GATES OPEN

ONLY the South ticket gates will be open starting at 1PM Friday & 9AM Saturday

BAG CHECKS

Sparks Stadium personnel conduct bag checks prior to spectators entering the facility.

Examples of items not allowed on PSD property: Firearms and ammunition, explosives/fireworks, gas-based portable heaters, illegal narcotics/drug paraphernalia, alcoholic beverages and marijuana, knives (regardless of length), glass bottles and containers, non-service animals. Other items may be added without posting.

DIRECTIONS TO SPARKS STADIUM

From I-5: take WA-512 (Exit 127 east) toward PUYALLUP / Take the MERIDIAN ST S exit. / Turn LEFT onto S MERIDIAN / Turn LEFT onto 7th Ave SW / End at 601 7th Ave SW, Puyallup, WA 98371-6816, US

From Hwy 167 South: take WA-512 West toward PUYALLUP & OLYMPIA / Take the MERIDIAN ST S exit. / Turn RIGHT onto S MERIDIAN / Turn LEFT onto 7th Ave SW / End at 601 7th Ave SW, Puyallup, WA 98371-6816, US

SPECTATOR PARKING

The actual paved stadium parking lot on the south side of Sparks can accommodate 120 cars. There is curbside parking on surrounding streets or in the Puyallup Fair Red Lot immediately adjacent to Sparks Stadium on the south side of the facility.

Tailgating is not allowed on Puyallup SD property nor on Washington State Fair property.

TEAM BUS PARKING

Teams arriving in a bus will be sent directions about parking on the home or visitor side of the stadium.

SIDELINES & TEAM BENCH

Both team benches will be placed on the SAME sideline (north side of the stadium) and on the TRACK Surface. Only participants (coaches, players, managers, and trainers) will be allowed on the field. ***All Fans are restricted to the south grandstand.*** Benches are separated by 10 yards and off the turf. A fourth registered soccer official is placed at a table between the benches to assist in substitution and bench control.

Home team will warm up on the east end (street side) of the field and occupy the EAST TEAM BENCH. Visiting Team will warm up on the west end (scoreboard side) of the field and occupy the WEST TEAM BENCH.

NO SEEDS, GUM OR FOOD OF ANY KIND ALLOWED ON THE TURF. SCHOOLS VIOLATING THIS RULE WILL BE BILLED FOR CLEANUP COSTS.

SQUAD / SIDELINE SIZE - STRICTLY ENFORCED

22 Players

6 Designated school personnel

2 Supervisors (Names on the pass list)

LOCKER ROOMS

HOME SCHOOL will use the south grandstand locker room (under the home grandstand).

VISITORS will use the north grandstand locker room (under the visitor grandstand).

GAME JERSEYS

HOME SCHOOL will wear DARK COLORED JERSEYS

VISITING SCHOOL will wear LIGHT COLORED JERSEYS

PRE-MATCH OFFICIAL'S AND COACH'S MEETING

The tournament manager will meet with the participating schools' head coaches **one hour before their school's designated first match on Friday.** The agenda will include: medical aspects, warm up procedures, pre-match procedures (including introductions, starting time, tie-breaker procedures,

review rule issues, instruction for sideline ball holders, games committee, sportsmanship, and other items of interest). No meeting will be held on the second day.

PRE-GAME SCHEDULE

Pre-game warm up will be a minimum of 15 minutes. If time allows, teams will be given up to 20 minutes of pre-match warm up time. The stadium scoreboard clock will be set to go to 0:00 five minutes prior to the start time of the match:

- At 0:00 – teams line up at their respective team benches for International March Out
- March out to main grandstand side hash marks, and introduction of officials
- Team introductions, as follows:
 - Visiting team – reserves, starters, and coaches
 - Home team - reserves, starters, and coaches
 - When announced, individuals should step out and acknowledge their introduction
- Teams turn to face the American flag on the west end of the field. The National Anthem will be sung or played before each match.
- Teams face each other and advance to midfield to shake hands before returning to their bench
- Match begins

HALF TIME INTERMISSION

The half time intermission shall be 10 minutes. The timer will start the clock once the home team crosses the field and most of the players are off the track towards the home locker room.

