



2023 Season Notes:

- As in previous years, struggle with participation in mid season tournaments at all house league divisions. How do we address this?
- With the numerous rain outs this season, it was difficult to schedule/reschedule playoffs in a timely manner, leaving some divisions without a proper conclusion to their season.
- o Increasing HL roster numbers to 15 where possible did help a little with being able to play games. Rosters of 12 in previous years became problematic for attendance when players were unable to attend due to vacation/illness/other sport commitments, etc.
- ***** We had a number of complaints from our own families regarding playing time, positions, only having certain players pitch/catch/play certain positions. This is something we will continue to address, as it is the association's expectation that players LEARN and HAVE FUN, which means getting to try all of the positions and EQUAL sharing of playing time!
- ***** We also had a number of complaints from partnering associations regarding player and coach behaviour on the field, as well as some complaints about spectators/parents. Each complaint was investigated and addressed individually. Moving forward, we will have a policy in

Positive changes in 2023:

 - More discussion with the 12U coaches prior to implementation.
 - Maybe the I4U AA should have been placed in the I5U Coed/I3U AA league instead of the I3U
 - Because we took the I4UAA players away from the LOTO program we had some complaints that the I4U LOTO teams weren't strong enough.

Considerations for 2024:

- Continue with the Pitching in the 12U LOTO when it is PMB vs PMB games to help prepare the girls for 14U.
- Finding a proper placement for our aging out females.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Voting

- All Parents and Legal Guardians of a paid registered player(s) in good standing represents one
 voting member of Paradise Minor Baseball (PMB) to be used at the Annual General Meeting
 (AGM). A registered player(s) is someone who was officially registered with PMB in the year of
 the Annual General Meeting.
- The vote of a voting member must be exercised in person at the AGM. A voting Member is the Parent or Legal Guardian of the Registered Player. No proxy votes are permitted.
- The vote of an Executive Committee Member must be done in person at the AGM.
- Elections will be by secret ballot for positions in which more than one person is nominated.
 Positions for which only one person is nominated shall be filled by acclamation

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Positions

- A. President, Vice President, Past President, Secretary, Treasurer, Registrar, All-Star and Coaching Coordinator, Scheduler and Website Administrator, Junior Divisional Rep, Senior Divisional Rep, Female Divisional Rep.
- B. The position of Treasurer will be appointed by the Executive of Paradise Minor Baseball.
- C. A person may hold no more than two positions on the Executive simultaneously.
- D. To be eligible to be nominated as President or Vice President, a candidate must have served a minimum of one term in another capacity on the Executive of Paradise Minor Baseball.

VICE PRESIDENT

- The Vice President (VP) shall oversee and assist with the operation of the PMB and in the absence or disability of the President, shall perform all duties of the President.
- The VP oversees all activities with PMB summer student employment that includes such things as (but not limited to); determining required seasonal staffing levels; defining budget requirements for staff in conjunction with the PMB Treasurer; completing, submitting and administering both federal and provincial summer student employment grants through the various programs available; defining and documenting job descriptions and job ads; posting jobs ads; screening and interviewing candidates and hiring candidates; ensuring staff obtain code of conducts and vulnerability sector checks, have required first aid certifications and complete required safety training; oversee the scheduling of staff in conjunction with the student Baseball Coordinator; approve timesheets submissions in conjunction with the student Baseball Coordinator, and PMB Treasurer.
- The VP acts as a PMB signing authority officer for both administration and financial transitions; documents and administers requests for proposals and/or quotes, works as liaison with vendors/suppliers for jerseys, caps, equipment and supplies.

REGISTRAR

The Registrar will maintain and/or perform the following:

- Shall coordinate and oversee the annual player registration process and compile and maintain a
 record of all registered members of the PMB. The Treasurer will liaise with the Division Reps on all
 matters regarding payment of player registration.
- An electronic database of all registered player information and keep an updated email contact list of all registered players.
- Coordinate annual registration process.
- Collect all player registration forms and fees, verify payments and submit registration fees to the Treasurer.
- Provide all Divisional Reps and Executive with a list of registered players.
- Confirm all players placed on a team are officially registered.
- Manage and issue all requests for refunds, and update lists accordingly.

Scheduler and Website Administrator

- The Scheduler and Website Administrator shall develop a schedule for all House League play for the entire season and communicate such to the division coordinators.
- The Scheduler and Website Administrator shall develop a schedule for any play-offs and preseason for all House League divisions if required.
- The Scheduler and Website Administrator shall post all schedule information on the PMB website.
- The Scheduler and Website Administrator shall update all information on the association's website on a regular basis, including announcements for association Members.
- The Scheduler and Website Administrator shall post any cancellations to the schedule on the website.
- The Scheduler and Website Administrator will appoint a replacement from the Executive to post any information on the website during any absence.

JUNIOR DIVISIONAL REP

- Coordinate the PMB house league program and related activities for the 5U/7U Rally Cap and 9U divisions. This may include the development of team rosters, working with the Scheduler & Website Administrator to create schedules, the assignment of coaches to teams, and the provision of information to house league coaches.
- Collaborate with the Registrar and Treasurer during the registration process.
- Assign division coordinators each year to assist with running the house league program.
- Coordinate the 9U Select program in collaboration with other associations.
- Arrange any year end functions for their divisions.

SENIOR DIVISIONAL REP

- The Senior Divisional Rep shall coordinate the PMB house league program and related
 activities for the 11U, 13U, 15U & 18U divisions. This may include the development of team
 rosters, working with the Scheduler & Website Administrator to create schedules, the
 assignment of coaches to teams, and the provision of information to house league coaches.
- Collaborate with the Registrar and Treasurer during the registration process.
- Assign division coordinators each year to assist with running the house league program.
- Coordinate the Interlocking House League Programs in collaboration with the Scheduler and Website Administrator and any partnering associations.
- Help arrange any year-end functions for their divisions.

FEMALE DIVISIONAL REP

- The Female Divisional Rep shall coordinate the PMB female house league programs and related activities for the 12U, 14U and 16U divisions. This may include the development of team rosters, working with the Scheduler & Website Administrator to create schedules, the assignment of coaches to teams, and the provision of information to house league coaches.
- Collaborate with the Registrar and Treasurer during the registration process.
- Assign division coordinators each year to assist with running the house league program (if required).
- Help coordinate any interlocking programs in collaboration with the Scheduler and Website Administrator and other associations.
- Help arrange any year-end functions for their divisions.
