- When adding players to the rosters, do NOT add accurate address information. 123 Main Street, Minneapolis, MN, 12345 will suffice.
- Coaches must enter game results and pitch counts on the MBL website by
 10:00 am the following day.

Scheduling Your Season

- Turn in team blackout dates to Rob ASAP
- MBL will assign your Region and provide the opposing coaches contact info on or before 3/29
- Coaches will receive home field dates/times assignments by 3/30.
- Scheduling will occur among coaches between 4/2 and 4/6 via phone, email, in-person, or google sheet (recommended)
- MBL FAQs: https://www.mbl.bz/pages/fag-scheduling
- Try to schedule home games early in the season
- Friday and weekend game slots are readily available
- As scheduling progresses, more home slots may open up
 - Coaches, please provide me with the fields you DIDN'T use after your schedule is complete so I can offer them to other coaches.
- Enter home games into your MBL team page no later than 4/6

Additional Field Info

9-13U: 19 Teams

- Potential field crunch this year in June
- Opening weekend May 3rd and 4th at Neiman. We have invited 612 softball to play on our unused fields
- ALL Millers travel teams are expected to schedule a game on opening day

14-14/15U: 4 Teams

- Opening day May 4th at Parade 1 slot per team
- Additional weekend Parade time for each team possible
- Slots at Neiman, Pearl, Van Cleve and Quilici also available
- All April/May games will be scheduled late at 8:15 to avoid high school conflicts. I will look to move these earlier, to 7:30, if there is no one scheduled earlier on the same field.



Game Day Guidelines

- No new inning after 1:45 minutes of play at Neiman
- No more than 5 warm up pitches between innings
- These rules should be stated clearly in pregame umpire meeting
- Call out the time of first pitch so everyone is aware
- At Neiman:
 - 9-13U teams place mounds in batting cages after the 8:15 game
 or if there isn't a MYBA game after the 6:00 pm game
 - 14U-14/15U teams must cover the mound after the game when starting at 8:15 or if there doesn't appear to be a game after the 6:00 pm game



Rain-Out Procedures

BEFORE THE GAME

- MPRB will determine whether to close Neiman (usually by 3:30)
- Travel Director notifies coaches by email and phone/text
- Exception: On weekends, it's the coach's call, 2-3 hrs before game time.
- Coach notifies families and opposing coach and changes game status to "Cancelled' on MBL website
- Reschedule games ASAP work with Travel Director and opposing coach.

DURING GAME

- Coaches and umpire make determination to suspend
- If suspended, mark as "suspended" on MBL website
- Work with Travel Director and opponent to complete game MBL expects this
 - *MYBA does not maintain an inventory of unused fields so try to secure 2 or 3 possible makeup dates to limit back and forth.



"Panic Procedures" at Neiman

Fields Double-Booked

- Contact Travel Director (Rob)
- 2. Contact President (Dave)
- 3. Be prepared to reschedule

Facilities Issues (Lights, Bases not set, Field locked, etc)

- 1. Have parents help measure and set bases if needed.
- 2. Contact Travel Director (Rob)

*** There is no longer a key at Neiman for the light box. MPRB can turn them on remotely if needed, and they were pretty responsive about this in 2024. ***

Umpire No-Show

- 1. Contact MN Umpire Association (Ken Walerius 612-518-0547) and Rob
- 2. Be prepared to begin game with parents/coaches umpiring





Important MBL Rules: Conduct Towards Umpires

<u>Item #1</u>: Modification to NFHS 3-3-1-f: Any coach, player or spectator who confronts, abuses, or follows an umpire outside the fenced area or otherwise demarked area of an individual baseball field will be suspended from their affiliated team's games indefinitely.

Item #2: If a coach, player or spectator is ejected from a league or tournament game, they are suspended for the next MBL league/playoff game or MBT qualifying or state tournament game on the team's schedule at the time of the ejection.

<u>Item #3</u>: If a spectator who has previously been warned by an umpire regarding unsportsmanlike or disruptive behavior during a game is subsequently ejected from said game, the head coach of that team is also ejected, and subject to suspension rules regarding coach/player ejections.



