Teams are awarded three (3) points for each conference win in regulation, two (2) points for an overtime or shootout win, and one (1) point for an overtime or shootout loss. Overtime wins and losses appear in both the W and L columns, as well as the OTW and OTL columns in a team's conference record. Shootouts will only occur if a conference game remains tied after the lone overtime, which is played 3-on-3, with the shootout winner earning two points and the loser getting one point, the same as an overtime win and loss.

NCHC Numbers to Know

Denver junior goaltender Magnus Chrona has recorded three straight shutouts heading into this weekend's series at Miami. His shutout streak of 183:16 is sixth in NCHC history. He's the second NCHC goalie to record three consecutive whitewashes this season along with Minnesota Duluth junior Ryan Fanti and the sixth in conference history. Only North Dakota's Cam Johnson has logged four straight clean sheets (12/4/15-1/2/16) in NCHC history.

Denver leads the NCAA averaging 4.64 goals per game this season. The Pioneers have 102 goals (second nationally) in 22 4.64 season. The Fibriers have loss goods in 12 of those games. Denver has scored at least five goals in 12 of those contests. St. Cloud State is second nationally, scoring 4.30 gpg.

St. Cloud State senior defenseman Nick Perbix tied an NCHC single-game record with six points (1g/5a) in SCSU's win over Miami last Friday. He's only the second NCHC player to record six points in a game and the first defenseman to ever do so. Perbix, a member of the 2022 U.S. men's Olympic hockey team, is also the first skater to rack up six points in an NCHC conference game.

St. Cloud State leads the country with eight short-handed goals this season, after scoring three last weekend vs. Miami. No other team has more than six this year. The NCHC record for shorthanded goals in a season is 12 by North Dakota in 2014-15.

Nine current or former NCHC players are now set to take part in the 2022 Winter Olympics in Beijing China, after two more alumni were added to rosters this week. Former Omaha forward Fredrik Olofsson (2015-19) is on Team Sweden and former Western Michigan forward Frederik Tiffels (2014-17) is on Team Germany. Four current players and one alumnus are on Team USA, while alumni are also on Team Denmark and Team Slovakia.

Western Michigan grad student forward Ethen Frank is tied for the lead in men's NCAA hockey with 17 goals this season. His 0.81 goals-per-game (21 games) lead the country by himself.

SCSU leads the NCAA with 32 power-play goals this season, while Omaha is second with 30 and Denver is tied for third with 28. SCSU's 38.6% success rate (32/83) on the man advantage also leads the country, 10% better than any other team. The NCHC record for best power-play percentage in a season is only 30.3% set by Western Michigan last season.

warded to the NCHC regular season Achampion, the Julie and Spencer Penrose Memorial Cup (right) serves as the league's crowning achievement. The Cup is named after Julie and Spencer Penrose, who were tremendously successful in the business world and did much of it in Colorado Springs in the early 1900s. The couple made much of their money in the copper industry, which is why the trophy includes copper stars on it. The Penroses also set up the El Pomar Foundation, which still today helps pay for amateur sports and other non-profits, including the NCHC office located in the Copper Building next to the Penrose House on the grounds of the Penrose compound in



Colorado Springs. The El Pomar Foundation has also issued grants for the Penrose Cup, medallions for each individual champion and the NCHC's annual Post-Graduate Scholarship. North Dakota has now won back-toback Penrose Cups (2019-20 and 2020-21), winning it for the fourth time (2014-15, 2015-16). St. Cloud State has won the Penrose Cup three times (2013-14, 2017-18, 2018-19), while Denver is the only other team to win the Penrose Cup, claiming it in 2016-17.

