ABOUT THE WILDCATS

A Look Back ... Oct. 6, 1984

The 1984 season began with optimism for the Saint Ignatius football program. In his first season, Chuck Kyle '69 led the Wildcats to a 6-3-1 season, the first 6-win campaign since 1979.

Kyle had plenty of seniors to lead the way in his second season. In fact, several future Saint Ignatius Athletic Hall of Famers were seniors in 1984, including John Spellacy, Kevin Ginley, and Mike McLaughlin.

The Wildcats rolled into Week 6 with a perfect 5-0 mark. Lake Catholic confronted the Wildcats, entering as a top playoff contender. The Cougars left with a defeat.

From start to finish, the Wildcats dominated Lake Catholic in a 31-7 victory.

Kevin Ginley opened the scoring with a short TD run in the first quarter. From there, Pete Landino stole the spotlight.

The junior started the show with a short rushing score late in the second quarter. The fun continued at the start of the second half, as Landino took the kickoff 94 yards for six points.

Landino scored yet again early in the fourth quarter on a 52-yard run. John Spellacy set up the score with an interception. A Mark Pfaff fumble recovery then set the stage for a 28-yard McLaughlin field goal.

When the dust settled, Landino finished with 3 total TDs (2 rushing, 1 kickoff return), garnering him Offensive Player of the Week honors from the Plain Dealer.

Another storyline from the game - McLaughlin played for the Soccer Cats at 3 pm at Toledo St. John, and then made it in time for a 7:30 pm kickoff vs. the Cougars.

The Wildcats finished the year with an 8-2 record.

Wildcats Storylines ...

CARPE DIEM: With an upset loss last week, the Wildcats stand at 2-3 at the midpoint of the season. With a difficult schedule ahead, Coach Kyle has told his team, "Carpe Diem," or "Seize the Day." Playing an undefeated foe this week, the Wildcats have an opportunity to earn major computer points. This week is a critical week.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE: For the second straight week, the Wildcats will be playing at Byers Field. This week, the advantage is amplified. Rockledge will be flying in on Saturday, landing at 3 pm at Hopkins International Airport. Rockledge's quick travel schedule, plus a chilly fall forecast, could add to the home field advantage for the Wildcats.

GENERAL GRIFFIN: The Wildcats' field general at quarterback is Griffin Hanna. The senior signalcaller is the centerpiece of the Saint Ignatius offense. Griffin is only 10 yards away from surpassing 1,000 yards passing. Hanna has 11 total touchdowns – 8 passing and 3 rushing.

COOK & CMIEL CHOPPING AND CARRYING: True to the motto of the wideouts this year (Chop Wood, Carry Water), Henry Cook and Connor Cmiel are working hard. Of Hanna's 66 completions, Cook and Cmiel are responsible for 35, accounting for 572 yards. Cook and Cmiel will be important weapons for the Saint Ignatius passing attack on Saturday.

BALANCED ATTACK: The Wildcats will look to employ a balanced approach on Saturday against Rockledge. The name of the game is avoiding 3-and-outs to keep the defense fresh. The Wildcats will want to exploit a small Rockledge roster with many Raiders playing both ways. A successful run game will be vital to keeping the offense on the field. Jack Welcsh pounded Football North for 101 yards on 24 carries last week, marking the second 100-yard effort by a Cats' back this year.

THE BIG UGLIES: The Wildcats' linemen will be important on both sides of the ball on Saturday. Nick Schwitzgebel and Tony Georges have anchored the line as veteran tackles on offense. Ashton Montgomery, Gus Salopek, and Owen Keane have also been great on the O-Line. On defense, the Wildcats need to get after the quarterback vs. Rockledge.

THE LEGION: The Wildcats will look to make a few changes at linebacker this week. Hopefully, the Wildcats will have Michael McNamara back after he missed Week 5. Aidan Crummie will also get the starting nod at middle linebacker, though Aidan Conway will still play plenty. Connor Francz and Aidan Hubbard will remain starters at outside linebacker. Francz tallied 5 tackles and a forced fumble last week, while Hubbard tallied 3 tackles and recovered the same fumble.

SWITCH IN THE SECONDARY: For the last few weeks, the Wildcats have used a linebacker in the "hawk" position as a hybrid linebacker/safety. This week, the Wildcats will move back to the normal 3-3-5, with Jack Welcsh and Emmett Hanna starting at strong safety and Merick Hartley playing free safety.

CAPTAINS: The four captains for the 2019 season are #10 Griffin Hanna, #34 Jack Welcsh, #44 Michael McNamara, and #71 Nick Schwitzgebel.

ABOUT ROCKLEDGE

Learning about the Raiders ...

