Game Preview

Louisville City FC has completed arguably its greatest season ever, setting a league points record, posting the best full-season defensive mark in club history, and finishing with just one league loss — all culminating in a Players' Shield title.

But now, the USL Championship Playoffs are here — and to be remembered as champions, LouCity needs to keep its foot on the accelerator for four more games.

It would be the club's third crown, which would be the most by a single club in league history. For the winningest club in the USL Championship, that distinction would be well earned.

First up on the road to a title: Detroit City FC. The No. 8 seed in the Eastern Conference, Detroit earned the final playoff place on the season's final day, clinching thanks to an Indy Eleven loss at Orange County SC.

The two sides, Louisville and Detroit, enter the playoffs on different trajectories. Louisville enters on a 16-game unbeaten run. Detroit has won just one of its last seven.

Louisville City boasted the league's best defense (19 goals allowed) and second-best attack (56 goals) — a league-best plus-37 goal differential.

Detroit boasted the league's seventh-stingiest defense (35 goals allowed) but also its seventh-least potent attack (33 goals), a minus-2 goal differential, third worst among playoff teams.

Still, in the USL Championship any team can go on a postseason run — just look at three of the last four champions. None of the Colorado Springs Switchbacks (2024), Phoenix Rising FC (2023), or Orange County SC (2021) finished in the top four of the Players' Shield race in the regular season.

In fact, you have to go back to 2022 to find the kind of results that Louisville hopes to replicate: the Players' Shield champion San Antonio FC went on to win the league title, defeating LouCity in the Championship Final. LouCity would be the fifth team in league history to do the double.

It starts with a 7 p.m. kickoff at Lynn Family Stadium, where LouCity will have home field advantage throughout the postseason. For tickets and more information, visit [LouCity.com/playoffs](https://louisvillecityfc.com/playoffs).

Storylines to follow...

Familiar foe: Saturday will be the fourth time that LouCity has faced Detroit City in a knockout tournament setting. That's tied with the Indy Eleven and the Tampa Bay Rowdies for the most frequent knockout opponent in LouCity history. The two sides met in the U.S. Open Cup in 2016 and 2022, and the USL Championship Playoffs in 2023, a 4-0 LouCity win in the Eastern Conference Semifinal.

One-way traffic: Louisville City FC has the advantage in the all-time series with Detroit City, which dates to 2016. Louisville owns a 7-2-0 record in USL Championship play, across the regular season and playoffs, including a perfect 5-0-0 tally at home. LouCity also advanced on penalty kicks in both of the clubs' U.S. Open Cup meetings, in 2016 and 2022.

Golden Glove: Louisville City goalkeeper Damian Las earned the USL Championship's Golden Glove award, given to the top goalkeeper, after surrendering just 0.70 goals per game during the 2025 league season. It is the second time a LouCity player won the award (Kyle Morton – 2022).

Impenetrable fortress: LouCity finished the regular season unbeaten at Lynn Family Stadium for the first time in club history at 12-0-3. LouCity has lost at home just once this season across all competitions, in the U.S. Open Cup. LouCity is 15-1-3 in Butcher-town across the regular season, U.S. Open Cup and USL Jägermeister Cup this season.

First time out: LouCity has never failed to advance from its playoff opener. In 10 previous seasons, Louisville City has a 8-0-2 record, advancing in penalty shootouts in both 2022 and 2023. All but one of those games have been at home.

Upset minded: The last time Detroit City earned the eighth seed, the club pulled off the biggest upset in USL Championship Playoff history, defeating the 2023 Players' Shield champion Pittsburgh Riverhounds in 2023.

Club History

ABOUT THE CLUB

Since starting play in 2015, Louisville City FC has consistently raised the standard of American men's professional soccer both on and off the field.

LouCity is a member of the USL Championship, America's second division league, and anticipates entering the planned USL first division launching in 2027 or 2028.

The Championship's all-time winningest club, LouCity won the league title in both 2017 and 2018, making it the only team in league history to win back-to-back titles. Additionally, City won Eastern Conference crowns in 2019 and 2022 before claiming its first Players' Shield, awarded for a regular season title, in 2024.

From 2015 to 2023, nine straight seasons, Louisville City advanced to at least the Eastern Conference Final in the USL Championship playoffs — an unprecedented run of success in American soccer.