MATCH RULES

FIFA RULES will be used in all State playoff games with WIAA published exceptions.

The method of breaking ties will be as follows:

Two (2) golden goal (5) minute overtimes. A coin toss shall be held prior to the first overtime as per Law 8. At the end of the first overtime period, teams shall change ends. If still tied at the end of the second overtime, penalty kicks will decide the outcome. The head referee shall choose the goal at which all of the kicks from the penalty mark shall be taken. Each coach will select five (5) players, including the goalkeeper, only players who are *on the field* of play at the end of the match are eligible take the kicks. A coin toss shall be held with the winning team having choice of kicking first or second. Teams will alternate kickers. There is no follow up on the kick. The defending team may change goalkeepers with an eligible player prior to each penalty kick. Following the five (5) kicks, the team scoring on the greatest number of kicks shall be declared the winner. If the score remains tied, each coach shall select five (5) different players than the first five to take kicks until one team has scored a goal more than the other from the same number of kicks.

BALLS

All WIAA tournament matches require the team to use the Spalding “TF 5000”. The WIAA will be providing the tournament soccer game balls.

OFFICIALS

Four (4) WOA certified soccer officials will be assigned to each match. Officials are selected by their association to work at this tournament and are assigned by the WIAA. The officials will be head referee and two assistant referees along with a fourth official who acts as the timer and scorer. Official assessors may also be assigned. The assessor will provide the WIAA with an independent evaluation of the tournament as a WIAA event.

OFFICIAL SCORER

The official scorer will verify each team’s complete lineup, record all scores, record the number and reason for all players cautioned and disqualified, and will obtain the head referee’s verification of a score. The fourth referee is the official scorer.

CLOCK

The official time will be kept on the field by the center official. The stadium clock is unofficial.

MEDICAL

The tournament medical authority will be a Certified Athletic Trainer from ATI Physical Therapy on duty for each game. If a team will have a team physician and/or athletic trainer in attendance, please complete the WIAA form and present it to the tournament manager upon arrival at the site. The tournament medical authority will make the final determination regarding return to play.

GAMES COMMITTEE

The Games Committee will include the following:

- Tournament Manager – Jim Meyerhoff
- WIAA Officials Liaison – Dave Augustavo
- WIAA Representative – (If Present)
- Field Supervisor – Keith Patefield
- Coach not involved in the tournament

The Games Committee, composed of a least three of the individuals listed above, will hear, and decide on any protest and/or appeal.

SEATING

Home school will sit in the EAST half of the south grandstands (see page 8 of this packet). Student seating will be in the section immediately EAST (and adjacent) to the center section of the south grandstand. *WARNING: Viewing the game from the Student Section may be obstructed due to prolonged standing.*

Visiting School will sit in WEST half of the south grandstands (see page 8 of this packet). Student seating will be in the section immediately WEST (and adjacent) to the center section of the south grandstand. *WARNING: Viewing the game from the Student Section may be obstructed due to prolonged standing.*

WIAA tournament regulations provide that a section of seating **must be available** for students who wish to stand for prolonged periods. (WIAA State Tournament Packet.)

Spectators are not allowed to stand on the grandstand rail, or along the fence in front of the grandstand.

Cheer staff in uniform will be allowed on the asphalt area directly in front of their designated crowd/student section.

RESTROOMS

Restrooms are located behind the main grandstand. Locker rooms are for team use only. There are no public restrooms available in the locker rooms.

CONCESSIONS

The concession stands will be operated by the Puyallup School District and are located behind the south grandstand

SIGNS & SCHOOL BANNERS

NO signs other than the OFFICIAL SCHOOL BANNER will be allowed. Please inform your crowd.

BAND & ROOTER BUSES

Home and visiting school band buses or rooter buses will park in Puyallup Fairgrounds RED LOT (adjacent to Sparks Stadium) and enter the south grandstands from that point.

PLEASE CALL AHEAD IF YOUR SCHOOL IS BRINGING A ROOTER BUS. ALL rooter bus students may be unloaded at the SOUTH ticket gate where tickets will be sold and collected. Rooter buses will be parked FREE of charge in the Puyallup Fair Red Lot immediately adjacent to Sparks Stadium on the south side of the facility.