ABOUT ROCKLEDGE: Rockledge High School is a public high school in Rockledge, Florida, and a part of the Brevard Public Schools District. Rockledge competes in Class 5A of the Florida High School Athletic Association.

UNDEFEATED: Rockledge is garnering a reputation as one of the best teams in its area and all of Florida. Rockledge has been called one of the best teams in Brevard County, and was ranked No. 2 in the state in Class 5A by the Associated Press last week. Rockledge has a 5-0 record, winning all of its games by double digits.

LADARIUS' LEGION: The centerpiece of the Rockledge offense is running back Ladarius Tennison. The 5'9, 193-pound athlete has it all – speed, strength, catching ability. And did we mention he plays defense? The Auburn commit is ranked as the No. 4 athlete recruit in the country, and the No. 226 recruit overall. Tennison has been a regular in the end zone, including on August 30 in a 3 TD performance against Tallahassee Lincoln. Tennison will anchor Rockledge's offensive attack on Saturday.

ALLEN'S ARMY: Quarterback Elias Allen leads the Raiders' offense. The junior started last season, throwing 15 touchdowns in 2018. So far, he's thriving in his second year as a starter. In the past two weeks, Allen has started off the scoring with a passing touchdown. Against Atlantic, Allen also found paydirt on a 5-yard rushing touchdown late in the second quarter. Allen is a strong-armed quarterback with quick feet and an ability to scramble. The Wildcats will need to contain Allen's spread offense to win.

ADDITIONAL AMMO: Besides Tennison, QB Elias Allen will have plenty of weapons to rely on to generate offense. Mike Alves Jr. has played well at running back this season. Alves often spells Tennison with great results. The senior scored twice vs. Eau Gallie. Virgil Marshall also sees snaps at running back. Sophomore Rian Black is a good wideout- he caught in a 35-yard TD vs. Viera. Junior WR Raheim Sanders scored on a 77-yard screen in opener. Jaheim Mayes, Dequan Davis, and Shane Derouen will all see time, too.

THE BIG BOYS: Seniors Javon Wade and AJ Hall lead the way for the Raiders at defensive line. Both players have experience there. Jordan Love is another name to know – he can start at nose tackle and offensive line.

TWO-WAY STUDS: The Raiders have plenty of guys who can play both ways. Besides Tennison, Virgil Marshall will play on both sides of the ball. The sophomore can do dangerous things at DB or RB. Terrance Griffin is another dangerous player. The safety is a ball-hawk, boasting 7 interceptions in 2018. Griffin took a pick 51 yards to the house against Lincoln.

DEFENSIVE SCHEMES: The Raiders play a strong defense. Rockledge uses a 3-man front, breaking out disguised blitzes to confuse the QB. Rockledge plays a combination man and some zone. Watch out for the zone blitz on Saturday.



Cook is a major playmaker for the Wildcats on offense and his impact is felt on special teams, too.

LB AIDAN CRUMMIE '20



The senior linebacker will figure heavily into the mix this week in the middle of the defense. Crummie has 1.5 tackles and 0.5 tackles for loss so far this season while subbing in behind Aidan Conway. Crummie will likely get the starting nod this week, making him an important piece of the Saint Ignatius defense. Crummie will play a significant role in slowing Rockledge's Ladarius Tennison.

GAME PREVIEW

SECOND HALF OF THE SEASON STARTS AGAINST ROCKLEDGE

Carpe Diem.

Halfway through the 2019 season, the Saint Ignatius football team has arrived at a turning point. The Wildcats stand at 2-3. Two inopportune plays in the final seconds have dealt the Wildcats two heartbreaking losses. The men of Ohio City need a strong second half to guarantee a playoff spot.

So what is the Wildcats' legendary head coach, Chuck Kyle '69, telling his men?

Seize the day. Take advantage of this opportunity. On Saturday, the Wildcats face a 5-0 Rockledge team. With a win, the Wildcats would gain not only primary points, but plenty of much-needed Level 2 points from one of the top Class 5A teams in Florida.

As far as the Wildcats are concerned, the playoffs begin on Saturday at 8 pm at Byers Field.

SAINT IGNATIUS OFFENSE VS. ROCKLEDGE DEFENSE

Following a slow slog in the rain in the first half, the Wildcats' offense roared for 30 points in the second stanza last week. Griffin Hanna orchestrated key drives, spreading the ball to five wideouts.

The senior starter will need to do the same this week. Henry Cook led the way with 7 catches for 106 yards and 2 touchdowns, while Connor Cmiel was plenty involved with 4 catches for 71 yards. Another big contributor to watch out for is Jake Lang after his 6-catch game last Saturday.

Just as critical is the run game. Jack Welcsh pounded the opposing front seven into dust with 24 carries for 101 yards and 2 touchdowns. Welcsh will play a large part in the Wildcats' efforts to wear down Rockledge. With a small travel roster, a number of Raiders will be playing both ways. The one-two combo of Welcsh and James Crosby will be important to wearing down the defense.