In 2020, LouCity moved into its home Lynn Family Stadium, a purpose-built, soccer-specific facility in Louisville's Butchertown neighborhood just east of downtown. The stadium can accommodate 15,304 fans and also serves as home to sister club Racing Louisville FC of the National Women's Soccer League.

Both LouCity and Racing maintain daily operations from the nearby Lynn Family Sports Vision & Training Center, located at Champions Park about two miles east of the stadium. The facility also houses the LouCity & Racing Academy and the LouCity & Racing Foundation, the organization's charitable arm.

DANNY CRUZ **HEAD COACH**

Cruz is entering his fifth season in charge of Louisville City FC in 2025, having most recently led the club to its first Players' Shield in 2024, awarded to the USL Championship team with the regular season's best record.

The all-time winningest and longest-tenured coach in LouCity history, Cruz led the team to three-consecutive USL Championship Eastern Conference Finals from 2021 to 2023. In 2022, his team advanced to the USL Championship Final where, at 32 years old, he became the youngest head coach to appear in the title game.

En route to the Players' Shield, Cruz's 2024 team finished 24-4-6, matching the league's single-season wins record while setting new team marks for wins, goals scored (86) and points earned (76). As a result of that success, Cruz was named the USL Championship Coach of the Year.

From Petersburg, Virginia, Cruz attended the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, before launching a nine-year professional career played mostly at the Major League Soccer level. Cruz retired from playing while with the USL Championship's Real Monarchs SLC in 2017 and in 2018 shifted to that club's coaching staff before joining LouCity's staff in 2018 as John Hackworth's top assistant.

Cruz and his wife, Brittany, live in Louisville with their son, Santiago, and daughter, Isabella.

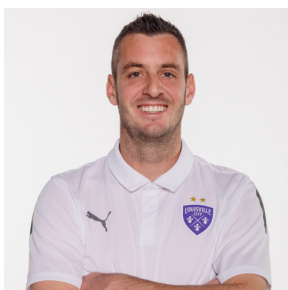


SIMON BIRD **FIRST ASSISTANT COACH**

Bird joined the Louisville City first team in 2021, after serving in the LouCity academy.

A native of Lincoln, England, Bird's relationship with Louisville goes back two decades. He was a star at the University of Louisville from 2001 to 2004, earning Conference USA Player of the Year in 2003. He followed his collegiate career with a six-year professional career in England before returning as a University of Louisville Assistant Coach from 2009 to 2012.

A fixture on the local soccer scene, Bird has worked as Oldham Soccer Club's Director of Coaching and Kentucky Fire Juniors Boys Director. Bird holds an A License from the U.S. Soccer Federation and is a Qualified Teacher for High School Physical Education and Sports Science.



PAOLO DELPICCOLO **ASSISTANT COACH**

DelPiccolo played eight seasons for LouCity, and served as the team's captain for seven of those years, including both of City's back-to-back USL Championship title runs in 2017 and 2018. LouCity lifted six trophies – four Eastern Conference titles and two league championships – during DelPiccolo's tenure. He ranks second in club history in minutes logged (15,397) and third in games (227). He played collegiately at the University of Louisville, helping the Cardinals to their first-ever NCAA College Cup trip in 2010.

DelPiccolo is also the LouCity Academy Director and holds a USSF C coaching license while working toward his B license.



SCOTT BUDNICK **GOALKEEPERS COACH**

Budnick was brought in by LouCity coach John Hackworth in August of 2018 as interim goalkeepers coach, helping lead the boys in purple to winning the club's second-straight USL Championship title.

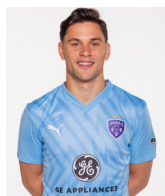
As a player between the posts, Budnick represented the U.S. at the U-18 and U-20 levels, participating in the U-20 CONCACAF qualification tournament in 1990. After a strong four-year career at the College of William and Mary, Budnick began his professional career in 1993 with the Richmond Kickers and then Hampton Roads Hurricanes in the USISL the following year.

Budnick spent time in the English and German lower divisions before joining Major League Soccer with the Tampa Bay Mutiny and Miami Fusion, eventually retiring with the New England Revolution in 2000.

Making the move to Louisville in 2009, Budnick managed the Louisville Lightning of the Professional Arena Soccer League, winning Coach of the Year honors in 2010. Budnick has also assisted the Trinity and Assumption high school programs and local select youth teams.

Budnick and his wife, Shannon, have two children: Koepler and Dillon.