MBL Pitch Count Rules

- Violations have to be reported before the game ends
- The violating team will no longer be subject to forfeiture in regular season or MBT play
 - League Game Violation: Player is removed as pitcher and can't pitch for the remainder of the week. The coach is ejected and suspended for 1 game.
- During MBT tournament play
 - the coach will be ejected from the remainder of tournament
 - the pitcher who violated the pitching rules can continue to play every other position except pitcher for the remainder of the tournament
- New: MBT tournaments
 - 9-13U cumulative pitch count = 25 fewer
 - 14U-14/15A cumulative pitch count = 15 fewer

Practice Scheduling

- Coaches/Managers will receive a Google Sheet asking for your practice dates for the entire season after your MBL schedule is finalized
- MYBA will request additional practice fields if necessary after April 15th
- The goal is to provide your entire season practice schedule to you by May 1st
- Will likely have 5:30 7:00 and 7:00 8:30 practices on the same field.
- Coordinate with seasoned coaches to share ideas or co-op
- Reach out to Josh and Joe Larson if you need practice support

Note: we may not be able to accommodate the exact field size for every practice






GameChanger

GameChanger Overview

Accurate and consistent GameChanger stats help all players end up on a team where they can contribute, have fun and continue to develop!

For anyone who helps with GameChanger during the season, please consider the following:

- All teams must use the MYBA assigned GC account.
- Score the whole game, including opposing team at bats since those are important pitching stats for our players.
- Make sure you have the right players at the right positions for each inning.
- Use appropriate age-level judgement to score errors in the field.
 - ex. A soft ground ball that the pitcher fields and overthrows first when the runner is halfway to first is probably an error vs. a hard-hit ground ball to third that the fielder knocks down but doesn't make a throw is probably a hit.
 - ex. A dropped fly ball hit within 5-10 feet of an outfielder is probably an error, a dropped fly ball that a fielder had to sprint to get to is probably a hit.
 - ex. A single that turns into a home run because of multiple fielding errors should be scored
 as a single with multiple errors, and not a home run.
 - ex. If the catcher doesn't catch the pitch, a "stolen" base should be scored as a passed ball and not a stolen base. A pitch the catcher can't make a play on is a wild pitch







Team Volunteer Dibs

Additional team volunteer positions include game changer and team managers.

Game Changer (max 2 per team)

- Need 1-2 volunteers to run game changer (GC) for the season for each team.
- Limiting to 1-2 volunteers keeps consistent stats.
- If you are interested, please coordinate with your team manager
- GC will fulfill your dibs requirement!

Team Manager (max 2 per team)

- Discussed in later slides.
- Similar to GC, team managers will fulfill their dibs requirements.

Risk Management

Risk Management

Background Checks

- MYBA conducts background checks on all coaches and on-field volunteers
- O Teresa Roberson (Risk Mgr) has begun sending out instructions
- MYBA pays for 4 background checks per team, the rest are still mandatory but must be covered by the team
- Anyone helping with the players (practice or game) or in the dugout must have a background check

Certifications

- Links to trainings to be sent out with background check
- Concussion training refresh every year from date of completion
- Abuse awareness (a.k.a Safe Sport) refresh every year from date of completion
- Required for anyone on field (practice or game) or in dugout with players
- Training certs should be with team at all times
- Risk manager and Travel director receive copies of certs

Equipment

Coach Shirts and Hats (travel)

- MYBA provides shirts and hats for up to four coaches per team
 - Travel hat (matches player uniform kit)
 - Athletic style t-shirt with Millers 'M' logo
 - This year you have the option to choose navy blue, orange, or white
 - If a team has more than four coaches, team is responsible for paying for additional items:
 - Travel Coach hat: \$25
 - Coach shirt: \$35
 - Small addt. fee if paying by Venmo

• Order process

- MYBA Asset Team will send order form to coaches and Cc team managers (watch for this week of 3/24)
- One order form per coach needed indicating sizes and shirt color
- Asset Team will coordinate with Team Managers when items are ready for distribution

Every team's bag contains:

- o 36 new game balls
- 45 practice balls + bucket
- 2 sets catcher gear
- Socknet
- First Aid Kit
- Measuring Tape
- Tee
- Base diggers

Optional Gear (Upon Request)

- Throw Down Bases
- Cones
- Fungo and/or Accubat (limited quantity)
- L-screen
- Bat weights
- Left handed catcher mitt

- Equipment Pickup is Tuesday, March 25 and Thursday, March 27 6:00pm-8:30pm
 - Location: MSA Batting Cages, 2020 W 98th St, Bloomington MN 55431
 - Equipment will distributed from the loading dock behind the building, drive around to #2030. The garage door will be open.
 - Can't make it? Send an assistant or manager or parent.
 - Contact <u>AssetManager@mplsmillers.org</u> if alternate arrangements are needed.
 - 12U -14/15U uniforms will be available soon, date TBD.
 - 9U 11U uniforms have been ordered, and will have a separate pick up date/time.
 - Uniforms SHOULD NOT BE HANDED OUT until you have verified with the Registrar that every player has paid their fees.