The offensive line will also be key. The men of Adam Rini '99 and Paul Yappel have been excellent this year, bookended by senior tackles Nick Schwitzgebel and Tony Georges.

Rockledge utilizes a 3-man front on defense. An attacking defense, the Raiders love the blitz. Rockledge will call overload blitzes and zone blitzes, disguising them pre-snap. Rockledge's defense is hard to diagnose before the play for quarterbacks.

As far as coverages, Rockledge will mix in zone and man, attempting to be unpredictable.

Making it even more difficult are Rockledge's playmakers. Ladarius Tennison compares to Archbishop Hoban's Deamonte Trayanum, a playmaking safety who's dangerous at running back. Virgil Marshall and Terrance Griffin are both ballhawking defensive backs with speed to burn.

On the defensive line, Javon Wade and AJ Hall are

names to know. Both have the capability to play both ways.

SAINT IGNATIUS DEFENSE VS. ROCKLEDGE OFFENSE

The Wildcats struggled to contain Football North's passing attack last week, so Saint Ignatius will be adjusting its scheme.

Replacing the "Hawk," a linebacker/safety hybrid player, will be a regular safety. Jack Welcsh will slide into the spot, with others subbing in as necessary.

The Wildcats will hope to have linebacker Michael McNamara and defensive end Anthony Gerace back in the lineup this week. The two seniors are important in the pass rush and were sorely missed last week.

Aidan Crummie will likely see more time at middle linebacker this week, splitting time with Aidan Conway. Aidan Hubbard and Connor Francz will remain as playmaking outside 'backers.

Rockledge's offense is, in a word, dangerous.

The Raiders have put up big point totals all season. Ladarius Tennison is the havoc-wreaking running back doing much of the damage. The Auburn commit has scored a touchdown in nearly every game, including a 3 TD effort against Lincoln. At 5'9, 193 pounds, Tennison is a crazy-fast back with elusiveness and power.

Quarterback Elias Allen helms the offense. The junior is in his second year as a starter. Allen is a dual-threat quarterback with a live arm and quick feet. In the last two weeks, Allen has started the scoring with a passing touchdown. Allen also struck paydirt against Atlantic on a 5-yard rushing score. The Wildcats will need to contain Allen.

Rockledge has plenty of athletes at the skills spots on offense. Mike Alves Jr. is a great running back who spells Tennison with great success. Virgil Marshall can also carry the ball well. Rian Black is a solid sophomore wideout who caught in a 35-yard TD vs. Viera. Raheim Sanders, a junior wide receiver, found the end zone on a 77-yard screen in the season opener.

The Wildcats' secondary will need to be smart with its coverages to stop this high-flying offense.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Declan Mangan again unleashed his big boot last week, notching field goals of 48 and 47 yards. He'll again hold most of the kicking duties.

Rockledge also has a talented kicker. Jake Nobles hit a 45-yarder against Viera. His leg may come into play. The Wildcats will also gameplan for Tennison as a return man. He took a kick 98 yards to the house against Ware County.

FOOTBALL NORTH RECAP

IN A STUNNER, FOOTBALL NORTH UPSETS CATS ON HAIL MARY

At the end of a long game on a drizzly Saturday in Byers Field, Saint Ignatius Head Coach Chuck Kyle '69 paused for about 20 seconds before summing up the outcome.

"Well, I think we're stunned."

Indeed, Football North shocked the Wildcats.

On the last play of the game, the top high school program in Canada, hailing from Clarkson Secondary School in Mississauga (a suburb of Toronto), completed an incredible 49-yard Hail Mary pass to win a backand-forth affair, 41-40. An extra point with the clock at 0:00 sealed the Wildcats' fate, dropping the men of Ohio City to 2-3 and sending the men of the North into a frenzied celebration.

With the score at 34-34 with 6:24 left in the game, the Wildcats opted for a clock-burning approach. Griffin Hanna handed the ball off to Jack Welcsh on nine plays in a 13-play, 80-yard drive. Thanks to great blocking, Welcsh found paydirt to the left on a 17-yard run with 27 seconds left.

The game did not begin as a dramatic offensive show-down. The Wildcats and Football North struggled to find their footing in the early goings, as rain haunted downtown Parma.

The game started out on a positive note for the Wildcats, as Connor Cmiel intercepted Football North on the first drive of the contest. Starting at its own 41-yard line, the Saint Ignatius offense made it to the Clarkson 31-yard line before stalling out. Declan Mangan trotted in for a 48-yard field goal, and made it for a 3-0 lead.

