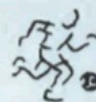

# Scholar Dollars

The Bogus Basin Ski Club Board of Directors voted to provide help to the Bogus Basin Mountain Recreation Area by matching contributions from our members for the Scholar Dollars program up to \$2,500. This is a great opportunity for the club and its members to share the passion we have for the sport by introducing it to a younger generation.

The Scholar Dollars program has been in effect for many years and it organizes school classes from grades 3 through 12 for a night of skiing or snow boarding. More than 12,000 students participate each season and 60% are new to the sport. That is over 7,000 beginners each year. Bogus Basin subsidizes the costs so that it is affordable and no youngster is turned away regardless of ability to pay. I can't think of a better program or way to introduce young people to the sport. The funds contributed by the ski club and its members will help fund this program.

Let's give Bogus Basin credit and support for this endeavor. It is one of the key reasons that the affordable \$199 season pass still exists at our mountain while other ski areas have abandoned it.

Bogus sells nearly 30,000 season passes and it takes lots of new skiers and riders to maintain that level of sales. Young skiers and riders introduce the sport to parents and siblings making it a family activity. Bogus Basin is dedicated to affordable winter recreation and this program attracts new skiers and riders leading to more season pass sales.

The club's goal is to get a contribution from at least 100 members of at least \$25. For a tax deductible contribution of \$25, \$50 or \$100, you can share the passion you have for the sport with a youngster and at the same time help keep the season passes affordable for everyone to enjoy. A \$50 contribution means \$100 goes to the Scholar Dollars program and four students get rental gear, a lesson, a lift ticket and transportation that otherwise would not. What a way to compound the effect of your donation! Your after tax cost will range from \$33 to \$43 depending on your tax bracket.

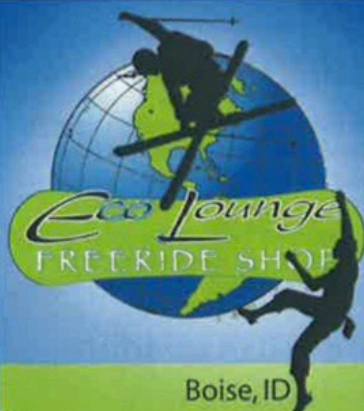

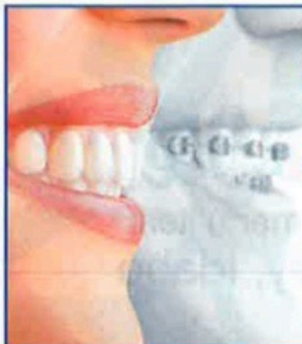
The Montana ski trip was a **big** success as far as I was concerned - lots of fun had by all!

# Mt. Bachelor Trip

Thirty members went on the trip to Mount Bachelor near Bend Oregon on Feb.19. The trip went smoothly and arrival was at 5:40 local time. The hotel was the Phoenix Inn in downtown Bend and easy walking distance of twenty or more restaurants, brew pubs and bars.

The club was welcomed by the mountain ambassadors the next morning and most of the members went on a tour of the mountain. After skiing a couple of runs we split into groups by ability and interest. One group hiked up to the double back diamond bowl off the summit express lift. Other groups skied all 3,000 vertical feet in one long run. The day was bright sunshine and from the summit you could see all the way to Mount Shasta in California. There are 2,500 volcano cones surrounding Mount Bachelor. The views were spectacular.


The resort reserved tables for the club and most of us met for lunch at 12:30 with the ambassadors. After lunch the

groups reshuffled a little and the ambassadors showed us other areas on the mountain. The day ended with a wine and cheese party at the hotel and a couple of ambassadors were able to socialize with us.

On the Northwest Express lift side there is lots of blue ice. We had never seen it before. In late December there was an ice storm that covered everything with between 9 and 24 inches of blue ice. After the ice storm, the winds were up to 80 miles an hour and it knocked down 600- 800 trees. We were advised not to ski in the trees by the ambassadors. There were a few places where the blue ice was still exposed on the runs and there was no way to set an edge in it.

