Schulte, Roman Janek, and Braylon Hill-Lomax punched their ticket to the IHSA State Championship. This ties the record for most wrestlers sent by EHS to the 3a State Tournament. The momentum carried over into the State Tournament when they Tigers set another school record with a total of 4 State Placers: Michael McNamara 3rd, Ryan Richie 6th, Roman Janek 3rd, Braylon Hill-Lomax 5th.

This year was a little different with doing Dual Team Sectionals between Regionals and Sectionals. Before that dual started, I asked the 21 wrestlers who were on the roster to do one thing, when they walk off the mat to be able to look the seniors in the eye and say they left it all out there. That is what we saw that night when we wrestled Lincoln Way West. With the dual starting at 106, the first three wrestlers set the tone and gave us the momentum we needed to finish strong. The score was 30-28 going into the last match. Braylon was not going to be denied and finished the match off with a pin for the Tigers to win 36-28. This is the 6th team in program history to make it to the Elite 8. Even though Friday night at Dual Team State did not end the way we wanted against Montini, the boys fought hard and proud of them.

Varsity Overview

Tonight, we take time to honor and say goodbye to our senior class. While we are graduating a large group, the legacy they leave behind will remain a permanent part of this program. Their coachability, relentless work ethic, and genuine love for Edwardsville Wrestling have set a standard that cannot be measured. We are excited to see where life and wrestling take each of you next, but know this will always be home. You will always be an Edwardsville Wrestling Tiger. To our underclassmen, this moment serves as a challenge: who is ready to step forward and lead? Moving ahead, actions must align with words, and expectations must be met with effort. If there is one word to carry with you, it is consistency. We are excited to see the commitment, growth, and work you will put in during the offseason as you continue to build on the foundation laid by those before you. The 2026 season was also a season where a total of four wrestlers made the 100 win club: Bryson Nuttall, Ryan Richie, Simon Schulte, and Roman Janek. To reach a 100 wins with our level competition is an impressive feat and speaks volume of their commitment.

Thank you to all of our wrestlers and parents for trusting us with the responsibility of coaching this program. That trust is something we never take lightly, and it is truly an honor to work with athletes who are willing to put in the work and refuse to back down from challenges. Every wrestling journey is different, and comparison can quickly steal the joy from growth and progress. Along the way, there will be highs that reward your effort and lows that test your resolve, but those moments are where character is built. No matter where that journey leads, know that as long as you are part of Edwardsville Wrestling, you are never walking it alone. This program stands for commitment, resilience, and the belief that when the work gets hard, we lean in and keep moving forward together. ***Tiger Style***

Varsity Girls Wrestling Overview

Girls Wrestling – Here to stay!!!! 365 more wrestlers entered the regional tournament this year, for a large increase in participation Statewide for the 5th consecutive year. Our program at Edwardsville is continuing its growth, with a great combination of new and experienced girls. A combination that I hope continues. Our season was full of highlights, learning experiences, growth, setbacks, and fun and laughs. It's so rewarding to watch the development of the girls and our wrestling program. Our participation increased to 27 girls completing the season. Although the numbers slowed in increases it did not slow in commitment and dedication. With our combination of experience and new girls, all of them took the opportunity to get better in their skills.

The girl's wrestling schedule was once again full of competition, as we participated in 5 regular season tournaments, including – Granite City, Pontiac "The Munch", St. Charles West, SW Conference and our own 618 tourney. This year's team bought home 3 Tournament Championships. On top of that, we were also crowned both Regional and Sectional Champions in the post season. Dual wise, the Tiger girls dominated!!! The girls were 19-1, including wins over some of the best teams in Illinois and Missouri.

This year the tiger girls qualified for the IWCOA Girl's Dual Team State Tournament, held in Dekalb. Through a selection process, we were one of 16 teams invited to the event. We finished 5 and 1 in the event, capturing 3rd place in the State..... Our lone loss came to State Champions – Lincoln Way Coop in a highly competitive match. This is our top finish, and I believe the girls have the mindset that next year can be even better. It was a highly competitive event and showed how much fun the duals can be.

This year's post season just ended, and it's been a competitive 4 weeks. We won the regional and sent 10 girls on to the Sectional tournament in Virden. Out of the Virden sectional, we matched the school record for girls in 6 State Qualifiers, including 2 Sectional Champions in Victoria White and Emma Rogers. Only Lincoln Way Coop had more State Qualifiers than us. It was a great, but not easy experience for the girls at State, as the Tigers brought home 1 State Medal in Emma Rogers' 6th place finish. Although some may not have met their individual goals, it had nothing to do with their will, effort, preparation and fortitude. Us coaches couldn't be more proud.

Pride comes not only in wins and losses, and wins and losses does not define our program. A group of girls on a wrestling team quickly learn that the sport is about far more than winning matches or standing on a podium. Through challenging practices, tough conditioning, and the courage it takes to step onto the mat, they build resilience, discipline, and confidence that carries into every part of their lives. They push one another through losses and celebrate with small improvements that others may never even notice, forming friendships rooted in trust and shared struggle. Teammates become like sisters – sparring with each other in workouts, offering advice, and reminding each other of their strength on hard days. In the process, they discover that character, perseverance, and belonging are victories that last long after the final whistle.

Here at the banquet, we want to celebrate an awesome season but remember to also not be satisfied. We will lose 4 Seniors, but have a multitude of experience, including 5 state qualifiers returning next year. Next year could have the potential to be just as successful or even more so. Unfortunately, all the returners in the world does not make us better if we rest on our laurels. To continue to climb the ladder we must continue to get better. I challenge all the girls to stay active in the sport and see how far we can reach.

Lastly, I am so thankful for my wonderful assistant coach Carly Foster, and all of her dedication and guidance in developing these girls. It inspires me as she does all this along with being a full-time mother of Baby Harow. She is such a motivated and tireless person. Also, a special Thank you to Coach Sara Doty, for her continued support of the girls and helping us during the practices, even with all her involvement with EWC. We have a talented team of girls, but that starts with these lady coaches, as was on display when I almost died in Champaign . LOL

2025-2026 Junior Varsity Season Overview

The junior varsity team had another outstanding season. The wrestlers and their parents should be proud of their accomplishments. This year's team had a combined dual meet record of 24-1, another very impressive season.