The score remained 3-0 into the second quarter, as a time-consuming Football North drive stalled late in the first. After the Wildcats' opening drive of the period also stopped, Charlie Kinzel picked off a Vaughn pass. Unfortunately, the turnover went for naught.

On the sixth play of the Saint Ignatius drive, a Wildcats' pass was intercepted by Gianni Stewart. The defensive back ran it back 53 yards, setting up a Vaughn touchdown pass with 6:24 left in the half.

The Cats could not immediately respond, as a fourth-down pass fell incomplete at the Football North 40-yard line. The Wildcats' defense then got a stop.

Thanks to some nice passes from Griffin Hanna, the Wildcats moved down the field. Hanna finished off the nice drive with a 4-yard TD run, and Rory McConville kicked the extra point for a 10-7 lead with 1:24 left.

Vaughn and Football North did not want to go into the break with a deficit, however. Utilizing a two-minute drill offense, Vaughn navigated his team down the field and finished off the drive with a 12-yard touchdown pass with eight seconds remaining. The visitors headed into halftime with a 14-10 lead.

On the very first play of the second half, Hanna fired

a bullet to Connor Cmiel for a 33-yard completion. And just two plays later, Hanna found a streaking Henry Cook for a marvelous 40-yard TD. The Wildcats suddenly had the lead again, 17-14.

The Saint Ignatius defense followed that up with a big play of its own. Connor Francz forced a fumble, and Aidan Hubbard recovered it at the Wildcats' 48-yard line. Seven plays later, Declan Mangan put points on the board again with a true 47-yarder, advancing the lead to 20-14.

At this point, with momentum on the Wildcats' side, Football North could have started to crumble. But Larry Jusdanis' men only became more resilient.

On a crucial drive, Vaughn marched the visitors down the field in five quick plays. Omarion Martin capped it off with a 15-yard touchdown on a well-executed option play. Erik Daugenti blocked an extra point, keeping it tied at 20-20.

Football North forced a quick 3-and-out on the Wildcats' next drive, and took advantage of the opportunity to re-take the lead. Vaughn darted a 56-yard pass downfield to set up the visitors in striking distance, and finished the job with yet another TD strike, this time to Brayden Misseri with 2:54 left in the third.

Hanna fired back at Football North with a 5-play, 70-yard drive. Hanna found Jake Lang for a 34-yard strike down the right side of the field to put his men in position. Cook caught a slant pass from Hanna and stretched the ball into the end zone on a nice 20-yard pass. McConville's leg tied the score at 27-all with 1:07 left in the third.

Football North's ensuing drive stretched into the fourth quarter, but ultimately ended unsuccessfully. The two teams traded 3-and-outs before Henry Cook once again came up with a big play. Left space to work with on a punt, the senior dodged and ducked past a few Football North defenders to weave his way to the Clarkson 26 on a 43-yard return.

The Wildcats did not let the wonderful field position go to waste. A Hanna completion to Jack Dunstan, a Jack Welcsh run, and a Football North penalty set the stage for second and goal opportunity from the 3-yard line. Welcsh pounded it in from in close, and gave the Wildcats a 34-27 lead.

The advantage did not last long. Following a 46-yard kickoff return, Vaughn needed just four plays to pick up 50 yards and six points. The Old Dominion commit completed the drive with an 8-yard strike to Demontagnac. The score stood tied at 34-34.

Welcsh led the Wildcats down the field for a touchdown with 27 seconds left, but Football North still found a way to win in the closing seconds on the dramatic Hail Mary.

2019 marks the 92nd season that football has been played on this location; now known as Byers Field at Robert M. Boulton Stadium.

In 1921, the cities of Parma and Parma Heights opened the first high school for their residents on a site just outside the east bleachers. Seven years later, the apple orchard and grass field located behind the new school was converted into the athletic field with the gridiron laid out in a north-south alignment, just as it is today.

Recently, renovations have been completed on the facility.

In the last decade, a new lighting system was installed; bleacher improvements (including the installation of handrails) were completed along with renovations to the lockerrooms, restrooms and concession areas.

Other improvements include the installation of a video board at the north end of the stadium - it is one of the largest video boards in use at a high school facility the state.

The pressbox, which has been upgraded in the past five seasons with a new working media area and new windows, seats 30 journalists and broadcasters.

New field turf was installed for the 2012 season. In the last two seasons, the stadium has also had handicap seating added to both sets of grandstands, including 46 wheelchair and companion seats on the home side of the stadium.

The Parma City Schools invested nearly \$1.2 million into the facilty during the summer of 2014, including a new parking lot on the south end of the Stadium and the full replacement of the parking lot on the east side of the stadium, under the Press Box.

The Wildcats have played at least one game at Byers Field in 34 of the last 36 years (seasons without games - 1984 and 1991)


