FUNIFORM AND GENERAL REQUIREMENTS


- Evaluation session times CANNOT be requested or changed
 - Jersey and Socks must be solid or previous season issue in CCHA colors (White, Gold, Purple, Black)
 - No Jerseys with Last Names or AAA or Camp names,
 - No Helmet Stickers, numbers, names etc.

VOLUNTEER CHECK REQUIRED

- \$500 Volunteer Check must be submitted prior to receiving a tryout pinny
- No Exceptions, your skater will not be allowed on the ice without a volunteer check!
- Please arrive early and have player dressed 15 minutes before scheduled ice time

WHO EVALUATES AND WHAT IS EVALUATED?

- 3rd party evaluators selected by Hockey Development Committee (HDC)
- A mix of skill drills and scrimmages are used to evaluate




MITE EVALUATIONS (CONT.)

Contact level commissioner with any questions

Evaluation Check In & Rules (Highlights Only)

- Arrive Early 45 minutes at first session, 30 minutes after that. Player ready 15 minutes prior to session start time for important pre-session instructions that are provided in locker room.
- Pick up Pinnie at check in; keep pinnie until end of last session. (Don't forget it, you won't be able to skate your sessions without it!)
- CCHA Colors (Jerseys & Socks) Remove Helmet Stickers
- Neck Guards & Mouth Guards Required
- Evaluations are Open to Parents to Observe at lower levels as long as this meets the rink's covid requirements. (Upper-level tryouts are closed)
- NO Parent is to Interact with Evaluators or Players on the Ice If you stay to observe, you must remain quiet.
- Any player can opt out of the evaluation process and be placed on an East Division team –
 Send e-mail request to your level commissioner
- Final Team Assignments Posted within 2-3 Days after Tryouts End
- Team Assignments are FINAL
- Questions on Placement / Concerns about Process / Etc. must be submitted in writing to commissioner.





MITES 3-4: 3 ICE TOUCHES PER WEEK

- Weeknight ice, sometimes at Velocity (Rotating Teams)
- 1 practice per weekend
- 1 (half ice) Game per weekend
 - Help needed with divider boards from parents in stands
 - Games vs Scrimmage vs Controlled Scrimmage
 - January March: Mites 3-4 will have a maximum of 2 full-ice games

MITES 1-2: 2-3 ICE TOUCHES PER WEEK

- Weeknight ice added outdoors weather permitting
- Saturday Practice Day
- Sundays Half-Ice in-house games
 - Help needed with divider boards from parents in stands

Communication flow expectations

CCHA CODE OF CONDUCT

Code of Conduct agreement required for every role:

- Player, Parent, Coach, Manager, etc. All Code of Conduct agreements are captured in the registration process
- Players, coaches, parents and spectators are to conduct themselves in a manner that "honors the Game" and demonstrates respect to other players, coaches, officials, parents and spectators.
- Playing hockey in the CCHA is a privilege, not a right. Violations by player, parent or coach result in a hearing with the Disciplinary Committee

"Your child's success or lack of success in sports does not indicate what kind of parent you are.

But having an athlete that is coachable, respectful, a great teammate, mentally tough, resilient and tries their best 15 a direct reflection of your parenting."

CCHA PLAYER SAFETY

Concussions: If coach <u>suspects</u> an athlete may have suffered a concussion, player MUST be removed from play.

Coach will complete a form and give you a copy.

Before any return to play, <u>you</u> MUST complete the return-to-play form, have it signed by a trained medical professional, and provide it to the coach.

There are NO EXCEPTIONS.


