

Wrestling has been around longer than anybody knows for sure - probably since the first two men contested for leftovers! As a sport, it is mentioned as early as 3000 B.C. in Egypt and Babylonia and in the works of classical writers Homer and Virgil.

The first collegiate meet, however, did not take place until 1900 between Yale and Penn. Some 40 years later in Appleton, Milwaukee Washington edged out Green Bay West for the first Wisconsin state high school championship!

High school wrestling looks a little different today than it did in the "good old days", but there are still the same thrills and excitement. It's a beautiful sport to watch, requiring both mental and physical agility to be a winner.

In every wrestling meet, there are twelve weight classifications that team members enter for competition. To wrestle in a weight category, the athlete cannot weigh more than the following amounts: 103, 112, 119, 125, 130, 135, 140, 145, 152, 160, 171, 189, 275 and unlimited (minimum 175 pounds). To insure each wrestler qualifies to compete in the respective divisions, there is a weigh-in held before each meet. It is conducted 1/2 to 3 hours before the meet. If an athlete goes over his entered weight class, he forfeits the match.



The wrestling area is composed of cushioned mats and can be either circular or square in shape. It must have additional mat protection around the edges.

A match is 6 minutes long and divided into 3 equal periods. Each wrestler is given either a green or red ankle band so he may be identified during the match. The first period is started in a neutral position; the wrestlers face each other in a standing position on opposite sides of the starting circle. At the beginning of the second period one wrestler (determined by a flip) will have four options: to be on his feet, top position, bottom position or to defer his choice until the 3rd period.

At the referee's signal, each period is started and the wrestlers try to win in two ways: pin or decision. The quickest and most dramatic way is the fall or pin: a wrestler holds his opponent's shoulder to the mat continuously for 2 seconds. If neither wrestler scores a pin during the 3 periods, a decision is given to the wrestler with the most individual match points. (A tie results in 2 one-minute overtime periods; if still tied, criteria is used to determine the winner.)

There are several ways to earn match points worth one, two or three points:

TAKEDOWN - an opponent is brought to the mat and controlled from a neutral or standing position. Two points.

ESCAPE - a wrestler breaks away from the opponent's control into a neutral or standing position. One point.

REVERSAL - a wrestler reverses his opponent and gains control ... in one continuous maneuver. Two points.

NEAR FALL - a wrestler almost gets a pin; his opponent's shoulders are momentarily held with 4" or less of the mat; or one shoulder is touching the mat and the other is held at an angle of 45° or less to the mat. Two points. Or, if either situation occurs continuously for 5 seconds. Three points.

There are three common infractions that can cost a wrestler points:


STALLING - this is a matter of not trying for a takedown or escape or simply not wrestling aggressively. After a warning, continued stalling gives the opponent one point.

ILLEGAL HOLDS - there are several specific holds that are dangerous or punishing to a wrestler. These are known to all competitors and anyone using them loses one point to his opponent.

TECH NICAL VIOLATIONS - there are a number of situations or actions that can cost a wrestler one point: delaying a match; intentionally going off the mat; clasping hands around opponent's body or legs while in a position of control.




Wrestling is an individual sport but it has been a real team effort that has made it an outstanding program in Fond du Lac.

It will be another exciting season.




Jim Steinberg, Director of Physical Education and Athlete

He was a 1968 Olympic Regional Champion and a finalist at the 1968 Olympic Trials at Ames, Iowa. He has won several Wisconsin State AAU Freestyle and Greco Roman Championships.

At Whitewater Ed won the NCAA Division III National Championship with a 35-0 record.


Mr. Brady has taught the past two years at St. Mary's Springs and coached freshman football and head wrestling coach.

This is Ed's second year as Assistant Coach.



Bob Bubb Retires

EWL champs, 10 PSAC team titles and one EWL team championship.

The Golden Eagles, under Bubb, have placed in the top 20 in team scoring at Division I nationals 11 times since 1972. Bubb's top dual meet season came in 1986 when the Eagles went 17-0-1 and ended the season ranked third in the nation behind Iowa and Iowa State. His top team finish was fourth in 1973.

A native of Lock Haven, PA, Bubb was top wrestler on Pittsburgh's 1959 team where he was a three-year letterman and fourth in the NCAA in '59.

