GENERAL TEAM INFORMATION

For the 2024 travel season HOV is expecting to have **THREE** (3) boy's travel teams. The respective teams are listed below. *The 14's team is contingent upon the proper number of athletes that are willing to play in that age group* USAV Age Criteria Below:

USAV age eligibility criteria: 18 & Under = player who was born on or after July 1st of 2005

USAV age eligibility criteria: 17 & Under = player who was born on or after July 1st of 2006

USAV age eligibility criteria: 16 & Under = player who was born on or after July 1st of 2007

USAV age eligibility criteria: 15 & Under = player who was born on or after July 1st of 2008

USAV age eligibility criteria: 14 & Under = player who was born on or after July 1st of 2009

USAV age eligibility criteria: 13 & Under = player who was born on or after July 1st of 2010

- Notes about age criteria:
 - O USAV age is, by definition, the age of the athlete on JULY 1ST OF 2024
 - Grade is not the primary determinant of USAV age eligibility. We include grade in this list simply as a point of reference.

 - This would include additional cost for athlete's looking to extend their season.
 - There will be a tryout held to solidify the extended season team!

Travel Cost

As we understand travel fees can be overwhelming and at some points challenging, we are providing this section of our information packet to guide families into the ease of travel volleyball. Whether this is your first, fifth, or final season with our HOV family, we hope that you are able to gauge the importance of the allocation of these fees.

- *The 14's team is contingent upon the proper number of athletes that are willing to play in that age group*
 - Club due are paid in installments after an initial Acceptance Deposit is made.
 - This fee DOES NOT include the memberships necessary to play. These will be discussed during the parent meeting.
 - <u>Practice Player:</u> Practice players are encouraged to attend all practices and team related events. Practice players will be asked to attend any tournaments when there is a specific need for position or numbers of players to successfully participate in the tournament.

Acceptance Deposit:

This deposit is \$150. The fee goes towards the club fees. This must be paid to the club at the time of accepting the position offered to the athlete. This should be within seven days of the offer that is extended.

USAV and AAU Memberships must be purchased outside of club dues. The instructions and direction to do so will be announced.

FAMILY-DIRECTED TRAVEL PLAN – <u>all teams of all ages.</u> FAMILY-DIRECTED Travel is when an athlete's transportation, meals, lodging, and supervision is arranged and paid for by their parent or designated guardian for the entirety of the trip. The HOV Family has adopted FAMILY-directed travel club-wide, and dues include the cost of coach travel to the teams' events. <u>Some events have Stay-to-Play requirements meaning the athletes will lodge with their parent, guardian, or teammate(s) at the expense of parents in hotel room blocks secured by HOV through the tournament's mandatory booking service.</u>

OTHER INFORMATION

- **FOOD:** Each athlete's parent or designated guardian will be responsible for the food needs of their athlete including snacks and a healthy meal while playing. If team dinners are arranged, each individual is responsible for their own expense.
- **TEAM ACTIVITIES:** These are the responsibility of the athlete and their family. These events seek to create team chemistry and create team memories.
- **TRANSPORTATION AND LODGING:** Transportation and lodging expenses are the responsibility of the athlete and their family. These are not included in the club dues.

Uniforms

HOV has a variety of partnerships that allow our athlete's top of the line gear for their volleyball experience.

Please note the following about uniforms:

- Uniforms are included in club fees.
- If the athlete is a returning player and still plan to utilize your uniform from the previous season, you will receive a \$150 credit towards your club fees.
- Boys should only wear WHITE socks as part of their uniform gear and BLACK Shorts.
- Kneepads, court shoes, and other volleyball associated clothing are recommend but not required.
- Our partnership with Dick's Sporting Good allows all of our families to benefit from their year-round coupons for sporting goods. Here is the <u>LINK</u> for these coupons.

Financial Support

As mentioned above, we understand the financial burdens that many families may have to walk through. While club fees can often be frightening or dissuasive for travel volleyball, we ALWAYS want athletes to have opportunities to participate. The list below offers many ways to cut down on the club fees.

- HOV partners with many organizations that offer grants and scholarship funds.
- Volunteer Opportunities at events held by HOV.
 - Each volunteer earns \$10-\$20 per hour for volunteering. This money is put towards club fees. Follow <u>Instagram</u> or <u>Facebook</u> for events!
- <u>Snap Raise</u> is an incredible opportunity that is used to opt into receiving money for an athlete's travel fees. This will be announced/decided by December/January.
- Fundraising through team-sponsored events
 - This is decided by the team. Coaches and HOV staff must approve of the fundraising endeavor prior to event.
- Financial Assistance Program (FAP)
 - Application and Needs-Based review process determines ways that HOV can assist families. This process looks over family income information, considerable factors, and requires approval by the Board of Directors. Check out the application process and to apply for FAP through our website:
