TODAY'S GAME

Team USA closes out preliminary round play of the 2026 International Ice Hockey Federation Under-18 Men's World Championship as it'll take on Germany.

Team USA holds an all-time record of 9-0-0-2 (W-OTW-OTL-L) against Germany in this tournament. This will be the eighth meeting between the two in the preliminary round as Team USA won its last meeting, 5-3, on April 28, 2025.

All of Team USA's preliminary round games will take place at Vladimir Dzurilla Ice Arena in Bratislava, Slovakia, home to HK Ruzinov 99 Bratislava. The arena seats over 3,000 fans.

TALKING POINTS

U.S. VS SWEDEN

The U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team earned a 9-1 win over Sweden in preliminary round play of the 2026 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship at Vladimir Dzurilla Ice Arena. **Brady Knowling** (Chicago, Ill.) stopped 18 shots to secure the victory, while five players recorded multi-point performances as Team USA set an all-time record for most goals scored against Sweden in tournament history.

The U.S. took control early, jumping out to a 4-0 lead in the opening period. **Diego Gutierrez** (Flower Mound, Texas) opened the scoring at 4:46, followed by a goal from **Dayne Beuker** (Portland, Ore.) just over three minutes later. **Casey Mutryn** (Norwell, Mass.) added a power-play tally late in the frame, and **Sammy Nelson** (Maple Grove, Minn.) struck :42 seconds later to cap off the first period.

Logan Lutner (Maple Grove, Minn.) extended the lead to 5-0 early in the second before Sweden got on the board with a power-play goal. The U.S. answered late in the period as **Nick Bogas** (Royal Oak, Mich.) scored shorthanded to make it 6-1 heading into the third.

Team USA continued to roll in the final frame, getting goals from **Mikey Berchild** (Minnetonka, Minn.), **Carter Meyer** (Winchester, Mass.) and **Logan Stuart** (Manhattan Beach, Calif.) to seal the 9-1 victory.

GROUP B ON THE LINE

With a win in regulation, Team USA would secure the top spot in Group B with 10 points. Since the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship began in 1999, Team USA has won its group 15 times. Since 2016, the U.S. has won its group seven of nine times, and has secured the top spot in the last four tournaments. Of the 15, the U.S. has gone on to win gold eight times.

TALKING NUMBERS

Forward **Wyatt Cullen** (Moorhead, Minn.) is tied for the tournament lead with four assists to go along with his one goal. **Nick Bogas** (Royal Oak, Mich.) is one of four skaters so far to tally a shorthanded goal. **Sammy Nelson** (Maple Grove, Minn.) has the most faceoff wins with 41 and sits with a 74.55% success rate. Team USA ranks second in the tournament with just four goals allowed and are t-2nd in penalty killing with a 85.71% clip. Its four power play goals are the second most amongst any other country and is t-2nd in power-play efficiency (33.33%).

TOURNAMENT INFO

The 2026 International Ice Hockey Federation Under-18 Men's World Championship will take place April 22 - May 2, 2026, in Bratislava and Trenčín, Slovakia. The U.S. enters the tournament off a bronze-medal finish at the 2025 event in Texas. Team USA has earned 11 gold medals in tournament history, the most of any competing country.

Team USA will play its preliminary-round games in Bratislava at the Vladimir Dzurilla Ice Arena against Group B opponents Czechia, Denmark, Sweden and Switzerland. The quarterfinal round will be split between Bratislava and Trenčín, while both semifinals and medal-round games will take place in Trenčín.

Group A on the opposite side of the bracket consists of Canada, Finland, Latvia, Norway and Slovakia and will play its games at Pavol Demitra Ice Stadium in Trenčín.

WATCH ON NHL NETWORK

NHL Network will provide exclusive telecasts of all Team USA games at the 2026 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. The network will air all Team USA games live throughout the tournament, which began April 22 and runs through May 2 in Bratislava and Trenčín, Slovakia.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

THREE STRAIGHT

For the third-straight time, the U.S. has shutout Denmark with all three games coming in the preliminary round. In the two occasions previously, the U.S. has gone on to win a gold medal (2012, 2014). Jared Rutledge turned aside all 17 in 2012, while Edwin Minney made all eight saves in 2014.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY

Five players on the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team have family ties with the IIHF U18 MWC as **Casey Mutryn** (Norwell, Mass.), **Victor Plante**, (Hermantown, Minn.), **Sammy Nelson** (Maple Grove, Minn.) and **Abe Barnett** (Wilmette, Ill.) all had older brothers play in this tournament, while **Carter Meyer** (Winchester, Mass.) shares a bond with his father, Freddy Meyer, that hasn't been seen at the IIHF U18 Men's World Championship.

Freddy Meyer skated with the 1999 U.S. Men's National Team where he scored one goal and four assists in six games. The father-son duo became the first team in IIHF history to play for the same team at the U18 Men's World Championship. While it's been done once before, this marks the first time the father-son duo will play for the same nation (father, Vladimir Dravecky - 2003 SVK -- son, Vladimir Dravecky 2025 CZE).