BAND SEATING – *please inform the tournament director if your school is bringing a band*

The home team band shall share the home school student section

The visiting team band shall share the visiting school student section

PRE-MATCH SUPERVISION MEETING

The event manager may meet and review supervisor expectations and issue supervisory passes at a meeting with the schools' head supervisors 30 minutes prior to the specified first match starting time for that team. A radio may be checked out to the head supervisor of each team. The supervisory list is limited to two (2) supervisors.

ADMINISTRATOR SUPERVISION

Each school should have an administrator or designee on site to supervise and assist with crowd control. Please enter the names of the supervisors on the tournament information pages located on the WIAA website. The names of the supervisors will be placed on a pass list. Only those supervisors, whose names appear on the pass list, will be allowed free entry. Once on site, the head supervisor should check in with the tournament manager.

Supervisors are required to sit in the student section representing their school and assume the responsibility of maintaining a sportsmanlike atmosphere during and after the match, until teams and spectators have dispersed. All spectators must remain behind the fenced areas of the playing field. No spectators are allowed on the sidelines or playing field before or after the match. All spectators are expected to display respect and good sportsmanship at this school event. WIAA regulations for spectators will be enforced. **Please remind students to wear shirts, to observe the stadium policy of no body or face paint, no masks, and to observe the WIAA Tournament policy.** If an issue with one of your students arises we will ask you to address it. Spectators must adhere to the directives of tournament staff.

DUTIES OF SCHOOL SUPERVISORS

- Report to the tournament manager at least 30 minutes prior to their team's first match.
- Must wear supervisor identification so that it is visible and easily seen.
- Sit with your school's student body and fans while your team is competing.
- Be active and visible in the cheering section with your student body and fans during all contests in order to discourage problems
- Be willing to approach students and/or community representatives who display inappropriate behavior.
- Notify tournament staff of potential problem individuals.
- Be of assistance as requested by facility security staff or tournament management staff.
- Be sure aisles and stairways are kept clear in the stands.
- Keep your students and fans from entering the playing surface.
- Assist in the orderly flow of traffic of fans entering and exiting the facility.
- At the conclusion of your game, assist your school's students and fans in leaving the bleachers.
- Foster the traits of good sportsmanship.

AWARDS

Academic State Champions

The soccer team with the highest team grade point average in each WIAA classification will be presented a plaque in recognition of academic achievement. If one of the teams in the tournament is a recipient, the presentation will take place prior to the Saturday game during team introductions. If the recipient is not a tournament participant, the presentation will take place during half time of the championship match for their classification.

Participation Certificates

All participants in the state tournament will receive participation certificates. These certificates will be mailed to each school by the WIAA Office.

Trophies

Trophies will be awarded to all teams, 1st through 4th. The trophies will be presented at the conclusion of each match on Saturday. A WIAA traveling trophy will also be presented to the championship team.

BRACKETS

The soccer tournament brackets are available on the WIAA website – www.wiaa.com . An updated bracket will be displayed on-site, and will be presented to the champion of each classification as part of the post-game awards ceremony.

BALL HOLDERS

The site manager may provide ball holders behind each goal. Alternate soccer balls will be placed at strategic locations on the sidelines.

LODGING

A listing of motels is available on request.

PICTURES

The WIAA has contracted Northwest Sports Photography to be the official photographer for the state tournaments. A photographer will take a team picture approximately 75 minutes before your team's first match on Friday (prior to the Coaches Meeting). One complimentary 8"x10" picture will be given to the school. Players will be able to order additional copies.

PROGRAM INFORMATION

The roster, team information, and season information sheets to be published in the State Tournament Souvenir Programs are available on the WIAA Website at www.wiaa.com.

RADIO AND TELEVISION COVERAGE

Stations wishing to broadcast or televise the match must have the prior approval of the WIAA.

SPORTSMANSHIP MEDALLIONS

After each match, tournament officials will award two sportsmanship medallions to players who displayed good sportsmanship throughout the match.

VIDEO TAPING/FILMING

All filming will be done from the spectator seating area. No special arrangements will be provided to schools.