Equipment Headaches – Lost Balls and Gear

In-season:

- Up to 50% of practice balls are lost each year
- Some truly will be lost or unplayable, but most are not
- The ask: After every practice, all players sweep the outfield for strays
- Please save game balls as backup game balls or practice based on their condition.
- Check for all gear after games and practices.
- Contact <u>AssetManager@mplsmillers.org</u> if gear changes are needed in season

End of season:

- Return gear in good condition and/or let us know if there are any broken or missing items.
- Clean out your bag! Take personal equipment, and we don't want your half eaten seed bags or leaky water bottles



Equipment Additional Reminders

No metal cleats on MYBA turf mounds for practice or games. This applies to home and visiting teams, and includes the mounds at Neiman. Ages 13U and up that are permitted to use metal cleats should share this info with their pitchers and opposing coaches. Pitchers will need to wear plastic/molded cleats or tennis shoes.





Improving Player Experience

What Makes a Successful Season?

- Kids look forward to coming to the field
- When season ends, kids are excited for the next one
- Kids feel valued
- Kids have improved as players from the start of the season
- Kids learn respect for game, opponents, umpires, etc
- Parents feel their children had fun and improved



What are Common Gripes?

- **#1** Feedback regarding player development
- #2 The team was not competitive
- #3 Focus on player development and fundamentals
- #4 Coaches used redirection/discipline appropriately with each player
- #5 Fairness of positions



How Are We Addressing This?

- Coaching certification program
- Trainings for coaches to give them the tools to support effective practices
- Mid-season Player Evaluations
- Enforce the MYBA Codes of Conduct for players/parents
- MYBA created guidelines for playing time and positioning
- Address disciplinary issues quickly (we will have a formal process for that this season)
- Guiding coaches on supporting neurodivergent players
- Postseason meetings with coaches to review parent survey feedback

Disciplinary Standards

- Coaches must enforce the rules regarding player behavior
- The following behavior is unacceptable while wearing a Millers jersey:
 - Disrespect of teammates. This includes bullying and denigrating playing ability
 - Disrespect of opponents
 - Any emotional display which reflects poorly on the Millers
 - Insubordination
 - Obscenity
 - Mistreatment of equipment
 - Mistreatment of umpires
 - Any other violation of Player Code of Conduct



Disciplinary Standards - Consequences

- First offense (Mulligan) Coach discusses violation with player and parents
- Second offense Coach benches player for remainder of game and discusses violation with player and parents
 - If violation outside of game, player is benched for next game
- Third offense: Benched for remainder of game AND next game, coach discusses with player and parents, MYBA President notified
 - If violation outside of game, player is benched for next game
- Fourth offense: Player is removed from game/practice, matter is referred to MYBA President
 - We will be providing coaches with a way to document disciplinary issues and commitment/attitude/effort concerns so we can support and address any problems prior to the end of the season.



Coach Evaluation and Feedback Process

- Post-season survey distributed to parents
 - Feedback shared in post-season review
- Post-season reviews with all Head Coaches in September/October



Playing Time and Positions

NOTE: These are GUIDELINES and not POLICIES. But if a parent complains the guidelines aren't being followed, historically MYBA is inclined to side with the parents

9U-12U Guidelines:

- All players should have at least 5 games with 3 innings played in the infield
- All players should have at least 5 games with 2 innings played in the outfield
- Each player should spend at least 20 innings at 2 positions (OF counts as 1 position)
- No player should sit more than 2 innings in a game (assumes 11-12 player roster)
- All players should have at least 5 games in top half of batting order
- Players interested in pitching with enough control to do so safely should be allowed at least one opportunity to pitch a complete IP, those too wild should be developed for future use
- Strive to develop at least 2 Catchers and 6 Pitchers (>20 innings pitched)



