The opening party this Saturday will kick us off this summer and it looks like the weather may cooperate too. We are looking forward to seeing everyone!

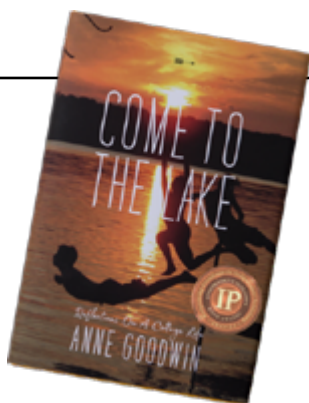

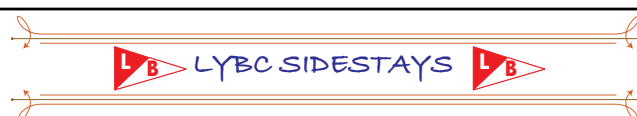

House & Grounds

Tennis Courts

Irrigation Works prepared the tennis court sprinkler system for another year. A broken pipe was replaced at the pump. Existing vegetation was cleared to allow room to access the pipe. Several defective sprinkler heads were replaced.

The tennis court sprinkling system is used to condition the clay court playing surface. This clay surface provides a cushioned playing surface to absorb shocks on your joints as well as providing a flexible surface accommodating differential settling of the base which rests upon a reclaimed wetland sub base.

The tractor that pulls the weighted roller which keeps the clay playing surface as well as the gravel base of the tennis courts compacted was re-energized for the summer. The battery was re-connected and the tractor started.

The Atkinsons donated a John Deere tractor trailer to the yacht club. This will help in moving lawn and patio furniture between the summer lawn position and the winter shed storage. Thanks Tom and Barb!

The clay playing surface was resurfaced with a fresh layer of clay on Saturday, May 21. The existing lines were removed and reinstalled once the playing surface had been rejuvenated. The nets will be installed for play beginning on Monday, May 23.

Fire Protection

Fleming Fire 1 performed the spring preventive maintenance on the exhaust hood fire protection. This involves an inspection of the fire retardant sprinkler head nozzles and an inspection of the chemical level in the tank feeding the sprinkler heads located on above the hood on the East side of the range/ ovens.

In the spring this inspection also examines exit lights and emergency lighting in the building to insure their operation. Fire extinguishers are also inspected for proper charged levels not only in the LBYC Building but the shed as well.

The building was inspected on May 18 by the Fire Department for the fire prevention, fire equipment and fire / exit safety. This is a requirement of the liquor license. It is the goal of the fire preventative maintenance to maintain the building in compliance with local codes and ordinances. The building passed the inspection.

Piers

The LBSS and Community T-Shaped piers have been re-stained for the summer. The signal boat pier is in the process of being painted. The sailing season is the official deadline of the pier refinishing season. Once the LBSS starts with the summer programs it is hard to find a gap in the schedule to paint a pier. The pier refinishing was a new work day item but the day was a wash out.

Work Day

Work week and work day are always milestones on either end of the LBYC year. This year the spring work day, House + Grounds Opening Party, was pushed earlier than the scheduled calendar work day to avoid a possible conflict with the Ice Breaker Regatta rescheduling to Beulah. Plans for this early regatta eventually fell thru but Work Day was held at its rescheduled Saturday of April 30. Spring work week started on Monday, April 25.

Although much of the day was considered a wash out on Saturday, twenty five (25) people participated throughout the week culminating on Saturday. We were honored to share in Steve DeRaleau reminiscing about childhood chores with his grandmother dusting cobwebs in every corner of the building and the entire Ward family was washing exterior windows, protected from the rain by the awnings.

It rained 1.18 inches that day.

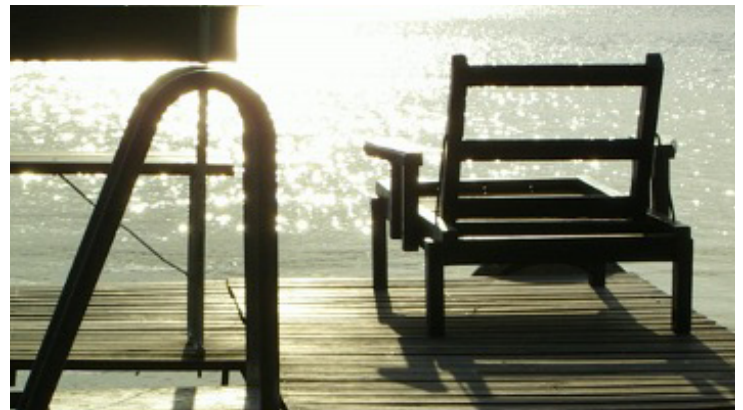
Twilight Tree Service

The scope of the work trimmed trees surrounding the tennis courts as well as along the channel with Dockside. A permit was needed for much of the major tree growth along the channel, but invasive buckthorn was removed. Trees along the north edge of the North parking lot were trimmed of dead growth. These trees were initially thought to be dying ash trees but the trees were bearing spring seeds.

A tree at the northeast corner of the South parking lot was trimmed of low lying branches. It was thought this tree was interfering with the growth of the newly planted maple tree.

Animal Dens by the Crane

Town of East Troy, Department of Public Works back-filled the holes in the gravel finish grade around the base of the crane. These holes were just outside the right of way. It appeared they were a habitat continuation of our muskrat neighbor. There is an entry hole in the grassy portion of the finish grade by the Community T-Shaped pier.