IN THE PAST

Although the U.S. fell in its first preliminary round game to Czechia, there has been three instances where the U.S. lost its first game of the tournament and went on to win gold. It last happened in back-to-back years, in 2014 and 2015, and happened for the first time in 2010.

In all three instances, Team USA has gone on to win the rest of its games en route to a gold medal. The U.S. lost its first game to Russia, 3-1, in 2015, Switzerland, 4-2 in 2014 and Sweden, 4-2 in 2010.

Players such as Auston Matthews, Tage Thompson, Matthew Tkachuk, Troy Terry, Chalief McAvoy, Clayton Keller and Jake Oettinger were on the 2015, while Jack Eichel, Alex Tuch, Dylan Larkin, Noah Hanifin and Kyle Connor highlighted the 2014 team. Jack Campbell, Bryan Rust, Jason Zucker, Matt Nieto, Brandon Saad and Justin Faulk were some that made up the 2010 team.

WELCOME BACK TO SLOVAKIA

While Bratislava marks a new destination for many, several members of Team USA are returning to familiar ground in Slovakia. Four players and two staff members from the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team were part of the squad that won the championship at the 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup just eight months ago.

Defensemen **Nick Bogas** (Royal Oak, Mich.) and **Levi Harper** (Tampa, Fla.), goaltender **Brady Knowling** (Chicago, Ill.), and forward **Brooks Rogowski** (Brighton, Mich.) all competed in that tournament. On the staff side, current assistant coach **Kevin Porter** (Northville, Mich.) served as head coach, while **Rod Braceful** (Detroit, Mich.), now in the same role, was the team's general manager.

The 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup was held in Brno, Czechia, and Trenčín, Slovakia. Team USA played four of its games at Pavol Demitra Ice Stadium in Trenčín, which will host a pair of quarterfinal games, the semifinals and the medal games. It was there that the U.S. secured a 5-3 victory over Slovakia in the championship game.

Team USA finished the tournament with a 3-1-0-1 record (W-OTW-OTL-L), earning its first Hlinka Gretzky Cup title since 2003 following a gold-medal win over Sweden.

2017 IIHF U18 MWC

Slovakia will serve as the host country for the IIHF Under-18

Men's World Championship for the third time (2002, 2017) as Team USA has come away with a gold medal at the other two tournaments.

In 2002, Piestany and Trnava served as host sites where the U.S. finished with a 7-0-0-1-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) record and won its first-ever gold medal in IIHF U18 MWC history. Current head coach of the NHL's Minnesota Wild John Hynes was on staff as an assistant coach while notable players such as Ryan Suter, Zach Parise and U.S. National Under-17 Team head coach Greg Moore came out on top.

In 2017, Poprad and Spisska Nova Ves were the host cities in Slovakia as Team USA played to an unbeaten record at 6-1-0-0-0 en route to its tenth gold medal. Team USA beat Finland, 4-2, in the gold-medal game. Quinn Hughes, Brady Tkachuk and Josh Norris skated to a gold medal, while current head coach **Nick Fohr** (Grand Forks, N.D.) served as an assistant.

NTDP VS. NCAA

Twenty-three players on the 2026 U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team played for USA Hockey's National Team Development Program. Of those 23, 19 played for the Under-18 team which competed against 18 NCAA teams throughout the 2025-26 season.

Of the 18 teams, six made the 2026 NCAA Division I Men's Ice Hockey Tournament in Wisconsin, Michigan, Michigan State, North Dakota, Western Michigan and Cornell. Five of the six finished ranked 2-6 in USA Hockey's NCAA Division I Men's College Hockey Poll. Michigan, North Dakota and Wisconsin made up three of the four teams in the Frozen Four.

FROM PLAYERS TO COACHES

One coach from Team USA's coaching staff will be making their IIHF coaching debut, however, a duo of coaches have skated once before on this very stage. Although not making his IIHF debut, as he won bronze as an assistant coach for the 2025 U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team, **Ryan Hayes** (Syracuse, N.Y.) will be making his return to the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship for the fourth time in total, having represented Team USA as a player and assistant coach two times each. Hayes represented Team USA at both the 2006 and 2007 tournament, playing as an underager for the 2006 U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team. In 13 total games, Hayes tallied two goals and three assists, along with bringing home a gold in 2006 and a silver the following season. Hayes went on to play 13 seasons of professional hockey.

Making his IIHF coaching debut is **Kevin Porter** (Northville, Mich.) who, like Hayes, played at this tournament twice (2003, 2004), once as an underager and the other at the conclusion of his Under-18 season with the NTDP. Porter finished with a silver medal at the 2004 tournament and finished with the most assists (6) amongst all players, and finished with 12 games played, two goals and eight assists for 10 points.

THE PORTER/CULLEN CONNECTION

Assistant coach **Kevin Porter** (Northville, Mich.), who's making his IIHF coaching debut, played 13 years professionally, split between the AHL and NHL. Porter played 249 games in the NHL and was on the Pittsburgh Penguins when it won the Stanley Cup in 2016. Porter played on the same line as Matt Cullen, father of **Wyatt Cullen** (Moorhead, Minn.) who Porter coached at the NTDP and now the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. Cullen, who just finished his second season with the NTDP, finished this year with a point per game with 12 goals and 22 assists in 34 games.