Playing Time and Positions

13-14U Guidelines

- Each player should spend at least 20 innings at 2 positions (14U only)
- No player should sit more than 3 innings in a game (assumes 11-12 person roster)
- Players interested in pitching with enough control to do so safely should be allowed at least one opportunity to pitch a complete IP, those too wild should be developed for future use
- Strive to develop at least 2 Catchers and 6 Pitchers (>20 innings pitched)



Recommend Playing Time and Positions

- League play = More balanced approach; Tournament play = More competitive approach
- Balanced approach
 - Continuous batting order
 - Large pitching rotation Entire team pitches
 - First 4 innings: All players have 2 innings IF, 1 OF, 1 bench
 - Last 2 innings: Dictated by situation
 - Give all players token opps at key positions they want to play
- Competitive approach
 - Optimized batting order and defensive positions
 - Narrower pitching rotation



Arm Care New 2025 Pitching Restrictions

- Focus is on REST Days for pitchers
- MBL League Game Restrictions



MYBA Arm Care Policy

- Adopting modified MBL standards as follows:
 - Rest days enforced during league play
 - Rest days carry over from league to tournament
 - MBL rest days otherwise waived during tournament
 - Rest days carry over from league to tournament. Rest days aggregate to max of 3
 - Example: 10U team has Thursday league game followed by tournament. Zach throws 30 P Thursday. He cannot pitch the tournament Friday. He throws 50 P Saturday. He is eligible to pitch tournament Sunday and throws another 50 P. His 100 P in the tournament = 3 days rest. He must rest until Thursday
- To ensure compliance, coach/manager must enter pitch counts on MBL website by 10:00 the following morning AND before start of tournament. Tournament compliance mechanism TBD
- When your players report arm pain, listen to them and rest them
- Develop at least 6 pitchers to throw at least 20 IP. "I have no pitching depth" is NOT an
 acceptable answer for grinding down a young arm







Practice Recommendations

Preseason

- Define preseason practice schedule at kickoff meeting
- 4-5 practices/wk Bad weather? Go to an indoor facility!

In-Season

- Define full in-season practice schedule once games are finalized
- 2-3 practices/wk
- Never have 2 straight days off fit a practice in there
- At least 3 coaches running practice to increase productivity
- Encourage parent participation as needed.

Team Managers

Team Manager - Roles & Responsibilities

Team Manager

- Each team can have up to 2 managers.
- Each would receive DIBS.

Uniforms

- Pick up uniforms
- Determine if team is going to embroider the hats.
- Distribute to the team (Prior to distribution check to make sure all players have paid their season fees)
- Determine if your team would vote to do the 3rd alternate uniform.

Schedule*

- Manage all tournaments, games, practices and events in SportsEngine and Game Changer (work with coaches to do so)
- Collect and Manage Black Out Dates for players
- Facilitate game reschedules with opponents, MYBA Travel Director and coaches (Coach preference)
- End of Season Team party

Team Binder

 Birth Certificates, Emergency Contact Info & Consent, Photocopy Insurance Card, Parent & Player Code of Conduct, Coach documents (SafeSport, Concussion, and Background check)



Team Manager - Roles & Responsibilities

Coordination & Communication

- Populate tournament specific paperwork including acquiring signatures from parents if necessary
- Collect money from team for incidentals (Team Fees)
- Draft and send communications to the team (weekly is suggested)
- Enter in score and pitch counts into MBL at the end of a game (work with coach to decide who will do this after each game)

Tournaments

- Complete tournament roster
- Acquire waiver signatures for tournaments if applicable
- Coordinate logistics for dugout needs (ie Gatorade & Snacks), team lunch / picnic between games
- Check the team in the day of the tournament
- Responsible for paying Gate Fee if applicable
- Arrange travel logistics if applicable (hotel, team get together etc..) or ask another parent to help

Team Manager - Best Practices

MONEY

- Meet with your coaches and set up a proposed budget.
- Review MYBA's guidelines for fundraising and sponsorships
- Budget items may include:
 - Fundraising goal
 - Team fee (individual family fees based on age group/fundraising goal)
 - Revenue sources
 - Potential expenses
 - Sponsorship/Donation goals
- Create a financial tracker. Some teams choose to have a separate money manager and overall team manager to assist with the process of team funds.