Bubb's early teams were successful, but it was 1972 when Clarion exploded on the national scene. That year Bubb saw Garry Barton win Clarion's first NCAA Div. I title at 134 pounds. Moments later Wade Schalles won his first title at 150 pounds. The following year Clarion amazed three national champions in Schalles (158); Don Rohn (134) and Bill Simpson (167).



"Those two seasons were the ones that really put us on the map," recalled Bubb. "We had exciting wrestlers and our fans would drive for miles to see people like Schalles, Barton, Rohn and Simpson wrestle."

Charlie Heller (1982), Jim Beichner (1985), Ken Haselrig (1987) and Mike Cole (1989) are just a few of the outstanding Clarion wrestlers produced by Bubb and top assistant Jack Davis.

Bubb gives his thanks to all the wrestlers that came through Clarion. "Everyone points to the national champs and All-Americans," said Bubb. "But the staple of our program has been built around the scrappy, hard-nosed wrestler who has a heart as big as a lion and a strong work ethic. To me, that's what Clarion wrestling is all about. Some of our guys may not have had the winningest records, but they had just as much to do with our tradition as anyone."

Minnesota Christmas Tourney

BLAINE, MINNESOTA - For the first time in a few years, the weather has not posed its own wrestling match on the teams travelling to the Minnesota Christmas Tournament, December 20-21.

Competing were some of the top teams across the country including Bismarck, ND; Clovis, CA; Uintah, UT and Century, ND.

Bismarck felt the pressure of being ranked number one having only found out days before the tournament.

After all the points were added up, Bismarck came up one point shy of winning the tournament, losing to arch rival Century, also located in Bismarck, ND.

Two weeks prior, Bismarck had beaten Century by over 50 points in the Mandan Lions Tourney in ND.

Some of the Bismarck wrestlers just didn't perform up to par. Finishing 2nd last year in the same tourney, Darin Giese lost in the third round to eventual champ, Andy Reigstad, from Willmar, MN.

Clovis, CA, scored extra points from champions Nick Quintana and Nick Zinkin to place third in the tournament. Uintah, UT, placed nine wrestlers to place fourth.

Augsburg Breaks Record

MINNEAPOLIS, MN-- Augsburg College scored two dual-meet wins on November 26 and set what is believed to be a small-college national record.

The Auggies, coached by Jeff Swenson, beat Wisconsin-Stout (45-0) and Minnesota-Duluth (25-14) to extend their consecutive winning streak in wrestling duals to 55.

Thus Augsburg broke a 13-year old record for all four-year Div. II, III or NAIA wrestling schools held by Olivet (Mich) College. Olivet won 54 straight and 101 of 102 duals from 1974-78 to surpass a record of 52 set by Westmar College from 1963-68. Wartburg (IA) made a run with a 52-match streak from 1975-79.

According to research done by the Augsburg Sports Information Office, headed by SID Gene McGivern, the 55 consecutive wrestling wins is believed to be the most since 1950. The only school in all divisions known to have a longer streak is Division I power Oklahoma State, which won 76 duals in a row from 1937-51 under coaches E.C. Gallagher and Art Griffith. The Cowboys also won 74 duals without a loss from 1959-66 under Myron Roderick, although two of those duals finished in tie scores.

Under 10-year head coach Swenson, Augsburg hasn't lost a dual meet since a 22-16 defeat to Wisconsin-River Falls, Jan. 22, 1988. Swenson's 10-year record is 122-15, for an .891 winning percentage. The only active coach nationally with a higher win percentage (minimum 4 years, 40 wins) is Iowa's Dan Gable, who started 1991-92 with a 268-16-4 record for a .938 percentage.

Even if Augsburg is able to extend its dual streak through January, it's expected to end when the Auggies travel to Ann Arbor, MI Feb. 8-9 for four duals in the Cliff Keen National Duals Tournament. The prestigious tourney features the best Div. I teams plus 1991 national team champs from Div. II, III and NAIA.

Bert Waterman Retires

NEW HAVEN, CT-- Former Yale coach Bert Waterman officially retired January 15. Yale dropped wrestling last year after being one of the oldest wrestling programs in the country.

Waterman spent 40 years coaching wrestling. He put in 16 years at Ypsilanti, Michigan before moving to Yale where he coached for 24 years. His overall record was 416-213-28.

Waterman coached 11 NCAA All-Americans and produced Jim Bennett, the 1975 NCAA champion at 142 pounds.