NCHC Tournament/Frozen Faceoff

fter moving to a single-elimination Afformat in 2021 and altering the location, the 2022 NCHC Tournament will return to its normal format, consisting of four quarterfinal series on the first weekend following regular-season play (March 11-13, 2022). The four higher seeds will host the four lower seeds in a best two-out-ofthree format. Seed #1 will host Seed #8, Seed #2 will host Seed #7, Seed #3 will



host Seed #6, and Seed #4 will host Seed #5. The winners of the four quarterfinal series will advance to the NCHC Frozen Faceoff at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. for the two semifinal games on Friday, March 18. Semifinal games will be reseeded based on the final regular-season standings. The winners of the two semifinal games will then meet in the Championship Game (7:38 p.m. CT) on Saturday, March 19 for an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. The 2018 NCHC Frozen Faceoff was named Visit Saint Paul's Event of the Year for 2017-18. North Dakota won its first Frozen Faceoff last season on home ice, while Denver (2014 & 2018) and Minnesota Duluth have each won it twice (2017 & 2019).

- · Colorado College was swept by rival Denver last weekend, being blanked both nights by scores of 5-0 in Denver and 4-0 in Colorado Springs. It's the first time CC has been held scoreless in a weekend series with the Pioneers in the 330-game history of the programs. With the losses, Denver retained the Gold Pan for the third straight season.
- Colorado College is only 2-9-0 on Friday nights this season, but a much-improved 4-4-3 on Saturdays.
- The Tigers attempted a season-low 16 shots on Saturday vs. Denver. CC's 35 shots during the weekend against the Pioneers were its fewest in a two-game series since 34 at North Dakota on Jan.23-24, 2021.
- All but seven of Colorado College's 51 goals this year have been scored by freshmen or sophomores. Brian Hawkinson (4), Patrick Cozzi (1), Noah Prokop (1) and Hugo Blixt (1) are the only upperclassmen to score for the Tigers in '21-22.

- Denver swept in-state rival Colorado College last weekend by scores of 5-0 in Denver and 4-0 in Colorado Springs. The Pioneers became the first team in the 72-year history of the rivalry to sweep a weekend series with a pair of shutouts. With the wins, DU retained the Gold Pan for the third straight season. The Pioneers also improved to 11-0-1 at home this season, remaining unbeaten at Magness Arena.
- Denver leads the country scoring 4.64 goals per game and has scored at least four goals in 18 of its 22 games, including all 16 wins. DU has topped the seven-goal mark five times this season. The last time Denver had five games with seven or more goals in a season was in 2002-03 when the program also did it five times.
- Junior goaltender Magnus Chrona recorded both shutouts against CC and now has three straight shutouts heading into the series at Miami. It's the first time Denver has three straight whitewashes since Dec. 27, 2002 to Jan. 20, 2003. Chrona's shutout streak of 183:16 is the sixth-longest in NCHC history, while his four shutouts this season tie for fifth in the country.
- Senior captain Cole Guttman recorded three points versus CC, including his first multi-goal game of the season Saturday. His second marker Saturday was his 100th career point (45g/55a), making him the 101st player in program history to reach the century mark.

- Miami was swept at St. Cloud State last weekend, dropping an 11-1 decision on Friday and an 8-0 contest on Saturday. The RedHawks are now winless (0-6-1) in their last seven games. The shutout loss Saturday at SCSU was the first time the RedHawks had been held scoreless since the 2020-21 season opener (Dec. 2, 2020 vs. North Dakota), snapping a string of 47 games where Miami scored a goal.
- The last time Miami allowed at least eight goals in back-to-back games, RedHawks coach Chris Bergeron was a player. Michigan beat MU, 8-4 and 10-5 on Feb. 14-15, 1992 in Ann Arbor, Mich.
- Junior forward John Sladic's assist Friday night at St. Cloud State gives him an even 20 points for his career. Sladic has totaled 10 goals and 10 assists to date for the Red and White.
- After playing four straight games in Minnesota, the RedHawks return home to Steve Cady Arena this weekend to face Denver. After the most recent road trip ended Saturday, Miami now is not scheduled to play another game away from Oxford for the next 27 days.