The next day the weather was partly cloudy but the

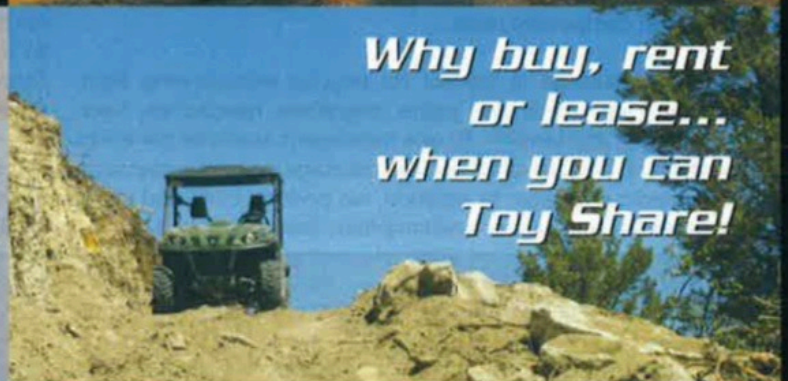

# Skier Fitness

March, the month of madness for skiers too. It can be cold and very warm on the same day. So how you dress is important, but even more important is what you drink. It is necessary to take in enough fluid to prevent dehydration. March is sometimes the most difficult month to stay properly hydrated because the more you sweat the more fluid you need. With the cold mornings and warm afternoons you may be perspiring a large quantity of water.

Even the mildest forms of dehydration can affect your performance and increase the risk of an injury or lead to muscle cramps. And more severe forms can cause acute mountain sickness or altitude sickness. It is estimated that a skier's sweat loss can reach four pounds per hour at 32 degrees. This is enough to cause a loss of coordination, fine motor skills, endurance and strength so it is important to get enough fluids while skiing. Fluid loss is not limited to sweating but cold dry mountain air leads to fluid loss through respiration too. Heavy breathing and exhaling moist air uses a lot of fluid.

Proper clothing can help prevent over heating and sweating too much. Buy ski clothing that has a ventilation system. Most coats have under arm zippers for ventilation and some ski pants have zippered vents. Look for these features the next time you buy ski clothes. Taking off a layer at lunch time is important if it is going to be a warm afternoon. Look for a good place to store it like a locker.

Most skiers drink before the morning session and again at the lunch break but that is not enough for most people and of course, that amount needed varies considerably depending on the size of the person and the way you ski.

Some authorities recommend you drink 16 to 20 ounces of water two to three hours before you begin skiing and another 8 ounces ten to twenty minutes prior to skiing. A fluid pack like CamelBak is the best way to carry water while you ski but you can also carry a collapsible water bag made by Platypus in your pocket holding 16 ounces. Try to drink 8 ounces every hour and then at lunch drink 20 ounces of a sports drink like Gatorade. Refill your water bottle and drink 8 ounces every hour in the afternoon. After skiing, drink another 16 to 20 ounces of water or a sport drink. This can be adjusted down if you are small or don't ski hard or for a long time.

If you are not carrying water while you ski take a mid morning and mid afternoon break for water. Avoid caffeine beverages during your break because they are diuretic and do not properly hydrate you.

The effects of alcohol on sports performance are well studied and without going into all of the details you should know that alcohol consumption compounds the negative effects of dehydration. Alcohol is a diuretic and it flushes fluid from your body and also causes an imbalance in the blood sugar, potassium and other minerals and vitamins in your system. Avoid alcohol use or limit it if you intend to ski the next day.

Proper hydration will keep you feeling good and skiing well and reduce the risk of an injury. Plan ahead to insure your body has enough fluid and is functioning at its best.

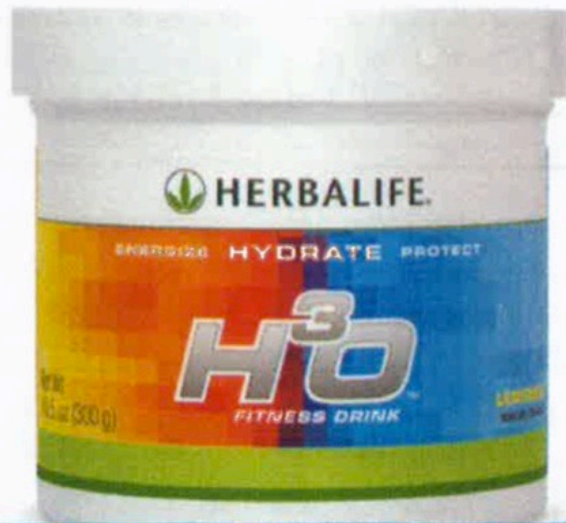
