9.1 11U - Grant Butler

BCBA 11U June 2018 Meeting Report

- 2018 11U summer Meeting held at Cloverdale, thank you Chris and Cloverdale
 - BCBA Directors: Grant Butler, Chair; Anne Hayes, 11U Scheduler; Stuart Drysdale, 11U A
 Director at Cloverdale
 - Well attended, Provincial Tournament procedures and expectations reviewed
- Since North Shore the request to play down from T1 into T2 was denied last month NS has asked for additional concessions that were found not to fit the existing model in the 11U division and may result in NS not being able to form any summer teams for 2018. There is a concern around the BOD table that the growth of NS may have created a situation where said growth has outstripped the ability of NS to foster and develop the required coaching at this level to confidently enter the BCBA 11U summer program.
- Salmon Arm requested a move down from T2 to AA but was asked to support and trust their existing program, which they have done.
- West Kelowna entered a late declaration at T2 which impacts the Interior zone but does bring the number of teams eligible for the provincials up to 3 at this time.
- Terry Chudyk, Interior BCBA director has been in discussion with Chris Balison in working out Interior zones and Mike Holyk, BCBA Island Director is working out the Island Zones.
- The number of teams in 11U summer declared this year is 70, up 6 from last year but oddly enough no AA teams from the Interior. 29% of Lower Mainland registered 11U players are playing summer ball, 26% of Island players and 8% of Interior players.
- Summer schedules for A and T2 are underway, the T1 and AA will be completed mid week and posted.
- Emails to all divisions will be going out this week including Provincial Tournament information and rule interpretations.
- It is yet to be determined whether or not tiering helps or hinders the fostering of youth baseball at the U11 level
- Taking into consideration the absence of 11U AA Summer Season teams in the Interior, is the messaging on LTAD vs. competition side being supported by our member associations
- Based on the observation of game play skills MSET may not be working as designed

Northern area (PG) has 1 team for the 2018 summer season. Summer season schedule is now posted to the BC Baseball website and is active. Summer season will commence June 23 and run to Aug 05 with a 16-game season.

Association Concerns

Questions regarding placement of teams for traveling along with zone placement for provincial. Questions
have been answered as to provincial attending per team. Some of our larger associations are not
submitting teams for the 2018 year, this brings into question of whether we are forgetting about the 15U A
programs at this level. More communication through the fall workshops and direct contact with these
association will be required to aid in supplying future teams.

Rule book

Modifications and proposed rule changes will be submitted for the 2019 season.

Bantam AA

• 80% of the single season has now been completed with many teams trying for that top position. All teams have shown great improvement for the season to this date, and some truly great baseball games have enjoyed by all. The final leg of the season will bring some exciting baseball to be watched as the teams vie for that final position.

Wild Card

- Mission has been selected to host the Wild card for 2018, preparations are underway July 20-22 2018
- Blank schedule was submitted allowing for umpire booking and field allotments.

Provincials

- West Provincial will be held in Burnaby (10 team) Aug 01-04 2018
- East Provincial will be held in Ladner (10 team) Aug 01-04 2018
- Championship game will be held in Richmond Aug 05 2018 (Winner to San Diego tournament)
- Blank schedule was submitted allowing for umpire booking and field allotments.

Rules to date for 2018:

- As per 2018 rule book
- Rules for 2019 will have to be modified along with some changes to make the process smoother.

Summary:

- The 2018 season will go down as a very successful division season with a great deal of anticipation already happening for next year from some associations.
- The 15U AA as it is now operating can easily take more teams for the 2019 season

Bantam AAA

- Tiered system not working in respect to competitive balance aspect(based on feedback from parents, players, coaches and association directors)
- Recommendation for 2019 10-12 teams will need to follow and application and qualification process similar to College Prep
- Import policy to involve evaluation process prior to approval consideration

- Merged association teams will not be permitted imports
- Coaching levels will need to reflect the changing player demographic being witnessed at the higher competition level of the AAA program
- More growing pains anticipated
- Three meetings set up for discussion and introduction of new AAA program. Interior Jul. 16th, Lower Mainland Jul. 17th, and Island Jul. 18th.
- Consultation with members and membership associations to define the vision we as a collective have for the AAA division to continue to put the path in place
- Strong coach retention is increasingly critical
